



He is very fond of music, and parti-cularly of the military kind; he has himself some talent in that science, assisted by a skilfnl professor named Stein, he has composed, for the regi-ments of the niners and pioneers under his command, the most beautiful military music in Europe. The French Theatre is greatly indebted to the Em-In e French I neatre is greatly indebted to the Em-veror Nicholas, and his spouse the Empress Alex-adrina. He has upheld it against the intrigues of some Russians, who would be exclusionists, and has frequently had Frenchmen to perform at the fetes given at the palace of Anitscoff. He has had for the last year a chevalier, who attends him in his exercise and amusements; this gentleman is Major Morder, formerly captain in the regiment of cadets. The young prince frequently walks out, dressed as a colonel of hussars, and salutes, with grace and politeness, such persons as meet him and pay that homage due to his high birth. He speaks Russian, French, English and German.




