GREAT MAN DEAD
The Pope is dead and the whole Catholic world mourns his loss. He was a man of outstanding ability and, as head of a great church, his attitude on the great questions of world-wide interest were given careful consideration.

Cardinal Giacomo Del La Chiesa, was elected Pope by the Sacred College on the 3rd September, 1914, in succession to Pius X., who had died on August 20. He had been created a cardinal a few months previously and was at the time of the election, Archbishop of Bologna, in Italy.

The late Pontiff was born at Padua, in the diocese of Genoa, November 23, 1854, and was ordained a priest December 21, 1878. He served as secretary of the nunciature in Spain from 1883 to 1887, in which year he was appointed secretary to the late Cardinal Rampolla. It had been 17 years since the last Pope Benedictine. On his election to the papacy, in 1909, Cardinal Prospero Lambertini assumed that title. It is an interesting fact that the late Pope was Archbishop of Bologna, while Pope Benedictine XVI was born in Bologna.

SOVIET RUSSIA PROPAGANDA ON RELIEF WORK

Reds Impute Politics to Relief Administration — Workers Act as Liaison Officers.

London, Jan. 21.—A bald statement by a responsible attaché of the Soviet Government headquarters here today to the effect that "we know the American Relief Administration personnel are acting as liaison officers in Russia between the Soviet and the United States Government" caused considerable surprise and brought a quick denial from the Relief Administration headquarters.

The statement was made to your correspondent during a conversation in respondent during a conversation in which an effort was being made to clear up some criticisms appearing in the American press to the effect that while the administration was doing much good work in feeding the people, nevertheless it was not keeping its hands entirely free from politics, or at least what might be interpreted as an attempt at economic penetration.

While the Russian officer was quite emphatic in his remarks to your correspondent, efforts to elucidate them were futile in that he declined to state specifically in what manner the personnel was acting as liaison representatives, just what they were doing or how they were doing it. The information he said, had come to him through a trusted member of the Soviet Government, who had just arrived from Moscow, but for some reason he failed to provide the all-important details to back up such a declaration.

BRITISH BOND ISSUE MAY PAY THE BONUSES

Republicans Consider Proceeds from Funding Foreign Debt as Basis of Compensation

Washington, Jan. 21.—Details of the Administration's plan for financing the payment of adjusted compensation to former service men, a proposal which has been coupled with the foreign loan refunding bill, will be worked out at a second conference of Republican Senators this morning.

Decision to follow the foreign debt bill in the Senate will, a "senior" house measure was reached at the Republican conference yesterday, the motion being carried by a large majority. But when it came to inflicting the special sales tax to meet the bonus payments until a substantial return on the proposed sale of \$4,000,000,000 worth of British bonds to American investors may become available.

Some favoring the sales tax proposal demand that such a provision be written into the bonus bill when it is reported to the Senate, and they further insist that it shall be specified in the foreign debt bill that whatever principal or interest may accrue from any liquidation of the \$11,000,000,000 foreign debt should be applied to meeting adjusted compensation.

It is apparent that the proposal to meet the bonus out of the funds derived from the foreign debt, either through collections of interest or from the underwriting of the British bond issue, will receive general endorsement in both houses. Fairfield H. Simmons (D), Secretary of the Finance Committee, is in favor of the bill authorizing the use of interest on the foreign debt for that purpose.

Senator Borah Opposed. The Republican members of the Finance Committee met again during the afternoon in an effort to iron out difficulties, and it is felt that considerable headway will be made at today's conference of the full Republican membership of the Senate.

Despite opposition that is springing against the measure of financing the bonus bill in the Senate immediately following action on the foreign debt, Sen. Borah (R.), Senator from Idaho, left the conference abruptly before the motion was made to bring up the bonus bill. His opposition to the bonus is well known.
