

The Calgary people charged profiteering in prices, that Canadian consumers were discriminated against while American buyers were asvored. It was claimed also that as a result business was beld up on the prairie, and that industrial unrest was following.

When apprised of the charges, secretary R.H.R.Alexander, of the B.C. Lumber Manufacturers' Association, said that this had been the first complaint the coast men had ever received from Canadan builders on prices charged, and that he feared no investigation. "As a matter of fact," he said, "we have been doing wery little business with American buyers but they are paying higher prices than the prairies. There is no discrimination. We are simply carrying on business as usual supplying all markets that we are able to. There is not the building going on this year that we had hoped for, and as a matter of fact prices are not as high as this time last year. It is the same in the lumber industry as any other line of business; when the cost of operation increases then the prices of the commodity must be increased accordingly."






