A Royal Commission. The Opposition journals, and journals whose editors are desirous of getting a chance to run for the House of Commons, seem particularly eager for the prolongation of the August session.

Mr. C. J. Brydges denies the statements made about him in the private arrangements of Sir Hugh Allan. He never intimated his readiness to join the American Company, never agreed to take \$200,000 stock as his price for doing so.

Holders of "Liverpool" bank notes will be glad to learn that the Halifax Banks will receive the notes at par and positively refused to join the Commission.

The members of the Dominion House of Commons, resident in Halifax, have been making themselves almost ubiquitous during the past two days, in their anxiety to have it widely known as possible that they have done with the Government.
