I beg to call your attention to the great and steadily increasing expense of crimin-al justice in this County, amounting dur-ing the past year to nearly \$9000. Of this amount the sum of \$3,700 was paid by the Provincial Government. Believing it to be the first paramount duty of every general government to provide for the administration of justice. I would re-commend you to petition Parliament so to amend the law as that the expense of summoning and the remuneration for the attendance of Jurors and all indemnity paid to Crown Witnesses shall be pro-vided for by the Provincial Government, and also that the charge of \$1 per day for constables attending hearings before Magistrates under the summary punish-ment acts should be charged with the other costs and not against the Council as has been the case heretofore. 


