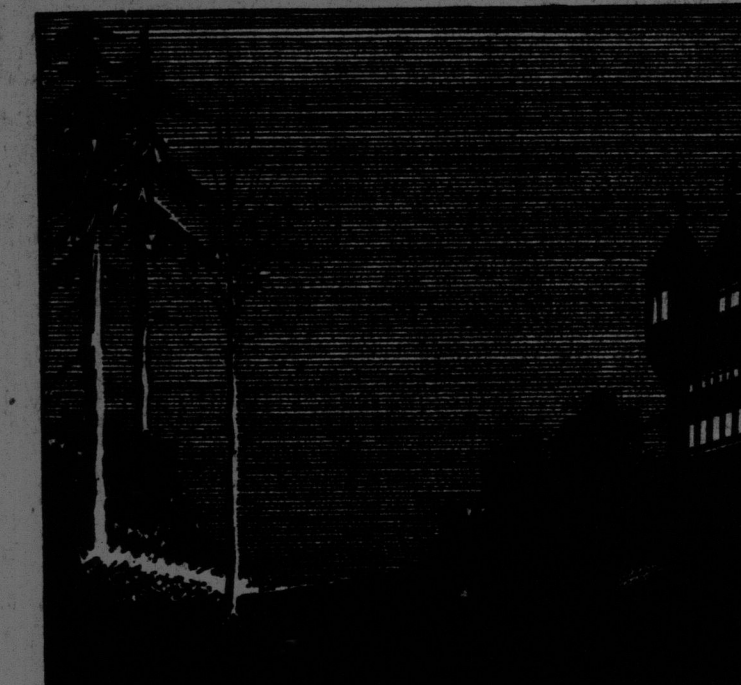

AFTER PROROGATION WHAT? Parliament will prorogue today. The scandalous revelations made before the public accounts committee touched only the fringe of the matters which ought to be investigated.

There is much to be done yet in the way of investigation. Only the little things have been investigated so far. There are well authenticated rumors of rake-offs going to middlemen, ranging from \$50,000 to \$100,000 on some of the bigger contracts.

In order to divert public attention from such statements as this the government has made charges against Hon. Frank Oliver, and the former Liberal government. Sir Wilfrid Laurier promptly rose in his place yesterday and called upon the government to prosecute any and all cases of wrong-doing it could discover.

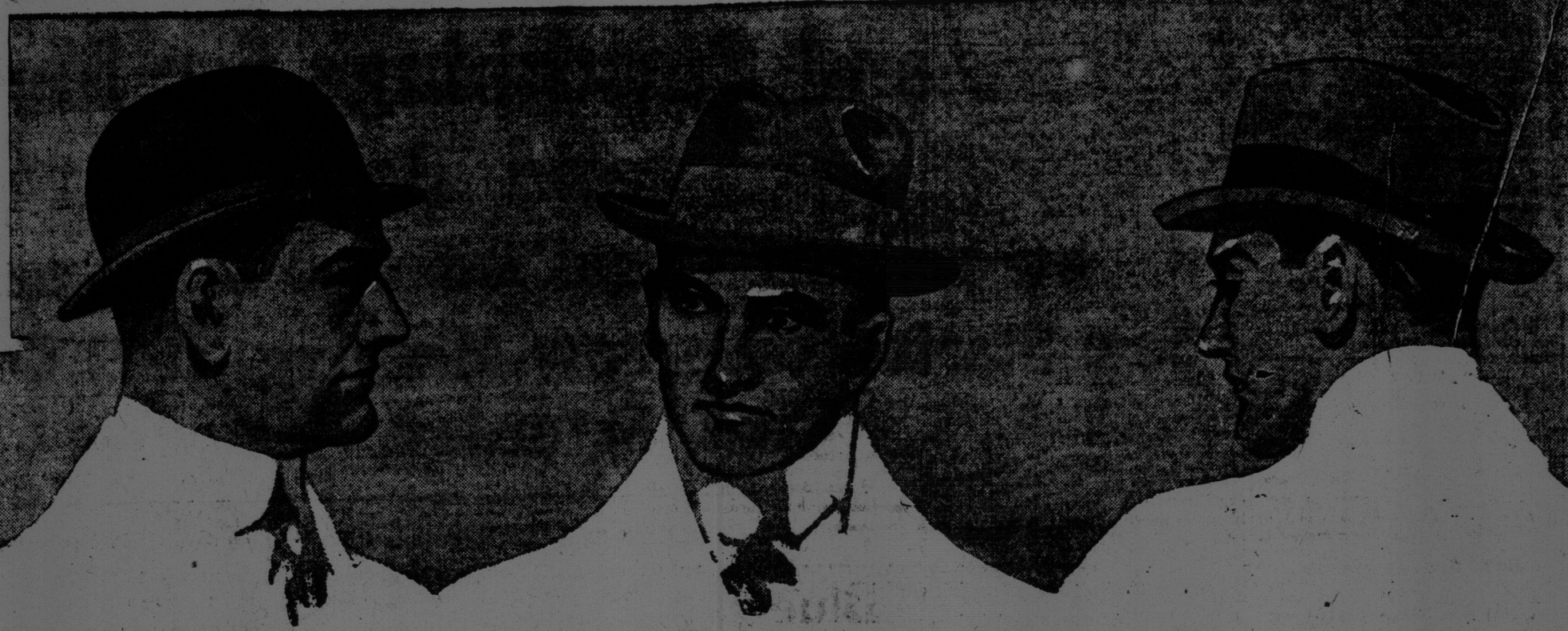

Ypres Greatest and Most Expensive Victory In The Annals of British Army

Conan Doyle Gives Inside Facts Showing Great Importance of Recent Battles British Army of 150,000 Kept Back 600,000 Germans From Coast—Cases Where Orders to Retreat Failed to Reach Cheshire, Highlanders and Munsters and They Fought to End

In his war lecture at the Queen's Hall, London, on March 24, Sir A. Conan Doyle gave a graphic narrative of the four critical battles of the campaign, which ended with the Battle of Ypres and the defeat of the Prussian Guard. Some of the details in his story are not found in the current summaries and he said that he obtained information, the source of which is absolutely confidential. His account of the battle was given with fresh details of the possibility of holding the weak salient formed by the four brigades across the Bethune Canal against the massed German artillery. Although two brigades were driven out of an untenable position only one-sixth of the British force was seriously engaged, and the battle was not fought to a finish. It was the news of the French retreat in the afternoon which caused our army to fall back.

Headquarters gives you the impression of being in the quietest and most religious town in the whole world. If ever I have time I will count the churches, but their bells ring all day and most of the night. The streets seem almost deserted. You do not even see many British soldiers. Here and there are officers just passing from one of the great administrative branches of the army to another. The generals—the men who control the destinies and who are responsible for the lives and upkeep of hundreds of thousands of men—pass to and fro, hardly distinguishable in plain khaki, except for the red and gold on their caps. A Champion Holiday A private writes (in error) after a pleasant voyage. It is very funny listening to the people talking, when we cannot understand what they mean. The only things we get to eat are bully beef and biscuits (dog biscuits) also tea. Of course there is a M. C. A. here where we can buy tea or coffee, with cakes and biscuits. I believe one of our companies is already on the way to the firing line, and I think we go off tomorrow. It takes about forty-eight hours to get from here. When we are here we can hardly think that we are going to do what we have read so much about, but nevertheless we will give a good account of ourselves now that we are across. Our officers seem very sorry, and that makes a great difference. If I come safely through all this I will look back on it as a champion holiday at the government's expense. In a second letter he says: We have landed at our resting place at last, after marching about twelve miles from the railway station. It was horse boxes we travelled in, not carriages, and we were done up after twenty-four hours in these without being allowed out. We were nearly shaken to pieces. We are lodged in a barn and have a good bed of straw. The nearest trenches are about six miles from here and we can hear the guns very plainly. By the time you get this letter I will be trying my luck in the trenches.

War Tales From Soldiers' Letters

A Duel of Sharpshooters — Writer Declares Going to British Headquarters as a Rest Cure — "A Champion Holiday" if This Man Gets Through

Writing from the theatre of war an officer says: I have had one or two escapes, not so narrow as lucky, which will give you an idea of the marksmanship of the Germans across the way. On the first occasion I was out of my dug-out with my company commander, and our guns had been popping shells into their trenches for about an hour when they decided evidently to retaliate. They had sent over about twelve behind my platoon without doing any damage, when suddenly one came, and striking squarely in the traverse next to my dug-out, leveled the entire traverse, knocking the hurdles and mud every way. I should have had a nasty shaking up had I been there, and I was glad I wasn't. The next morning we were awakened early by the heavy guns of the Germans shelling an absolutely deserted village behind us, and at six o'clock their heavy guns sent up big shells into another small town on our right. All day it went on, and our own guns replied until early in the afternoon when it grew quieter and we had a little rest. Somehow or other the Germans must have got wind of our changing over, as just about 6.30 p. m. one of their big guns sent one shell over. It landed on top of my dug-out on the left-hand side, burst, and smashed in the water-pan of the machine gun. I was now altogether. One of my N. C. O.'s was standing immediately behind me, and was covered with mud from head to foot. The shell went into the mud on top of it and burst. He had a narrow escape and so had I, as, had I been in, it would have knocked me out of the way, so I have been lucky this last time in the trenches. Sharpshooting Duel A private writes: I saw a Regular having what I call a "friendly duel" with a German sharpshooter. He had his head well above the top of the trench, and, taking careful aim, fired. Immediately there was an echo as the German replied, and the sharp close to the Englishman's head was struck by a bullet. Without turning a hair, "Tommy" repeated the process, and again the Teuton replied.

As a business competitor it will be more aggressive than the Germany of the Hohenzollerns. After the war of 1870 France paid her billion-dollar war indemnity to Germany with a shrug of the shoulders and became one of the great creditor nations of the world. Will Germany do less? Is it not probable that with its enormous and efficient industrial system it will do even better? Germany must gain its revival from its exports. It must produce for other nations and pay its debts in manufactured products. The "Made in Germany" label is not popular in Canada at the present time. How long will that sentiment last? What is the usual course in analogous cases? A brutal criminal is not popular. He might be in danger of lynch law were indignant citizens able to lay hands on him. After his trial and conviction, however, our tenderly sympathetic people send comforts and luxuries to his cell and sign petitions for a commutation of his sentence, while the less emotional members of the community simply forget. This kindly human spirit that occasionally is misdirected denotes a tendency that it is well to note. John Shaw, charged with stealing a pair of ladies shoes from a house in King Square, also was remanded.
