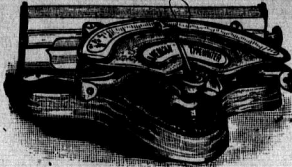

These registration fees are, of course, in addition to the postage, and must be prepaid by registration stamp.

N.B.—Registration Stamps cannot be accepted in payment of postage.

Parcel Post.—The following rates are for the transmission of Parcels in Canada:—

Not exceeding 1 lb.....	6 cts.	Not exceeding 1 lb.....	18 cts.
Not exceeding 1 lb.....	12 cts.	Not exceeding 1 lb.....	24 cts.

Each additional 4 oz., 6 cts.

Parcels for Canada must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. They may be registered for a fee of 5 cents.

Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 30 cents per lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length or 1 foot in width or depth. A Customs Declaration of the contents and value of each parcel addressed to the United Kingdom must be filled up at the Post Office by the sender. Parcels for the United Kingdom are forwarded by Canadian Steamers only.

Money Orders to Canada.—All Money Order Post Offices in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward's Island, Manitoba and British Columbia, are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many orders of \$100 each as the applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz:—

Orders up to \$4.....	2 cts.	Orders from \$40 to \$80.....	20 cts.
Orders up to 10.....	5 cts.	Orders from 80 to 90.....	40 cts.
Orders from \$10 to \$20.....	10 cts.	Orders from 90 to 100.....	50 cts.
Orders from 20 to 40.....	20 cts.		

Money Orders on the United Kingdom.—The Money Order Offices in the Dominion also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, the Channel Islands and British India—save those in British India for which there are special rates—for any sum to \$10 sterling, and grant as many orders for \$10 each as may be required to make up the amount remitted.

# Key Diagram of Senate Chamber.

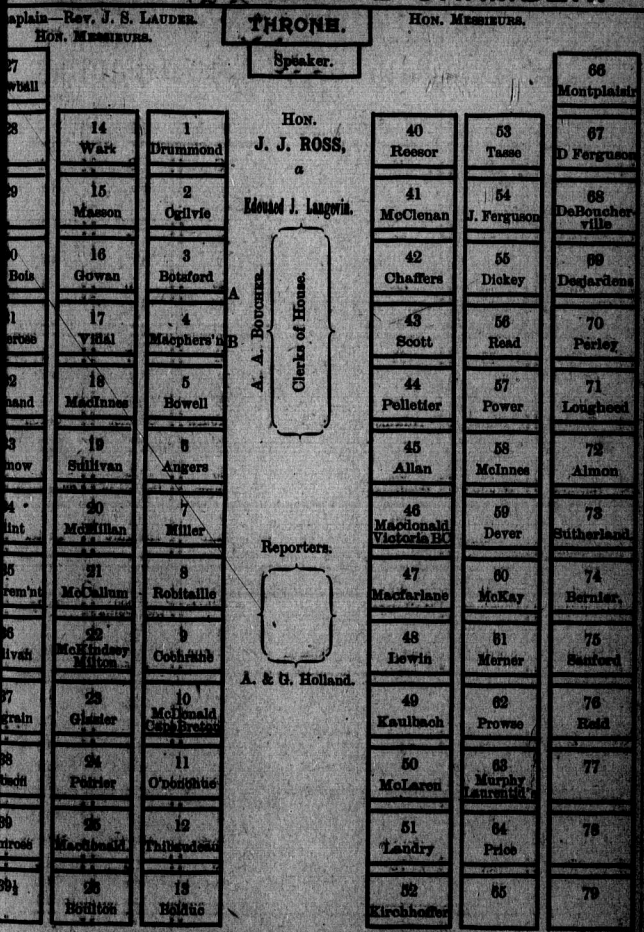

## ✻ RULES ✻

### RESPECTING THE LIBRARY OF PARLIAMENT.

---

A PROPER Catalogue of the books belonging to the Library shall be kept by the Librarian, in whom the custody and responsibility thereof shall be vested; and who shall be required to report to the House, through Mr. Speaker, at the opening of each Session, the actual state of the Library.

No person shall be entitled to resort to the Library during the Session of Parliament, except the Governor-General, the Members of the Privy Council and of the Senate and House of Commons, and the Officers of both Houses, and such other persons as may receive a written order of admission from the Speaker of either House. Members may personally introduce strangers to the Library during the day time, but not after the hours of seven o'clock p.m.

During a Session of Parliament, no books belonging to the Library shall be taken out of the building, except by the authority of the Speaker or upon a receipt given by a Member of either House.

During a recess of Parliament, the Library and Reading Room shall be open every day of each week (Sundays and holidays excepted), from the hour of ten in the morning until three in the afternoon; and access to the Library shall be permitted to persons introduced by a Member of the Legislature, or admitted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Library; subject to such regulations as may be deemed necessary for the security and preservation of the collection; but no one shall be allowed to take any book out of the Library except Members of the Legislature, and such others as may be authorized by the Speaker of either House.

During the recess of Parliament, no Member of either House not residing at the seat of Government, shall be at liberty to borrow or have in his possession at any one time more than three works from the Library, and to retain the same longer than three weeks, and all such persons shall return the books so taken when required by the Librarian.

No books of reference, or books of special cost or value, may be removed from the seat of Government under any circumstances.

At the first meeting of the Joint Library Committee at every Session of Parliament, the Librarian shall report a list of books absent at the commencement of the Session, specifying the names of any persons who have retained the same in contravention of either of the foregoing rules.

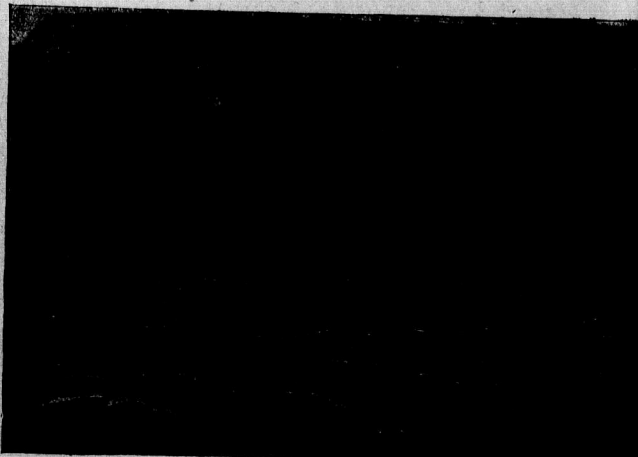
