

The Schoen Manufacturing Company, of Racine, Wis, has instituted a suit for \$10,000 damages against the Garment Workers' Union. The Master Carpenters' Association on Philadelphia, Pa, has declared a lockout of journeymen belonging to the Brother hood of Carpenters. and Manufacturers

hood of Carpenters. The Order of Railway Conductors has since its establishment paid \$5,00,000 in benefits to widows and orphans and others permanently disabled, and now has \$500,000 invested in securities. About thirteen hundred boys have been dismissed from the Pennsylvapia mines and breakers in the last for days, in compliance with the new law forbidding hoys under 14 in the breakers and under 10 in the mines. On May S, the Massachusetts Senate passed a bill limiting the hours of duty

On May S, the Massachusetts Senate passed a bill limiting the hours of dury of firemen in citics of over 40,000 to 12 hours per day. This bill must be ap-proved by the citizens at the next elec-tion in order to become effective. Organized labor in Eric. Pa., has bought a building, naying \$30,000, and will use the same for a labor temple. The building will contain reading rooms, bath rooms, etc., and will be fitted to best accommodate the many unions of that city.


