BILL.

An Act to amend the Act 14 and 15 Vic., cap. 4, intituled, "*An Act to amend the Act concerning Land Surveyors.*"

WHEREAS by reason of the delay which occurred in the distribution of the Provincial Statutes, and from other causes, many applicants for admission to practise the profession of Land Surveyor, were unable to transmit copies of their Articles or Indentures within the period fixed by the Act passed in the Session held in the 14th and 15th years of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, "*An Act to amend the Act concerning Land Surveyors*;" Be it therefore enacted, &c., Preamble.

That any transmission or deposit of Articles or Indentures, to or with the Secretary of the Board before which the applicant is to be examined, made since the first day of January now last, or which shall be made during the six months next after the passing of this Act, shall be of the same effect to all intents and purposes of law, as if such transmission or deposit had been made within the period prescribed by the Act first above cited, any law to the contrary notwithstanding. Transmission or deposit of Indentures within a certain time to be valid, for all purposes of law.
