"I have never in all my experience," replied the steamboat inspector, "seen what might be called a boiler explosion from lack of water."

"Could the cause have been too much water?" enquired the reporter.

Too much water would not have such an effect. It might break the boiler in some particular spot, and as far as pumping cold water into a hot boiler is concerned I have seen it run in when the boiler was red-hot, and no explosion occurred. The natural effect, howeve, of this would be to crack the boiler and to impair its worth.

can conceive with what force a boiler is torn from its fastenings when an explosion occurs. Is it not therefore of the most vital importance that the boiler be not only entirely free from flaws, but that it be subject to careful inspection so that any irregularity may be put in order? I have heard of other mills whose boilers are not safe, and which if not soon looked after will blow up as sure as those in the South Bay mill blew up a few days ago. I should not like to say that the mill owners were careless or negligent, but they do not seem to think of the matter; they do not consider the danger.

"You talk of engineers with certificates."

The properties of the cause of the explosion, a boiler which may have stood the regular test, but which in the testing, has been strained, and is now ready to go up without further warning. I say again that the authorities should without delay make inspection necessary, and appoint competent persons upon whom the responsibility should rest. It is almost fearful to think of boilers in operation day after day for years, without being looked after and tested in the proper and the only effectual manner.

Mr. Stevens gave the reporter some very interesting facts about the use and abuse of boilers, and something, too, about steamboat inspection. After 25 years experience Mr. Stevens must be admittedly an authority, and his words should have the desired influence in bringing about what seems necessary for the safety of life and property, inspection of mill and factory boilers.
