

The Police; What Are They Doing?

Editor World: Notwithstanding our large police force and the heavy expenditure in support thereof, it seems they are almost asseless so far as protection to property is soncerned. The most wanton and diabolital depredations are constantly being committed in vacant houses all over the city. Windows are smashed, leaden pipes cutwand titlen, linings of baths cut out and carried off, togther with grates, locks of doors and ther articles. It is positively disgraceful that such a state of things should exist in bour city.
