Ottawa, Feb. 7 .- (Special.)-The Government has received a full report of the recent meeting in London of shareholders of the Chignecto Marine Transport Railway. Evidently these gentlemen are not well pleased with the late Conservative Government. Mr. Provand, M.P. for Blackfriars, Glasgow, who has frequently visited Ottawa on the company's behalf, and was here last autumn, in the course of his remarks said he obtained in 1892 from the Government an Order-in-Council, promising that, if the company could satisfy them that they were in a position to go on with the work, a recommendation to pass the necessary legislation would be made to Parliament. Ever since then he had been engaged in a struggle to get the Canadian Government to carry out that promise. Towards the close of 1894 the Canadian Finance Minister (Mr. Foster) came to London. A deputation waited on him, and he promised that immediately on his return to Canada the matter would be settled, and added that the Government would not look on the question in a strictly legal sense but that they, would consider the moral and equitable grounds on which the company based their claims for reinstatement.



Again the bears tried to break wheat, but market held firm on reports of weaker changes that might injure the growing crop. Such crop reports would be a poor base for builtish hopes were it not a fact that nowhere in the world is there any. Wheat anxiously seeking a market. 
