The division will be made according to the number of shots taken and bullseyes made, and the value of bullseye certificates will be posted at the close of shooting each day. Pool firing will be permitted only upon the targets specified for this purpose.

No competitor to be permitted to fire more than five shots consecutively, in Pool or Extra Series or both, while others are waiting to shoot, and Pool tickets are not to be used for sighting shots for Extra Series.

This meeting of the Association will be conducted under the direction of an Executive Committee of five members, to be named by the Council.

*Competitors must make themselves fully acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of the Match for which they may have entered, as in no case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.*

*They must refer to the Notice Board Morning and Afternoon, to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting affecting them in any way.*

### REGULATIONS.

**MEMBERSHIP.** All competitions, except the Goldstream, No. 6, and the Extra S and Pool (which are open to all comers) are restricted to Members of the British Columbia Rifle Association who have paid membership fee of \$2.00 for 1895.

**RIFLES.** The rifles used in these competitions shall be either Martini-Henry or Snider, except in the Goldstream Match, in which the use of the Lee-Metford or Martini-Metford is permitted.

Rifles must be of Government issue of Government pattern, with a minimum pull trigger of 6 lbs. No two competitors shall in any competition with the same rifle. Mini-Henry ammunition may be obtained on range, and none but Government issue may be used.

**POSITION.** Any with head to the target at all ranges, except 200 yards, where the position shall be either standing or kneeling, as specified for any particular match.

**DRESS.** Competitors entered as military must wear proper uniform; but belts need not be worn, and for other headwear hats may be substituted.

**ENTRIES.** Entries for the Nursery and for all individual matches included in the Grand Aggregate should be sent to the Treasurer of the Association, Captain Dormer, O. Box 26, Victoria, on or before Tuesday, 1st July. All entries made after that date for individual matches will be subject to an additional charge of 20 per cent. of the entry fee. The Treasurer will issue entry forms to intending competitors on application. Entries for Team Matches for the Aggregates, may be made either previous to the commencement of the meeting or on the range. Entries for the Aggregates must be made before one p.m. on the first day of the meeting. In team competitions, unless otherwise specified, names of members must be handed in before firing commences.

**EFFICIENCY.** Certificates of efficiency must be signed by their commanding officers, and must be produced by competitors entering as military men.

"Efficiency" shall mean, in the case of a commissioned officer, one in good standing in his corps; in the case of a N. C. O. or private, one who has attended and performed at least twelve (12) regular parades of his corps since the 1st January, 1895, or not less than fifty per cent. of drills ordered.

**SIGHTING SHOTS.** One sighting shot will be allowed at each range; tickets 10 cents each.

**CHALLENGES.** Any competitor challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents with the Range Officer, which shall be forfeited if after examination no shot is found in the target.

In cases not provided for as above, the R. A. Rules for 1894 shall be followed.

The Council reserve the right to make changes in the published Prize List or Regulations that may be considered advisable, due notice of any change will be posted on the notice board.

Tents and blankets will be provided on the range for the use of competitors.
