PREFACE

THE PUBLISHER OF THIS DIRECTORY FEELS THAT THE WORK, as far as the ideas underlying its inception go, needs no apology, but he wishes in introducing it to the public to ask for some allowance for any shortcomings, which may appear in this issue, as almost unavoidable in the first edition of a work of this nature. At the same time every care has been taken in its compilation, and it is put forth under the belief that it is a complete and accurate directory of this rapidly developing town. It will, the publisher believes, be found to be both of interest and value to business men and will give newcomers and outsiders a good idea of the present stage of progress attained by this place. The map, which accompanies it, is the only accurate plan of the whole town, which has so far been published. In the edition of this directory in 1898, it is the intention to present this map with several new features and the whole directory in a more accurate and elaborate, and as it certainly will have to be, a greatly enlarged shape. This edition contains 420 names of actual residents, mostly males, without including any of the Chinese population, which numbers close on 500.

REVELSTOKE

THIS RISING CENTRE OF THE TRADE OF NORTH KOOTENAY is a place of about 200 inhabitants and is maintaining a steady growth. It is now and will be increasingly so in the future A RAILWAY POINT of considerable importance in the C. P. R. system and a DISTRIBUTING CENTRE for the business of the rich mining districts included in the section popularly known as North Kootenay. Its importance in these connections is due to its unique geographical position. Seated in a beautiful open valley at the point of intersection of the Columbia river and the C. P. R. main line, it commands the passes running north and south, to the famous gold fields of the Big Bend and the rich mineral leads of the Lardeau, while on the east up the Illecillewaet another district of great promise is being rapidly opened up. The town is the point of junction of the mainline and the Arrowhead branch of the C. P. R., by which access is gained to the South Kootenay by rail and steamer. It is altogether likely that before long another line of steamers will make it their starting point for the Big Bend, for which country Revelstoke is at present the OUTFITTING POINT and basis of supplies. Thus by the mere force of geographical position alone Revelstoke has gradually forged to the front, until the little mining camp of a few years ago has become a town of considerable importance to the business of the province.

A PROGRESSIVE TOWN.

Within the last twelve months the population of Revelstoke has very largely increased and a large number of buildings have been erected, including a fine hotel built by the C. P. R., another large hotel built by Abrahamson Bros., a large brewery, several extensive warehouses, an office of the Imperial Bank, a Dominion government cold storage building, and a new government house for the provincial authorities. It possesses a complete telephone system and an excellent supply of pure water carried into the town from the mountain behind,

which is now being extended to every part of the town, and by next winter will have an electric light system in operation, for which a large power plant is being installed. There are four churches, Anglican, Methodist, Presbyterian and Roman Catholic with resident clergy, a fine public school with two teachers, a kindergarten and a private hospital. The town possesses fine stores of all kinds and its leading merchants do a large trade in a wholesale way with the various mining camps scattered through North Kootenay. A branch of the Imperial Bank recently opened has greatly extended the business facilities of the town. It is felt on all sides that the place has outgrown the swaddling clothes of provincial authority and a popular movement, which will soon take practical effect, is on foot for incorporation. There can be no doubt that the steady growth of the place in the past, which has taken place without any attempt at a boom, out of the real demands and necessities of the situation, and even in the face of actual difficulties foreshadows the rise of a business centre of great importance. Revelstoke is destined to become the Spokane of the north.
