

NOTED CROOK BREAKS JAIL
DEFYING THE LONDON POLICE

"Texas" Burdell, Burglar and
Companion of Steve Doyle,
Again at Liberty.

London, April 5.—(Special).—The
desperado, Harry Burdell, alias "Texas,"
the companion of Steve Doyle, the
burglar killed by the local police several
weeks ago, made a daring escape from
jail this morning. In spite of the frantic
search conducted by the authorities,
the burglar is still at liberty. As he
is known to have friends in this
section some fear it is expected that his
capture will not be effected except at
the cost of the life of some of the
officers. Burdell is a "bad" man, a "gun
fighter," like his "pal," who faced the
police with two revolvers and prepared
to do battle before he was shot.

The escape of the prisoner is another
of the many astonishing evidences of
the resourcefulness of the young crooks
who menace this section of Canada,
which have been exhibited lately to the
chagrin of the authorities. He was to
have been tried at the assizes now
opening for burglary and was supposed
to be having, together with Doyle, shot
and murdered the Hamilton policeman
who met death so mysteriously recently.
Therefore the incentive for the desperate
escape was strong as a long sentence
was inevitable.

His Second Attempt.
Once before, since his latest incarceration,
the noted burglar came within an
ace of making his escape. To-day he
renewed his efforts for freedom, and
thus far has been successful. On the
morning of the 2nd he succeeded in
escaping from the jail, but was recaptured
on the part of prisoners in the county
jail, the latest of "Texas" Burdell
is the boldest, and it but adds to the
reputation "Texas" now holds as one
of the most dangerous criminals known
to the Canadian police. The man ap-
pears to be utterly devoid of fear, and
holds his own as cheaply at all
times as he holds the lives of those
who oppose him in any of his designs—
and this is cheap indeed. At 3.30
Turnkey Poole took the prisoner his
breakfast, putting it in three
diagonal holes in the wall of the room
of the cell, where the prisoners exercise,
and Mr. Poole says he saw nothing
at all. At 4.15 he again took a look
at all the prisoners now and then,
and he, too, says he observed nothing
of the ordinary. And the very fact
that "Texas" chose the morning for his
attempt for freedom is a sign that he
is a brain, and uses it. He knew very
well that between 7 and 8 were the
best hours around the jail. During
the night everybody expects trouble,
and in the daytime, in the peaceful
hours of the morning, the people line
the streets on all sides, no person
looks for trouble. Thus "Texas" had
his plans well considered.

Out of Small Cell.
In the cell occupied by the burglar—
about 3 ft. x 6 ft.—there is a hole about
12 1/2 inches, close by heavy iron
bars, an inch square, which is used to
ventilate the cell.
By some means "Texas" pried these
bars out, the walls being 3 feet thick,
and in doing so, the oak frame and all
that was attached to it, was wrecked
and some of the splinters being 2 inches
thick and a foot long.
Then the burglar crawled thru this
hole, guessing that the way and dropped
to the floor below. "Texas" was
now in the corridor of the basement, in
which the cells are situated. Hastily
trying the doors which face the east
and west, he found all locked. He
escaped still cut off. Then he darted up
stairs, and, seeing a bar of iron
about a foot long, he attempted to pry
open the sheet iron door which would
have let him into a corridor on the first
floor leading out onto Dundas or King
out-street. He is a man of fine physique,
and inserting the bar in the
crack of the jamb he pried away with
main strength.
