I think it not too much to say that the day may be looked forward to when it will be no longer possible for the Church of England to maintain its ground as a Church of compromise, a comfortable halting-place between what they designate as "superstition" and "Infidelity"; but that it will break up and its several sections join the widely different sects which they now most nearly resemble in comparison with each other.
