## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

### *Province of Quebec Rifle Association.*

---

#### CONSTITUTION.

---

RULE 1. That this Association be called the "*Province of Quebec Rifle Association*," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.

2. That the Annual Subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of twenty dollars in cash, at any one time for that express purpose, shall entitle the donor to apply to be elected a life member at the next annual meeting of Council.

3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.

4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the office-bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association in this Province. Five to form a quorum.

5. The office-bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting; all office-bearers must be individual members of the Association.

6. A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting, and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.

7. The Deputy Adjutant-Generals and Brigade Majors of the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.

8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise; they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their names sent to the Secretary, at least one month before the annual meeting; and to entitle to vote, any changes must be duly notified to the Secretary.

9. The Council may from time to time, make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.

10. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.

11. The Annual Business Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the by-laws; and this meeting terminates the previous year's business.

12. An Annual Report shall be made by the Secretary and Treasurer and submitted to the Council, previous to publication.

13. At its Annual Meeting the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee of eleven of its members, who with the Secretary and Treasurer, shall carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, and give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

## BY-LAWS.

---

1. That the Annual Meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the first Thursday in May.

2. Extraordinary Meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required by any six members of the Council; fifteen days notice of such meeting given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called.

3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the Annual Meeting.

4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time—all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.

5. The payment of sums for current expenses, must be authorized by the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents. Other payments to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

“ *Rule 5.* The office-bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the Annual Meeting; all office-bearers must be individual members of the Association.

“ *Rule 8.* Add after last clause, and to entitle to vote any changes must be duly notified to the Secretary.

" *Rule 11.* The Annual Business Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the by-laws and this meeting terminates the previous year's business.

" *Rule 13.* At its Annual Meeting the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee of eleven of its members, who with the Secretary and Treasurer, shall carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, and give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order respecting the management of the affairs of the Association."

NINTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
*Province of Quebec Rifle Association.*

---

In submitting the Ninth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association, the Council have pleasure in congratulating its members on its successful progress.

Its efficiency has been maintained, and with somewhat reduced subscriptions, the prize lists for the Annual Matches were increased by nearly one hundred dollars; this and the continued popularity of the meeting, induced a large entry to all the Matches, an average of over 20 per cent. above the entries of the previous year.

In the first Match, the Quebec Volunteer Champion Cup, His Excellency the Governor General's Silver Medal and \$20, were won by Private Ivinson of the 1st Battalion, Prince of Wales Rifles, with a score of 60 out of a possible 75.

The Battalion Cup was won by the 1st Batt. Prince of Wales Rifles, with a score of 244, the 54th Richmond Batt. being second with 228, and the 3rd Batt. Victoria Rifles third with 224.

Corporal Finlayson, Montreal Garrison Artillery, won the N. R. A. Medal and \$20, making the highest aggregate score in Matches 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 and 7, 196 points out of a possible 265.

The second aggregate was made by Sergeant. Holtby, Montreal Garrison Artillery 192 points, which secured him His Excellency the Governor General's Bronze Medal and \$15.

The handsome Silver Medal presented by His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of Quebec, was also won by Corporal

Finlayson, making the highest aggregate at 600 yards in matches 1, 3 and 6, being 63 out of a possible 85.

The Team sent to Wimbledon last year, although not winners of the Kolapore Cup, the prize which they go home more particularly to compete for, were fairly successful in other Matches. Private Ross, of the 1st Batt. in the Prince of Wales Match tied the winner of the First Prize and took second money; in this match there were 92 competitors, and amongst the 21 prize winners were three Canadians.

In the Daily Telegraph, prize competition, 1031 competitors, Corporal Finlayson stood 8th on the list of prize winners.

In the Graphic prize competition, 756 competitors, Sergt. Matthews, 3rd Batt. Victoria Rifles, took 26th prize.

In the Burroughs and Watts prize competition, 1278 competitors, Sergeant Vaughan, 3rd Batt. V.V.R. took 16th prize.

In the Martin challenge cup competition, 1121 competitors, Private Shaw, 54th Richmond Batt. took 7th prize.

In the Alexandra prize, 1390 competitors, Private Ross, 1st Batt. and Sergt. Matthews, 3rd Batt. took prizes.

In the Alfred prize competition, 1351 competitors, Corporal Finlayson took 32nd prize, and in the St. George's challenge Vase competition, he took 28th prize with 1870 competitors.

In the competition for places on the Wimbledon Team, 1878, the Province has secured five; the competition was fired on the 24th and 25th August, immediately after the Provincial Matches four out of the five successful are from Montreal; their names in order of merit are given below, viz.: Sergeant Riddel, M.G.A., Captain Thomas, 54th Batt., Sergt. Holtby, M.G.A., Corporal Finlayson, M.G.A., Sergeant Wardill, 1st Battalion, P.W.R.

In accordance with resolution of last Annual Meeting, a

special meeting of Council was held on the first day of the Annual Matches, when the action of the Council of 10th August, 1875, was reconsidered, and after discussion was reconfirmed by a vote of 32 to 8, which it is to be hoped will dispose of this unpleasant matter for all time.

At the Annual Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, held on the 27th February last, four of your representatives were present, viz.: Lieutenant-Colonels Fraser, D'Orsonnens and Bacon, and Captain Boyd. The meeting was very largely attended by representatives from all parts of the Dominion, and business of the meeting was rendered much more pleasant and easy by the handsome manner in which the Hon. Minister of Militia met the President in the matter of assistance to Rifle Associations, and to the Wimbledon Team. He was present at the meeting and spoke strongly in favor of the Association, and promised all the encouragement it was in his power to give.

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Dominion of Canada R. A., was held on the 27th February, at which your Treasurer was present, when arrangements were made for the Annual Matches to be held in Ottawa, in September next; at this meeting it was also determined, that the competition for next year's Wimbledon Team, should be conducted on very much the same principle as last year.

The question of permanent ranges for Montreal, was brought under the notice of the Militia Department, and plans of Logan's Farm and Point St. Charles Ranges were prepared by your Secretary and submitted, with a view to shewing that an exchange of part of the former for the present ground used for the ranges might be effected without any actual expense to the Department, the proposition was not carried out, but some good came of it, as a five years lease was authorized for the present ranges. This matter should not, however, be allowed to rest here. Strenuous efforts should be made to secure a permanent range. As every season shews the increasing

necessity of providing enlarged accommodation for the Militia desirous of keeping up their rifle practice, to say nothing of improvements of a permanent character which could be effected could this desirable end be attained.

The Portable Target authorized to be put up as an experiment for last season's practice was found to work so well, that it was determined to erect two others at the long ranges; these were all used at the last Annual Matches and were much approved of, both by the snider and small bore shots.

The question of training men suitable for markers, who would be available for ordinary practice as well as for matches comes up again before the executive, and if a means of reducing the cost of marking can be attained, it would be a very great boon to marksmen.

The change in the weapon used in the Queen's Prize competition at Wimbledon to Martini Henry Rifles for all stages, renders it necessary for our Wimbledon men to be well practiced with that arm, and it behoves the Association to consider whether means cannot be found to procure a limited number of these rifles.

The balance at the credit of the Association, is a little less than last year, (about 40 dollars,) owing to various circumstances, our collections were not as much as expected, in considering this balance however, it must be remembered that we have three new Targets to show for it, two of which are suitable for long ranges.

The Association has again to acknowledge with thanks the Annual grant of \$1700 from the Dominion Government and \$500 from the Province of Quebec.

A Photographic copy of the Trophy presented by the Dominion of Canada to the National Rifle Association, has been received and is on view on the Table.

During the past year, the Association has sustained a loss in the decease of its first President, Lt.-Col. Routh, and its

first Treasurer, Captain Esdaile, both in their time most efficient and energetic officers of the Association, their loss is much to be regretted.

Looking back to the first report of the Association, it was started in 1868, and arrangements were completed for the first matches to be held on 24th August, 1869, the first subscription list collected in the City amounted to \$977, the result of the first year's operations was a deficit of \$12; however, the ranges were then in a very dilapidated state, and cost over \$600 to repair. In the first match there were 170 competitors; Quarter master Cleveland, 54th Richmond Battalion, took the first prize. Of the sixteen Associations, which joined that year, all but the three belonging to the Grand Trunk Railway Brigade, still thrive.

A change has been made by the N. R. A. in the size of the Bull's eye in the third class target, increasing its diameter from six to eight inches. Instructions have been given to the caretaker at Point St. Charles ranges, to make a similar change in the targets there.

## REGULATIONS.

---

- 1.—There shall be "1877" Wimbledon Targets and Scoring.
- 2.—Firing shall commence each day at 9 o'clock precisely.
- 3.—All firing shall be conducted under officers or persons appointed for the duty by the Executive Officers, and all competitors shall be under their authority. When a competitor has joined a squad he shall not leave it until he has retired, or completed his firing, without leave from the register keeper; competitors losing their turn, or absent without leave, may forfeit their place at the discretion of the Executive Officers.
- 4.—In Snider Matches, competitors will fire the whole number of rounds alternately in files (at each distance) as far as practicable.
- 5.—No competitor to cap, or with Snider to load, before he steps to the front to fire.
- 6.—Any position, not involving artificial rests, allowed at all ranges, except Standing Match, which must be from the shoulder, and the Hythe Match kneeling; slings may be used, Government pattern.
- 7.—Competitors must provide their own ammunition, which may be purchased on the ground at 20 cents for 10 rounds.
- 8.—In competitions open to any Rifle, all sights will be allowed, except telescopic and those disallowed at Wimbledon [*Vide N. R. Rules, 1877.*] Maximum weight, 10 lbs., exclusive of ramrod; minimum pull of trigger, 3 lbs.
- 9.—In matches for Snider Rifles, none but Government pattern will be allowed. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
- 10.—Competitors shall, if required, submit their Rifles for inspection, by the armourer or other officers, before, during, and after a match, any one found guilty of plugging, or other unfair behaviour, will be disqualified from further shooting, and forfeit Entrance Fees and Prizes, and will be liable to be debarred from competing at any future match of the Association.
- 11.—In the Battalion Match, Volunteers to be in uniform, full or undress, of their respective corps.
- 12.—One sighting shot at each distance shall be allowed each competitor, on payment of 10 cents per shot, before the commencement of the competition of each squad. This shot may be fired in any position. In matches where the firing is alternate, the sighting shot will be before each

man's commencement, not before that of squads. No "blowing-off" shall be allowed, except at the "blowing-off" pits, where competitors may "blow-off" on presentation of a "blowing-off" ticket, price 5 cents.

13.—Ties will be decided: *In Individual Competitions*, 1st, if at more than one distance, by the range totals, in inverse order; 2nd, by the fewest outers; 3rd, by the fewest magpies; 4th, by the fewest inners; 5th, by value of each shot in inverse order; 6th, by firing single shots at the longest distance in the competition until decided. *In team competitions*, 1st, if at more than one distance, by aggregate range totals, in inverse order; 2nd, by fewest outers; 3rd, by fewest magpies; 4th, by fewest inners; 5th, by the total of each round, in inverse order; 6th, by highest scorer in each team firing single shots at longest distance. *For the aggregates*, 1st, by score at each match, in inverse order; 2nd, by following the rules for *individual ties*.

14.—After delivering each shot, the competitor must pay attention to the score called out by the register keeper. Any objection to the scoring of a hit must be made before another shot is fired; otherwise the shot must stand as signalled. When only one competitor is present at a firing point, a witness to the score must be provided by the Executive.

15.—Misses cannot be signalled, even in sighting shots.

16.—No person will be allowed to practice on the ranges during the week of the meeting, unless it be necessary to drill the markers previous to commencement of the meeting.

17.—Entries must be made at the Secretary's Office at least one match ahead, or will be charged 25 per cent. extra as Post Entries. Every competitor shall enter and shoot not oftener than once for any prize; except in the Optional Matches, where two entries are allowed, once with Small-bore and once with Snider, or twice with Snider, one score only to count.

18.—Any competitor firing at the wrong target, or during the time the danger flag is up or the disc is shown on the target, will be debarred from all further competition, at discretion of the Executive Officers.

19.—The Executive Officers will decide all disputes on the ground. Appeal from their decision may be made in writing to the Executive Committee, whose decision will be final and without recourse. Their decision to be given in writing to the Secretary.

20.—Any competitor refusing to obey the instructions of the Executive Officers, or their deputies, will be immediately ruled out of all further competition.

21.—The ranges being, for the period of the Matches of the Association, handed over to the charge of the Executive Committee, any person,

not a competitor, interfering with any of the firing squads, and annoying them in any way, will at once be expelled from the ground.

22.—All orders on the ground will be given by the Executive Officers, Lieut.-Col. Hanning and Lieut.-Col. Hon. M. Aylmer.

23.—Any competitor infringing any of the preceding regulations, being guilty of unruly or disorderly conduct, or being intoxicated, shall be ruled out, and forfeit any Entrance Fee he may have paid.

24.—PENALTIES.—DISQUALIFICATION.

Any competitor—

1st, who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to a register-keeper, or any other employée of the Association, under any pretence whatever ; or,

2nd, who shall intentionally discharge his Rifle at the wrong target ; or,

3rd, who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable—shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, forfeit all his Entrance Fees, and be for ever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

DISALLOWANCE OF SCORE.

Any competitor—

1st, who shall fail to comply with the Conditions laid down for any particular Match ; or,

2nd, who shall infringe any of the Instructions or Regulations of the Meeting—shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score disallowed.

25.—Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as the plea of ignorance cannot under any circumstances be entertained.
