PRIVATE PRAYERS.



Aids to the Humble Churchgoer.



On your way to Church,

Be thoughtful and silent, or say but little, and that little good. Speak not idly of another's faults, for you are going to ask the forgiveness of your own.

When you reach God's House,

Go in at once. Time spent within is very precious.

In Church,

Kneel down and say (*privately*):

O LORD, I am now in Thy courts, Make me reverent, keep me by Thy Holy Spirit from wandering thoughts and looks, for the sake of Him who is present where two or three are gathered in Thy name: Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Worship God.

Take your part diligently. No one who takes his part ever finds the service too long.

In Praise and Prayer,

Remember the awful presence into which you have come. Never look about to see who are coming in, or for any other cause. It matters nothing to you what others may be doing. Attend to yourself. Fasten your thoughts firmly on the holy service. Miss not one word. This needs a severe struggle, so you have no time for idle or vain thoughts. The blessed Spirit will strengthen you. Persevere.

When Service is over,

Remain kneeling, and say

GRANT, O Lord, that what I have said with my lips and heard with my ears I may believe in my heart, and what I believe in my heart, I may practice in my life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Leave the church very quietly.

On your way home,

Be careful or the world will soon step back into your mind. Love praise and prayer best. Preaching is but the help to that holy work.
