REPORT.

IT is with feelings of devout gratitude to Almighty God that we report the seventh year's history of the TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES.

The most prominent event of the year was the removal of the Institution from the rented house on Bathurst Street to the new and commodious building at Parkdale.

The "Home" at Parkdale was opened on the 13th of December, 1880, by his Honour the Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario, who was accompanied by Mrs. Robinson, a devoted friend of the Charity.

The ceremony was of a very interesting character, and the attendance was so large as to crowd the building in every part, indicating how deeply rooted the "Home" is in the affectionate regard of the people of Toronto.

At the date of the opening we had nineteen inmates, being as many as we could accommodate in the house on Bathurst Street. Since then we have admitted twenty, making the present number thirty-nine—males, sixteen, and females, twenty-three.

Of these, thirty-one are from the City, two from different municipalities in the Province, and six others who, not being residents of Toronto, are paid for by friends living in the towns to which they belong.

The amount charged is only sufficient to cover the bare expense of keeping such patients, if indeed it is enough for that purpose. The present sum is only being tried as an experiment, and we await the result before adopting a permanent scale.

The Board felt desirous of helping incurables outside of Toronto, as there is no other provision for such in Canada, but felt also that Toronto charity should not be taxed to sustain persons admitted from beyond the City—hence the nominal charge as yet asked from municipalities and individuals.

We have to record the deaths of two patients during the year : Daniel Clifford, who died 27th May, 1880, and Sam Falconer, who died 28th August, 1880.

The liberality of Toronto to the Home for Incurables has been evinced during the past year, by donations and subscriptions, to the amount of \$2,317.99 for the regular working of the Institution, and also the sum of \$1,389.41, given as special donations to the "Furnishing Fund."

The Board is in debt on behalf of the "Building Fund" to the extent of \$11,000. Up to this date about the sum of \$24,000 has been freely given to erect a permanent "Home" for those helpless sufferers on whose behalf we cheerfully work.

It is a pity that any of the funds of the "Home" should be paid in interest, thus limiting the ability of the Board to help deserving sufferers.

The Board earnestly appeals to the Christian and benevolent people of Toronto, and Ontario, to help in the important matter of wiping out the debt which cripples us in our charitable work.

In addition to the general accommodation of the "Home," we have to report that four private rooms for patients paying an extra charge, have been specially furnished, one by Mrs. Foley, and three by a lady friend through Miss Dick.

On May 26th, there was given, for the benefit of the Home, readings by Mrs. Scott Siddons, which realized the sum of \$121.50.

In December last the Ancient Order of Foresters gave a concert ; the proceeds handed over to the Institution were \$68.

The guests at the Queen's Hotel gave an entertainment in the hotel, on the 13th January, which realized the handsome sum of \$419.60.

The Board also acknowledges, with thanks, the sum of \$417.27 from the Ontario Government, and the promise of an increased grant, dating from the opening of the "Home." Also to the City Council for its annual grant of \$500.

The Board acknowledges with deep gratitude the following legacies which have been bequeathed :—The late Mrs. Leitch, \$500 ; the late Mr. S. Spreull, \$500 ; the late Mr. A. Wilson, \$1,000. Also the very handsome donations, from Mr. John Leslie, of Dundas, of \$200 ; and from Mr. John G. Howard, of \$400.

The Board records with thanks the kindly rendered services of the Medical Staff and of the Solicitor, Mr. Mortimer Clark.

Religious service is held every Sunday afternoon by the Ministers of Toronto and Parkdale, to whom our thanks are due.

The Matron (Mrs. Craigie), and others who serve under her in the "Home," continue to give great satisfaction to the Board.

MEDICAL REPORT.

On behalf of the Medical Staff, I congratulate the Committee of Management on the completion of their new Home, which for beauty of location can hardly be surpassed, and which will enable them to extend the benefits of its charity to a much greater number of the unfortunate class for whom it was established.

The distance of the Home from the City, and the dangerous nature of the railway-crossings at Parkdale, will, I fear, render it difficult for the Medical Staff to give that prompt and regular attendance which they have hitherto given with pleasure, and is likely to detract from what would otherwise be, to them, a labour of love.

The statistics, in all that relate to the inmates, are fully given in the Secretary's report, and need not be repeated here; but I would suggest the appointment of a committee, embracing some of the Medical Staff, for the purpose of revising the rules in regard to the class of cases to be admitted, as some dissatisfaction exists with the present classification.

CONSTITUTION

OF

"THE TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES,"

(AS AMENDED).

I. This Institution shall be known as "The Toronto Home for Incurables."

II. Its objects shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and surgical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them, while inmates of the Home, the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum shall be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay, in advance and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privilege for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the Home, or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it, shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the Home. Persons may donate for special objects, and effect will be given to the wishes of such contributors, so far as they can be carried out without conflicting with the Constitution and By-laws of the Home.

V. The affairs of the Home shall be under the direction, control and management of a Board of Managers, of whom at least forty

shall be ladies and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III. The Medical Staff attending the Home shall be *ex officio* members of the Board of Managers. In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the Institution, and their decisions upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President, and from among the Lady Managers the following officers, viz.:—First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer. For the more convenient working of the Institution, the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number, such as an Executive Committee and committees for visiting and superintending the Home.

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the various officers and employees of the Home. The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month, and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional By-laws for regulating its own government, and for the government of the officers and employees, as before provided, and, when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called, the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III. shall be held during the month of March.

It shall be the duty of the Board to make arrangements for a report of the property of the Home, and to exhibit a full and correct statement of the same.

VIII. In view of the fact that the City of Toronto and the surrounding towns and applicants from time to time apply for admission to the Home, the Board shall have the preference in the selection of applicants.

IX. The Board shall have the power to establish a municipality in Ontario, and to give effect to the same, and to determine the boundaries thereof, and to provide for the government of the same. Provided always that the municipality so established shall be subject to the laws of Ontario, and may approve, the same, and that the Board shall have the power to regulate the same.

X. The foregoings shall be in force at an annual general meeting having been held at least two-thirds of those present.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting ; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months ; and to exhibit a full and accurate view of the funds, property and effects of the Home.

VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the Home, applicants from the City of Toronto for admission to the Home shall have the preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality in Ontario outside of Toronto on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent : Provided always that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentleman as the Board may approve, that the person seeking admission is incurable ; provided also that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution.

X. The foregoing Constitution shall not be altered, unless it be at an annual general meeting of subscribers, notice of such alteration having been given at the previous annual meeting, and two-thirds of those present consenting thereto.
