Editor World: Referring to the infliction of the second flogging of the man Grelish in the Central Prison, and knowing well by experience the statement in the press that the dread of a repetition of his first instalment was worse than the punishment itself is correct, would it not be wise for our learned judges and administrators of justice to draw a lesson therefrom. In a long service in the Imperial army and as a prison official in England, United States and Canada. I have before now had to witness the second infliction of the "cat" on the same man, and am convinced that the intense dread of what is coming exceeds the actual suffering of the punishment is the rule and not the exception.

If our friends who advocate the abolition of capital punishment without suggesting another course would give this matter careful attention they would soon find that the most hardened criminal would prefer death to a sentence of twenty years' imprisonment with a periodical flogging at intervals, according to the discretion of the learned judge and the degree of the offence committed.
