If my readers can bear to read more of this vezed question, I will add somewhat, and, in the first place, that there may be a doubt, re-state what I have advocated.

First—That the Espianade may be attended along the whole city front, considerably south.

Third—That the main streets of the city running south be continued by iron bridges, passing over the present Espianade, leaving all below, now used by railways, to their purposes, and sloping down to the present level on the new street at the edge. This would have to be done by a square turn on the north edge of this street, leaving the bridges full height till they arrive at this street. These bridges would not be convenient much past the city hall, as from there to the Don there is little rise of land on Front street.

And observe again. All seem agreed that the Don must be turned from the bay, and used to carry the sewage to the lake. But it is greatly the Don which scours the bay; therefore, when we have cut it off, we must be especially careful not to contaminate the bay. In other words, we must not allow the Esplanade to drain into it. Moreover, we should see that the sewage from Parkdale way can connect with ours. Shut the Don from the bay and still give the bay the Esplanade sewage and the bay will be as bad as it now is, though you take all you can away by Front street.
