FIVE POINTS OF LIGHT. Five new and important aspects of the insurance situation are exhibited on the first page of to-day's World.

(1) The extent to which the speculative as against the gilt-edged investment is becoming prevalent with Canadian companies is shown by the figures published without comment by the superintendent of insurance.

(2) Lobbying of the most insidious kind has begun against greater restriction of investments, and papers are named as being most useful to the lobby.

(3) A policyholders' petition for a public investigation is published for signature.

(4) A policyholders' association has been formed to obtain fair play from the Mutual Life of New York; a company which, under honest management, ought to have paid to policyholders \$30,000,000 more than they received in dividends.

A Popular Vote Can Secure Municipal Ownership of Electrical Power, in Spite of the Companies Which Now Have Franchises.

The third, the Electric Development Company, delivers its output to the Toronto, Niagara Railway Company, and the latter has about completed its lines of transmission to the gates of Toronto.

With the gentlemen composing this company we have no quarrel and towards them we have no desire to be unjust. By all means let them enjoy a good profit if they are ready at once to deliver their product en bloc at the gates of the city, to the city itself, for distribution, without profits to themselves, under other names. But there must be no monopoly.

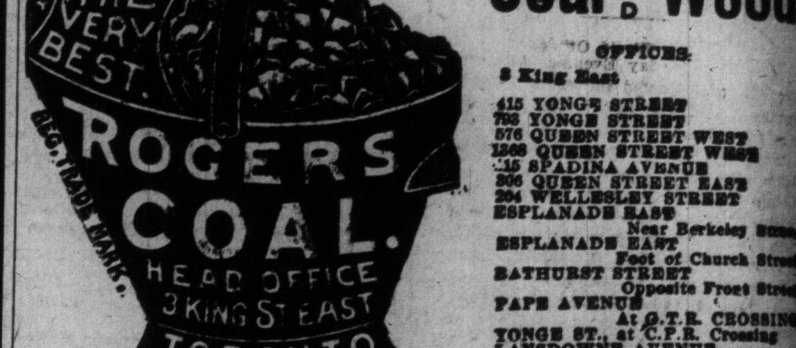
