Ballways of Sweden.

Sweden has 6,000 inlies of railway; grouped in three categories of 2,000 miles each. On the first a speed of thirty miles at Hour is allowed, the cost of the line being £3,000 a mile, the rails weighing sixty-four pitinds a yard. On the second the speed is confined to twenty miles an hour, the construction of the line being lighter, so that its cost has only been £4,000 a mile, while the read is laid with fifty-pound rails. The third description of railway is exceedingly light, although of standard gauge; trains are run on it at twelve miles an hour, the rails being of thirty-five pounds weight, and the total cost only £2,000 a mile.


