THE TENTH SESSION of the BRITISH COLUMBIA ANNUAL CONFERENCE met in the Central Methodist Church, New Westminster, B.C., at 10 a.m., on Thursday, May 14th, 1896, the President of the Conference, Rev. S. CLEAVER, M.A., in the chair.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON STATISTICS.

As there are no returns from Simpson District it is not possible to bring in a complete report, but for the other districts it is found—

1. That nine churches and one parsonage have been built at a total cost of \$8,735.
2. That there is an increase in the Victoria District of sixty-six members, a decrease in the Westminster District of eighty-nine members, and an increase in the Kamloops District of thirty-five members, making a net increase of twelve members.
3. That there has been raised for connexional funds \$3,906.83, being a decrease of \$829.22.
4. That there has been raised for circuit purposes \$40,776.92, being a decrease of \$11,336.45.
5. That there has been raised for ministerial support \$17,509, being \$19 less than was raised last year.

We regret the absence of any reference to the spiritual state of the work in the reports presented to Conference.

There seems to be a lack of interest on some of our circuits and missions in matters essentially Methodist, caused, we believe, in part by failure to support and use our denominational literature.

We regret that such inadequate provision for ministerial support is made on so many fields, and we consider that the frequent changes of men to the extreme limits of Conference, and the equally frequent changing of married for single men, and *vice versa*, causing loss to both ministers and circuits, is not conducive to the best interests of the work.

Your Committee recommend :

1. That wherever practicable circuits and missions be amalgamated so as to conserve energy and funds to be utilized on new fields; and that ministers assist each other in special services and report results to the Conference.
2. That pastors organize and address our young people on the distinctive doctrines and economy of Methodism, and utilize the talent thus developed in conducting services where ministers are not available.
3. That auxiliaries of the W. M. S. and, in our Sabbath Schools, mission bands be established with the view of increasing missionary interest.

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4. That pastors organize and use the latent forces within their church membership in connection with their pastoral work.

5. That in making arrangements for Conference Sunday care be taken to leave the younger ministers free to attend the services held in the Conference church.

REPORT OF THE SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

From the district reports that are to hand we gladly note an increase on almost every line of Sabbath School work. We observe, however, that on many of the preaching appointments throughout the Conference no schools have been instituted, and urge that wherever practicable this be done.

We fear that too often the Sabbath School is made the foster-parent of the children, and thus the most precious element in the child's moral training is lacking. While it is the teacher's duty to instruct the children in the spiritual truths of Christianity, we cannot think that this in any sense releases the parent. Nor do we think that the Sabbath School takes the place of the church services, and we recommend that pastors and Sabbath School superintendents endeavor to have the children attend at least one service each Sabbath, and that pastors be requested to preach to the schools as often as may be arranged with the Sabbath School superintendents.

We also recommend presenting our pledge card for signature to all members of our schools. The returns show about thirty-five per cent. of those on the roll to be pledged abstainers, but we think this percentage could be much increased.

Once more we call attention to the fact that but few in our schools are learning the catechism. We regret this, and think it a great mistake, as too often our young people, chiefly from this lack, are unable to successfully meet in controversy those who oppose our doctrines and teaching.

We recommend that, so far as possible, regular teachers' meetings be held for the study of the lessons, and that not only the topography and history of the Bible lands be presented, but also the great spiritual truths taught by our Master.

We rejoice to find that our own Sabbath School literature is largely used, and strongly recommend that where other literature is taken our own publications be introduced as soon as practicable.

We notice with appreciation the fact that the Executive of the Epworth League Convention adopted our recommendation that representatives of our Sabbath Schools be elected to the annual conventions, and we assure our younger brothers and sisters of our fervent prayers for their success in the great work in which they are engaged.

4. We greet our General Secretary, Rev. A. C. Crews, most cordially, and congratulate him on his election to the honorable position which he occupies, and on the success that has attended his labors so far. We pray God that he may be so strengthened and filled with the Holy Spirit that he may lead the great army of young soldiers of the Cross to glorious victory.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

We call the attention of Conference to the fact that, although report succeeds report referring to Sabbath desecration, no definite action has yet been taken to strongly represent the mind of this Conference to the consideration of the public authorities. We recommend that this Conference again express itself very decisively in condemnation of everything fostering such a spirit of desecration in the minds of our people. In enumerating only a few of those things that we regard as violations of the law of the Sabbath, such as bicycling, hunting, fishing, ball-playing, and travelling in public conveyances on the Lord's Day, we ask our ministers to continue to discountenance any approach whatever to such violations, and to impress upon the minds of parents the responsibility resting upon them in the way of educating their children to observe the command to "keep holy the Sabbath day." The fact that large numbers, even in the churches, are indifferent in this matter should arouse us to maintain a firmer front against these evils.

Particular attention is drawn to the following :

1. The decoration of graves by secret societies on the Sabbath.
2. The advantage taken of the opportunity to send down produce by the Fraser River boats on Sunday.
3. The opening of fruit and cigar stores on this day.

We hope that our people will in every possible way discourage these objectionable practices.

We recommend that our Church join heartily with sister churches in any effort to bring such pressure to bear upon our Provincial Legislature and Municipal Councils as will constrain them to do what they can towards bringing about a better observance of the Christian Sabbath.

Whereas, liquor is dispensed within the precincts of the Parliament Buildings at Ottawa, which fact is a matter of national humiliation and shame, this Conference places on record its most emphatic condemnation of the sanction thus given by our legislators to the destructive indulgence and traffic in strong drink; and whereas, a general election is at hand, recommends that steps be taken in each constituency to interview candidates to ascertain their views on the question of Prohibition, and, whenever practicable, secure pledges in favor of such legislation, and also that they will endeavor to abolish the obnoxious practice of dispensing liquors on the premises of the Parliament Buildings.

2. We urge our ministers, office-bearers and members to favor the formation of Bands of Hope, under the fostering care of the Church, so that our children may be taught the danger of the use of alcoholic beverages, and saved, if possible, from ever tasting of the first cup.

3. Recognizing that "Union is strength," we cordially recommend the ministers, officials and members of our Church to co-operate with temperance organizations.

REPORT OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF COLUMBIAN METHODIST COLLEGE.

In submitting their fourth annual report of Columbian Methodist College, the Board of Directors desire to express their gratitude to Almighty God for the many blessings vouchsafed during the year, and for the measure of prosperity attending the work of the school.

The past year has been one of much anxiety, owing to the difficulties which always beset the beginning of institutions of this nature, struggling for a place and patronage, while yet without the prestige that comes with wealth, history and a large constituency of former students, who have gone out from their halls to occupy those positions of influence in the various walks of life which enable them to turn to their *Alma Mater* the patronage and support which are always necessary to success.

At a meeting of the Board of Managers held about the beginning of the year, it was found necessary to so arrange as to preclude the necessity for incurring further liabilities, and an agreement was entered into with the Principal by which he became responsible for the expense of carrying on the work within the College, receiving as remuneration in full the fees from students, the grant from the General Conference, and 80 per cent. of collections for the Educational Fund of the Conference.

Students enrolled, 32; in attendance, 25; boarders, 8; day students, 17.

The Board is glad to report the successful carrying out of the scheme for the purchase of the Edmunds premises in New Westminster, so far as securing the property is concerned. Of the subscriptions of \$5,000 pledged by the Conference of last year, \$2,244 still remains unpaid, all of which is either overdue or falling due immediately. A number of subscriptions of former years also remain unpaid. This coupled with other causes has made it extremely difficult for the Board to meet its obligations and carry on the work.

It is now proposed to consolidate the indebtedness, and to negotiate a loan on the security of the College property. It is believed that such a loan can be obtained upon most favorable terms. In the meantime, the Board feels the imperative necessity of realizing upon its subscriptions immediately.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

It is recommended that, if possible, about the same amount be raised on each circuit and mission for the College Board as is assessed upon them for the Superannuation Fund.

Also, that all collections be published in the Minutes in the schedule for connexional funds, and that delegations be appointed to hold Educational meetings at every appointment, to be followed by a systematic canvass in the interest of the College Fund, arrangements to be made at the Financial District Meeting. These recommendations are to be considered permanent.

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REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

The meetings of the Committee were attended by Rev. Dr. Sutherland, whose valuable suggestions were of great use in clearing away difficulties and expediting business. The district memorials were taken up in order.

We recommend that the memorial from the Victoria District re the appointment to the Japanese work of a missionary who has sufficient knowledge of the language and the character of the Japanese to enable him to give the necessary guidance and help to this work, be adopted, and forwarded with this recommendation to the General Board of Missions.

In reference to the Chinese work, we recommend that these missions be under the supervision of a white missionary conversant with the language and habits of the people.

Re the formation of a new mission to be called "Golden," though recommended by the Committee, it was not adopted by the Conference.

Also, another new mission at Trail was recommended, but it was ultimately decided that Trail should be worked for the present from Rossland.

The Committee recommended that another new mission be created at Rock Creek and Kettle River, but on motion the Conference resolved that the formation of this mission be left to the judgment of the Superintendent of Missions and the Chairman of the District.

We further recommend that the chairmen of districts or the Superintendent of Missions attend the August Quarterly Official Board meetings on missions, and urge upon the people the necessity of increasing their contributions in aid of mission work in the Province.

The annual report of the Coqualeetza Institute, which is of a satisfactory character, is herewith appended.

REPORT OF COQUALEETZA INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTE.

The past year has been one of prosperity in the history of the Institute. The number of pupils received was 19, and the number discharged 11, as against 55 received and 35 discharged during the previous year, showing a more satisfactory condition.

There are at present 40 girls and 53 boys on the roll, making a total of 93.

The health of both teachers and scholars has been generally good, no death and no case of severe illness having occurred during the year.

The regulations of the Indian Department now make it easier to retain our pupils. Many of the parents have signed an agreement to allow their children to remain in the Institute during the pleasure of the Department. The Indians generally manifest great confidence in the Institute, as is shown by their voluntarily placing their sons and daughters under our care from over twenty different reserves. The Institute was honored during the year by a visit from their Excellencies the Governor-General and the Countess of Aberdeen, who, with their children and suite, care-

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fully inspected the buildings and the work done by the pupils in the various departments, and expressed themselves as greatly delighted with what they had seen and heard. At New Year we were favored with the attendance of two Indian brass bands from adjacent reserves as a spontaneous expression of friendliness by Indians of another denomination. This was a very pleasing event. While deeply regretting the lack of stability in the religious character of many of the pupils, we note with gratitude the fidelity and consistency of the few whose faith seems to have become firmly established. Several of the senior boys and girls give promise of usefulness in the Lord's vineyard in due time. A high standard of morality has been very generally sustained during the year, and all the pupils are carefully instructed in religious truth and duty.

The Sunday evening services and Epworth League held in the Institute school-room have been means of considerable blessing. These are largely attended by the white people of the neighborhood. Not only the members of the staff, but all the children have contributed more or less to the Missionary Fund.

The grant from the Indian Department remains at \$2,210, or \$130 each for 17 pupils, the remainder of the expenditure estimated at \$7,238 being met by the two missionary societies of our Church.

Several pupils have during the year been "adopted" for purposes of maintenance by Epworth Leagues and Mission Bands in the eastern provinces.

REPORT OF BOYS' HOME, PORT SIMPSON.

The work of the Boys' Home has been carried on under some discouragement. Never in its existence has a greater need for industrial training been felt. Insufficient funds has prevented the development of the trades department. A building for mechanical instruction and an instructor are much needed to keep large boys in the Home. To the eleven boys reported last year five new ones have been added, of whom two remain with us still.

Progress in English branches is noticeable in all, and very marked in some.

Farming is impossible, but we have managed to get a plot of land under cultivation, producing vegetables adapted to the climate, which have been a great help to us.

Mrs. Richards has devoted some time to instruction in music with good results.

We are thankful to have had but little sickness during the year, which has altogether been one of great blessing.

Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund for the Year ending July 31st, 1895.

All the claimants on the Fund, concerning whose claims there is no question, have been paid in full.

The balance against the Fund at the beginning of the year, amounting to \$859.21, has been increased to \$7,221.62.

The income exceeds that of last year by \$3,964.00, but the increased amount paid to claimants alone is \$6,010.98.

The receipts from Districts are practically the same as those of the previous year.

The capital account has been enlarged to the extent of \$9,578.28.

Moved by Rev. C. M. Tate, seconded by Rev. A. E. Green, and

Resolved,—That whereas Bro. Amos Cushman, who was the first native convert to God in British Columbia, and who labored as a minister for a number of years in connection with our Church in this land, has died during the past year, therefore be it resolved that an obituary be placed in the Minutes of our Conference, and that the Revs. E. Robson and T. Crosby, with Bro. Jas. Cunningham, be a committee to prepare the same.

3. *Re* JAPAN MISSION AFFAIRS.

Moved by Rev. Joseph Hall, seconded by Bro. A. C. Wells, and

Carried,—That inasmuch as reports reflecting on the administration of Japan Mission affairs by the General Board of Missions, the Executive and the General Secretary have been circulated throughout the length and breadth of the Methodist Church through the medium of the press and other channels, the tendency of which has been to affect injuriously the income of our noble Missionary Society; therefore resolved, that in view of the complete vindication of the missionary authorities, as a result of the fullest investigation into all the facts of the case, the particulars of which have been placed within the reach of all contributors to the funds of the Missionary Society in the published report of said investigation this Conference urges upon the members and friends of our Church their righteousness and importance of standing loyally by this great common fund of our Church, and of using all diligence to increase as largely as possible the contributions to this Fund.

4. *Re* BOOK ROOM ACCOUNT.

On motion, the President of the Conference was associated with the Secretary, to make further investigation in regard to the balance of \$30.24 on Book Room account, still unaccounted for.

5. *Re* H. A. MASSEY, Esq.

(Memorial of College Board, adopted by the Conference.)

Moved by Rev. Joseph Hall, seconded by Rev. Prof. R. Whittington,

Whereas, H. A. Massey, Esq., having, in the providence of God, been called away since the last meeting of this Board from the scenes and cares of earth to the rewards and immortality of the skies;

Resolved,—That the Board of Directors of Columbian Methodist College desire to place on record their earnest appreciation of the life of supreme devotion to God which Mr. Massey lived, and of service to the Church of God at large, and especially to the Methodist Church, which he rendered

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by the lofty ideal of business success and integrity which he exemplified, and by the large-hearted beneficence which he displayed. By the noble gift which in the kindness of his heart, and in his warm sympathy with the cause of Christian education, he placed at the disposal of this Board to assist us in securing the eligible premises now occupied for the purposes of our College, his memory is endeared to us, and will be gratefully cherished in the coming years, when (as we fondly hope) this institution shall have survived the difficulties which have marked its earliest history, and when it shall have become a powerful factor in moulding the Methodism of our province. We would offer our sincere condolence to the bereaved widow and family of our departed friend, and pray that upon his sons may fall the sacred mantle of devotion to God and humanity, which, during his useful life, enfolded their translated father.

6. *Re* INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION.

Resolved,—That this Conference expresses its entire sympathy with the principle of national and international arbitration, and further expresses its fervent desire that the present negotiations looking to the establishment of a permanent court of arbitration between Great Britain and the United States be consummated in their legislatures, as one more great step in the onward march of Christian civilization.

Resolved,—That this Conference is in full sympathy with the proposal of the British Columbia Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society, that homes for Indian children be established at certain points in this province, and we commend the resolutions of the said Branch of the Society to the favorable consideration of the missionary boards of the two societies.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the Secretary of Conference engage only as many copies of the Minutes as may be ordered by the members of the Conference.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the appointing of the Programme Committee be left with the Conference Special Committee.

During its sessions, the Rev. Mr. McCrossan, of Manitoba Conference, and the Rev. Mr. Schoular, pastor of St. Andrew's Church, visited the Conference.

GENERAL CONFERENCE OFFICERS.

The Conference was favored with the presence of Rev. Dr. Sutherland, General Missionary Secretary; Rev. Dr. Griffin, General Treasurer of Superannuation Fund, and Rev. A. C. Crews, General Secretary of the Epworth League and Sunday School work; while, though not present at the sessions of the Conference, Dr. Carman, General Superintendent, and Rev. James Woodworth, Superintendent of Missions, who were detained at Port Simpson, where they had gone to attend to Conference work of an urgent nature, afterwards met the Conference Special Committee in company with Dr. Sutherland.

QUESTION DRAWER.

The Conference devoted an afternoon to questions relating to missions, conducted by Dr. Sutherland; an evening to the subject of the Superannuation Fund, conducted by Dr. Griffin; and an evening to Epworth League and Sabbath School work, conducted by Rev. A. C. Crews.

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DELEGATION.

A large delegation from the British Columbia Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society waited upon the Conference, and were cordially received, when Mrs. Chapman gave a very earnest and interesting address, after which, on motion of Revs. R. R. Maitland, LL.B., and S. Cleaver, M.A., the Conference expressed great pleasure in receiving a deputation from the Woman's Missionary Society.

ANNIVERSARIES.

TEMPERANCE.

A public Temperance meeting was held in the evening of Wednesday, May 13th, with Rev. J. F. Betts in the chair. The Rev. J. P. Hicks led in prayer, and the Rev. W. H. Barraclough, B.A., and Rev. Dr. Griffin in very able speeches addressed a large and appreciative audience.

Collection for Contingent Fund, \$7.00.

MISSIONARY.

The Conference Missionary meeting was held in the evening of Thursday, May 14th, the President of the Conference in the chair. The Rev. J. A. Wood led in prayer. After an excellent selection by the choir, the chairman gave a brief address, the Rev. C. M. Tate dwelt upon our responsibility to save all races of people, and the Rev. Dr. Sutherland gave an excellent address on the various phases of missionary enterprise and responsibility.

Collection, \$14.65.

SUPERANNUATION.

On the evening of Friday, May 15th, Rev. Dr. Griffin very successfully met all known objections to the Superannuation Fund, and conclusively proved the utility and necessity of the Fund to the Methodist Church.

THEOLOGICAL UNION.

On the afternoon of Saturday, May 16th, the annual Lecture was given by Rev. J. E. Gardiner. Subject, "The History of Chinese Mission Work in British Columbia."

Rev. J. E. Gardiner was elected President, Rev. J. P. Hicks, Secretary, and Rev. S. Cleaver, M.A., Lecturer for 1897.

PENTECOSTAL SERVICE.

At 8 p.m. (Saturday) Rev. E. Robson opened the Pentecostal Service, during which the subject of the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and His empowering for service was the theme presented in song, prayer, testimony and exhortation.

SUNDAY SERVICES.

Besides the early morning prayer service, the Conference Love-feast opened at 9.30 a.m., led by Rev. James Turner. At 11 a.m. Rev. Dr. Sutherland preached from John xiv. 16, 17. In the afternoon the Revs. W. H. Barraclough, B.A., and S. Cleaver, M.A., addressed the Sabbath School. At 7 p.m. Rev. Dr. Griffin preached from 1 Cor. ii. 7, after which the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered.

On motion, *Resolved*, That a copy of this memorial be sent to the General Board of Missions, and the memorial filed for use of the next Annual Conference with the recommendation of this committee.

RESOLUTION ON MEMORIAL *re* PLACE OF MEETING OF SIMPSON DISTRICT.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the part of the memorial referring to the District Meeting holding its sessions at place of meeting of Conference be endorsed.

RESOLUTION ON MEMORIAL *re* INSTITUTE AT UPPR SKREENA.

On motion, *Resolved*, That this memorial be forwarded to the General Board of Missions with the endorsement of this committee.

RESOLUTION ON MEMORIAL *re* EDUCATIONAL MATTERS.

On motion, *Resolved*, To refer this memorial to the General Board of Missions with the endorsement of this committee.

RESOLUTION ON MEMORIAL *re* QUARTERLY TICKETS.

On motion, *Resolved*, To send copy to Manitoba Conference and to the General Board of Missions; also, that it be submitted to the Annual Conference but without the endorsement of this committee.

RESOLUTION ON REPORT OF SIMPSON BOYS' HOME.

On motion, *Resolved*, To receive the report and forward to General Board of Missions, and that the substance of it be published in the Minutes of Conference.

RESOLUTION *re* BAND OF WORKERS' HALL.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the President and Secretary of Conference, the Revs. S. Cleaver, T. Crosby and C. M. Tate, and Messrs. Sheriff McMillan and Deputy Sheriff Siddell act with the General Conference officers, as a committee to wait upon Judge Bowell in reference to the Band of Workers' Hall at Port Simpson, and to take such other steps as the Committee may deem desirable to bring about a final settlement of this question.

A letter having been received from Bro. Ashton tendering his resignation from the Methodist ministry, it was, on motion, *Resolved*, That up to the extent of its authority, this committee accepts the resignation of Bro. J. J. Ashton, B.A.

INSTRUCTION TO SECRETARY OF CONFERENCE.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the Secretary of Conference be instructed to provide Bro. R. B. Beavis with a properly prepared ordination parchment.

RESOLUTION *re* "GLAD TIDINGS."

On motion, *Resolved*, That this committee recommend that the *Glad Tidings* be continued in the mission work under the direction of the chairman of the Simpson District, who shall so arrange her work as not to neglect his own work at Port Simpson, and that the General Secretary of Missions, the President of Conference and the Chairman of Simpson District be a committee to prepare a code of regulations for her government.

RESOLUTION ON REQUEST OF BRO. R. B. BEAVIS.

Bro. R. B. Beavis having sent in a written request to be left without a station this year, it was moved by Rev. T. Crosby, seconded by Rev. A. E. Green, and *Resolved*, That so far as this committee has power to act in the case, the request of Bro. R. B. Beavis, to be left without a station for one year, be granted.

RESOLUTION *re* PUBLISHING CHANGES IN STATIONS.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the Secretary of Conference be authorized to publish, in the Minutes of Conference, any changes in the stations that may be made and reported to him.

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THE PASTORAL ADDRESS

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BRITISH COLUMBIA CONFERENCE TO THE CHURCHES UNDER ITS CARE.

DEARLY BELOVED,—Appointed to “watch for your souls as they that must give account,” we greet you in the name of our common Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and address you in the consciousness of our equal privilege to possess the “fellowship of the Spirit,” “and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.”

For the continued interest manifested by you in the public religious services of the sanctuary in connection with which it has been our joy to labor, “ministering to you the Gospel of God”; for the faithful attendance of so large a proportion of you upon the class and fellowship meeting, the love-feast and other means of grace peculiar to us as Methodists, as well as upon the stated sacramental services in which we recognize our fellowship with the Church universal; for the cheerful co-operation of so many of you in Christian work, in the social means of grace, and in the Sabbath School; for your loyalty to the connexional principle, manifested in your cordial support of the Missionary, Educational and other interests of the Church, as well as for your self-sacrificing efforts put forth to sustain the work of your local churches; and, above all, for the measure of heart loyalty to God which you manifest, we rejoice and are profoundly thankful, recognizing in these things the outward expression of “the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ.”

When, in Conference assembled, we review our own life and work as pastors among you, we are made deeply sensible of the heavy responsibilities of our calling as “ministers of our God” and “ambassadors for Christ,” which might well make us ask with Paul, “Who is sufficient for these things?” and that not only as regards our heart loyalty to God and devotion to His service, but especially as concerns our faithfulness in pulpit and pastoral ministrations, lest, through any timidity, oversight or neglect of ours, any of you should “fail of the grace of God.”

We cannot escape from the conviction that God “hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation,” that He still designs “by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe,” and that the one purpose of our lives should be to save, not only ourselves, but them also that hear us. In this we tremble to think that we have not been so fully successful, nor so universally successful, as we might reasonably expect to be. Though in some instances and to some extent we possess the joy of the reaper

and are thankful for the ingathering of precious souls, rejoicing with the angels in heaven over even "one sinner that repenteth," still we would not be true men of God did we not "have great heaviness and continual sorrow in" our "heart for our brethren, our kinsmen according to the flesh," our people, to whom we are bound by many ties, and the children of our people, who lie very near our hearts, and to whom God has given a noble heritage of sound doctrine and traditional religious fervor, because they are not so clearly converted to God, so fully consecrated to His service and so filled with His Spirit as to be able to manifest the earnest piety for which our fathers in Methodism were noted, or to successfully prosecute the work of the world's evangelization which they, in the providence of God, began.

While with deep searchings of heart we humble ourselves before God, and pray that we may be able to receive the pentecostal "fulness of the Spirit," and that we may "be endued with power from on high" so that our preaching may be "in demonstration of the Spirit, and of power," we also approach you and, "in Christ's stead," we give you our message, which we trust you will be able to receive "as from God."

You who are members of our Quarterly Official Boards, are ye not to be to us as Aaron and Hur were to Moses? Are ye not successors of those chosen of the Pentecost as deacons in the Church? And are ye not appointed not only for the administration of the temporal affairs of the Church, but also to be workers together with us in furthering its spiritual interests? Compassed with infirmities that make our hands hang down and our hearts grow weary, we look to you for sympathy and the word of cheer. O brethren, do you not realize that your voice in the prayer-meeting, your testimony in class and fellowship meeting, your exhortation in the Sabbath evening after-service and in special services would often save us from depression, and make us feel as "giants refreshed with new wine"? Our need of your help and counsel is great, but greater still is the need of the Church in this age that ye should be men "full of faith and of the Holy Ghost."

You who are numbered as local preachers among us, are ye filling up the measure of your possible service to the Church? Where there is but seldom the need for you to fill our pulpits, are ye ready to assist in a mission service, or to open a cottage meeting, or to enter any suitable opening that may be given you to feed the flock over which the Holy Ghost has made you also to be overseers?

You who are officers and teachers in our Sabbath Schools, or leaders in our Epworth Leagues, do you realize the importance of the responsibilities entrusted to you? As ye sow, so must the Church of the future reap. Seek ye "the Wisdom that is from above," for to you parents are committing their children for the highest education, in your charge the Church is placing those on whom she will have to depend for her very existence, and Jesus himself is entrusting to your moulding influence those whom He will place as living stones in His temple, employ as stewards of His manifold grace, and accept as jewels in His own crown of rejoicing.

You who are enrolled as members of our Church in its various societies, are you strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might?

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Have ye "put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand" against the wiles of the devil"? or are ye "yet carnal"? Is there "among you envying and strife and divisions"? and do ye "walk as men"? Is it true of any of you that "when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again, which be the first principles of the oracles of God, and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat"?

Can it be possible that the faithfulness of your pastors in rebuking unholy passions, evil tempers and vicious lives is not appreciated by you, or that their preaching the necessity of holiness of heart, wrought by the indwelling Holy Spirit of God, is offensive to you? "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" "For this is the will of God, even your sanctification," and this we trust will always be the expressed will of those appointed to labor among you.

We anticipate many changes in our pastoral relations, which changes may be disappointing to some of us, as also to some of you, but let us all be united in the spirit of our Divine Lord and Master, who "pleased not himself," and let us in full consecration of soul endeavor to make this year happier and more successful than any in the past.

We commend again to your practical sympathy the various connexional interests of the Church, and appeal to you to be careful lest the financial depression of the present crisis should cause you to withhold more than is meet from the support of the work which you regard as the cause of Christ in the earth. Strenuously endeavor to increase your contributions to the funds of the Missionary Society, so that it may be possible for the work of our Church to be better sustained at home, and further extended in the regions beyond. Our own Columbian College is urgently needing all the aid in your power to give, and we entreat you to unite with us in our efforts to retain and strengthen this valuable adjunct to our work in this province.

Owing to causes which we cannot control, some of our circuits and missions are becoming weaker instead of stronger, and can be supplied with pastors only by requiring these to so live as to greatly impair their usefulness. We are reluctant to withdraw from any field of labor or to lessen the number of preaching services, but in this we need the loyal, cordial and efficient support of every member of the Church. The time has come in this province when Methodism to fulfil her mission must be generously sustained by her own children.

For keeping your minds informed and instructed and your hearts warm, we commend to you our church paper, the *Christian Guardian*, which ought, at its present cost, to be a weekly visitor in every Methodist home in the land.

In our Sabbath Schools we would encourage you to secure the graded Sabbath School papers and helps, published by our own Book Room, so that you may have guarantee that what your children read will be, not only interesting, but, in bias and doctrine, in harmony with your own convictions.

Be ye also ready to take part in every good work for the uprooting of long-established social evils, and the destruction of social vices, for the better observance of the Christian Sabbath, the prohibition of the liquor

traffic, and the preservation of our liberties. Encourage the spirit that tends to foster the closer fellowship of all the evangelical churches, and, while true to your own convictions, recognize the "unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

To promote your better acquaintance with our church work in your midst procure a copy of the Minutes of the Annual Conference, and in every other way in your power aim to be intelligent and well-informed members of the Methodist Church.

And now, trusting that you will receive these instructions and exhortations in the same spirit of earnest care for your welfare in which they are given, we "commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified."
