THE ORPHANS' HOME.

THE THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING.

Rows of bright, happy faces set off with pinafores white as snow and neat brown-coloured dresses graced the large school-room of that most commendable charity the Orphans' Home yesterday afternoon. The occasion was the Thirty-fifth Annual Meeting. On the back benches sat some of the future doctors, lawyers, and legislators of this great Dominion. In front of them sat the audience composed largely of ladies. On the platform were his Worship Mayor Howland, Rev. P. M. McLeod, Rev. J. D. Cayley, and Rev. J. P. Lewis.

At a few minutes past four Rev. J. D. Cayley led in prayer, after which the Chairman read letters from Rev. Dr. Thomas, Professor Clarke and others, regretting their inability to be present.

ANNUAL REPORT.

Mr. W. B. McMurrich then read the Annual Report, the substance of which is contained in the following summary:—It shows that continued prosperity has attended the efforts put forth on behalf of the Home. Since June, 1885, 84 children have been admitted, 45 boys and 39 girls. Of these four have been apprenticed, four adopted, one died, and thirty-four have been removed by relatives, leaving in the Home at present 176. Through the kindness of Mr. W. Gooderham the managers have been enabled to furnish a nursery for little ones ranging from three to six years. The report then refers to the remarkable freedom of the Home from any serious illness. The only interruption to this general good health was an outbreak of whooping cough in August last, when nine of the little ones had to be removed to the infirmary. In December the infirmary was again closed. Most satisfactory reports have also been received from both boys and girls who have left the Home. This in itself is a source of gratification. Thanks are returned to the medicos and other officers, and the many kind friends of the Home for their kindness and attention during the past year. As in former years, the little ones have had many opportunities of enjoyment afforded them. As a whole the record of the past year shows, if anything, increased and wider beneficence, and in consequence responsibilities for the future very much greater. A very good evidence of the generous spirit which should animate friends and well-wishers of this charity, has been manifested by several of its friends during the past year, and the managers acknowledge with sincere gratitude the following bequests and donations:—From the estate of the late James.

Kiffin, \$500; the late George Williams, Owen Sound, \$450; the late R. Walker, \$100; the late John Bower, \$100; and from the estate of the late Mrs. Samuel Taylor, \$100; and donations of \$200 from Mr. H. Cawthra, and \$50 from Mr. E. Henderson, making a total of \$1,500.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Hunter who, when a boy, was an inmate of the Home, addressed a few remarks to those present. He referred to the kind manner in which he had been treated when in the Home, and now that he had left it he cherished the warmest feelings towards all connected therewith.

A hearty hand clapping on the part of the boys showed the approval with which they greeted the remarks of one who had once been one of themselves.

Votes of thanks were then tendered the officers and friends of the Home, and to the Mayor for presiding, after which there was another song by the children and prayer by Rev. Mr. Cayley. The singing of the National Anthem brought the meeting to a close.

35TH ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting their 35th Annual Report, the Lady Managers of the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society return thanks to God for the many gracious benefits the institution has received during the year. Though nothing of unusual interest has occurred in the Home since the last Annual Meeting, prosperity has still attended the efforts which have been put forth on its behalf. Since June, of 1885, 84 children have been admitted—45 boys and 39 girls. Of these 4 have been apprenticed, 4 adopted, 1 died, and 34 have been removed by relatives, leaving in the Home at present 176. In consequence of the increased anxiety and labor entailed by the large influx of children within the past year, the Board resolved in April last that an addition of \$100 (one hundred dollars) per annum be made to the Matron's salary. Owing to Mr. William Gooderham's thoughtful benevolence, he having donated \$500 (five hundred dollars) for the purpose, the Managers have been enabled to furnish a nursery for little ones, ranging from 3 to 6 years, for whom in our numerous city Charities no provision has hitherto been made. Already, though only furnished three months, most of the little cots are filled. In appreciation of Mr. Gooderham's generosity, the Ward has been named by the Managers "The Gooderham Ward." The Managers feel they have just cause for thankfulness in the freedom from any serious illness among the children. The only interruption to this general good health during the year was an outbreak of whooping cough in August last, when nine of the children had to be removed to the infirmary. Owing, however, to the care and attention bestowed upon them, as well as their complete isolation, the disease spread no further, and in December the Infirmary was again closed.

Most satisfactory accounts have been received from time to time of the boys and girls who have left the Home. This in itself is a source of gratification to the Managers, and a stimulus to continued effort on the children's behalf. As in previous years the Committee has much pleasure in testifying to the care and attention given by Miss Wheelright in her personal supervision of this institution; also to the judicious management of Miss Armstrong in the schoolroom, where the improvement of the pupils has been most noticeable.

The Managers gladly avail themselves of their annual privilege to express their thanks to Mr. Huson Murray, their solicitor, for the many services rendered by him to the Home ; to Drs. Macdonald and McConnell for their continued attention to those requiring medical aid, and to the kind friends who have each Sunday given their services in the religious instruction of the children.

As in former years, the little ones have had many opportunities of enjoyment afforded them, and thanks are due the proprietors of the several ferry boats for delightful trips to the Island and various parks surrounding the city. Nor would the Managers fail to mention a very kind offer from Mr. J. Ross Robertson of a visit to the Lakeside House for any of the children who were not in their usual health.

The Committee most cordially thank the victuallers, bakers, confectioners and all other friends who have remembered the orphans throughout the year. As a whole the record for the past twelve months shows, if anything, increased and wider beneficence, and in consequence responsibilities for the future very much greater, but the Managers earnestly hope that in taking these additional burdens upon themselves they will be strengthened by the active sympathy and warm, helpful liberality of the charitable public of Toronto. A very good evidence of the generous spirit which should animate friends and well-wishers of this charity has been manifested by several of its friends during the past year, and the Managers have to acknowledge with sincere gratitude the following bequests and donations: From the estate of the late James Kiffin, of York, merchant, \$500 ; from the estate of the late George Williams, of Owen Sound, \$450 ; late Robert Walker, merchant, Toronto, \$100 ; late John Bower, Bellessey, \$100 ; and from the estate of the late Mrs. Samuel Taylor, an ex-Manager of the Home, \$100 ; and donations of \$200 from Mr. Henry Cawthra, and \$50 from Mr. Elmes Henderson, making a total of \$1500.

In conclusion the Board of Management beg to call attention to the Treasurer's Report, containing a full and satisfactory account of the financial affairs of this institution.

PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN :

Having been requested, by the Lady Managers of the Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society, to prepare a Medical Report for the Annual Meeting I gladly comply with the request, especially as the report for the last year is an exceptionally gratifying one.

From June 1st, 1884, until December of the same year, not the slightest indisposition occurred at the Home, and then only were our services required to correct a deformity in one of the children.

Annie Gray was operated upon for cleft palate, by my able and obliging coadjutor, Dr. A. A. McDonald. The operation was a complete success, and our little patient made a complete recovery with the deformity removed.

In January (1885) an epidemic of whooping cough broke out. All the children attacked were isolated, and only four of the little sufferers required continuous treatment. This result was mainly due to the vigilance of the Matron, assisted by the nursing staff.

During February, slight attacks of influenza occurred, which readily yielded to domestic remedies and careful nursing.

April, May and June of that year passed without any illness worthy of mention. At the close of that year there were 150 children in the Home, all comfortable, contented and happy.

During the last year (1885-86) nothing worthy of note occurred from June to October. During this month Dr. McDonald kindly vaccinated all the children requiring this safeguard from small pox. At a later date, Mr. Frank P. Cowan, one of my students, completed the vaccinating, which I am happy to say was done with ability and success.

But one death occurred during these two years at the home. Little Agnes Thompson, after a lingering illness, died on the 15th of January, of consumption. A *post mortem* examination proved beyond a doubt that our little patient had been a martyr to this dread disease. She bore her affliction with Christian fortitude.

I was not called to the Home from January to April, and then only to find that all was well. From that time until now nothing worthy of note has come to my notice:

I offer my cordial thanks to the Lady Directresses, for their uniform kindness and great assistance in this good work. I commend the Officers of the Institution for their fidelity and intelligence.

There are now 180 children in the Home, whose happiness and welfare are as complete as any of its kind can produce.
