The Greco-Turkish. Constantinople, July 30.—A Ministerial Council held here, over which the Sultan presided, resolved to send a commission to Crete to endeavor to settle the difficulties there.

Crete's Governor Recalled. Constantinople, July 30.—The new commission which the ministerial council has decided to send to Crete will consist of two Mussalmans, two Christians to represent the Christian majority in the Cretan Assembly, and two representatives of the Sultan.
