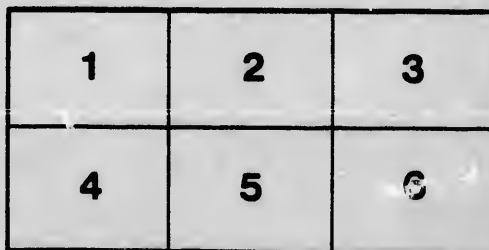

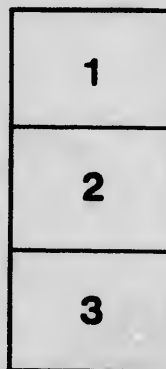

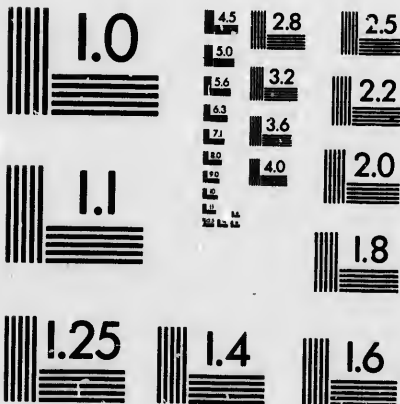

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE HAMILTON CLUB.

---

1. This Association shall be known as the Hamilton Club.

2. All former Rules and Regulations are hereby rescinded.

3. Politics and Religious questions of Politics and Religion every kind are absolutely excluded from open discussion in the Club.

4. Each candidate for admission shall be <sup>Candidates for membership.</sup> proposed by one member and seconded by another, by a proposal in writing, stating the candidate's usual residence, rank, profession or other description, which shall be inserted in the book of candidates, and signed by both mover and seconder, and such candidate shall be balloted for at the next ballot, which shall take place after the lapse of two weeks from the time of such proposal.

*Provided* the names of the candidate and his proposer and seconder have been posted <sup>How balloted for.</sup> in the reading-room, under the hand of the Secretary, at least two weeks before the day

of ballot. No ballot shall be valid unless fifteen members actually ballot, and one black ball in five shall exclude. No candidate who shall have been rejected shall be eligible to be proposed again within twelve months. No person shall be admitted a member unless of the full age of twenty-one years.

5. A list showing the names of the persons eligible to be balloted for on that day shall be exhibited in the Reading and Smoke Rooms on each day on which a ballot is to take place. The ballot shall take place between the hours of twelve noon, and five p. m., on the first and third Wednesdays of each month, and the Secretary, with at least one member of the Committee, or, in the absence of the Secretary, two members of the Committee, shall open the ballot box and declare the result; and any member may vote by proxy at such ballot, such proxy being a special proxy given for such vote only. Should less than fifteen ballots be cast, the candidate shall be again balloted for on the next Wednesday on which a ballot is held, and so on each succeeding Wednesday on which a ballot is held, until fifteen ballots shall be cast.

6. On the admission of each new member

the Secretary shall notify the same to him, <sup>furnished with copy of</sup> and furnish him with a printed copy of the Rules and Regulations, and request him to remit the amount of his entrance fee and subscription to the Treasurer.

7. The entrance fee shall be one hundred <sup>Entrance fee</sup> dollars, and the annual subscription twenty- <sup>Annual</sup> five dollars; the latter payable in advance <sup>subscription.</sup> on the first day of December in each year. The subscription of new members balloted for on and after the first day of January shall be <sup>Broken</sup> a sum equal to two dollars and twenty-five <sup>period of the</sup> cents per month until the first of December <sup>year.</sup> following.

8. No member shall be allowed to ballot <sup>Qualifica-</sup> for a candidate, or be permitted to vote on <sup>tion of</sup> any occasion whatever, or enjoy any of the <sup>voters.</sup> privileges of the Club, who has not paid his entrance fee, or has been in arrear for his annual subscription for six weeks.

9. Any member failing to pay his entrance <sup>Members in</sup> fee or subscription within two months from <sup>default—</sup> the time the same shall become due, shall <sup>how dealt</sup> be reported to the Committee by the Secre- <sup>with.</sup> tary, and the Committee may cause his name to be erased from the list of members, unless the delay can be justified to the satisfaction of the Committee; and he shall thereafter,

in consequence of such erasure, cease to be a member; but notwithstanding such erasure and such ceasing to be a member, such former member shall still be liable to pay his entrance fee and subscription to the same extent as if he continued to be a member for the then current year.

10. The name of every member, whose dues or debts to the Club shall have remained unpaid for two months after the same shall have become due, shall be posted in the Club.

11. All entrance fees and annual subscriptions shall be paid either to the Treasurer personally or to his credit at the bank of the Club.

12. Any member of the Club who shall cease to be a resident in Hamilton or within twenty miles thereof, may, by the payment of an annual fee of ten dollars, retain all the privileges of full membership, or, if he so elect, may, on notifying the Committee, be deemed a supernumerary member and exempt from payment of subscription, so long as he shall not be a resident of Hamilton, or within twenty miles thereof, and shall not in any way make use of the Club or exercise any of his privileges therein; but any mem-

ber availing himself of this latter indulgence, must notify the same by letter to the Secretary, who shall insert his name in the book of Supernumerary members. In either case, any such member shall be re-admitted to all his privileges upon his again becoming a resident of Hamilton, and on his return being notified in writing to the Secretary, such notification to be given one month after his return, and upon payment of a proportionate subscription for the current year, if his return dates after the 1st of Jan., at the rate of \$2.25 per month; and failing in such notification and payment within the time before limited, unless the delay can be justified to the satisfaction of the committee, such member shall be considered to have withdrawn from the Club, provided that the Secretary having reasonable grounds for believing that any such member has returned to Hamilton as a resident, or in the case of a supernumerary member, has been availing himself of the privileges of the Club, may notify such member that his privileges as a non-resident or supernumerary member have ceased and require the payment of the proper proportional subscription in the terms of this rule.

Hamilton may be admitted to the privileges of the Club while so resident, after being balloted for and elected in the manner pointed out for the election of ordinary members, and on payment of an annual subscription of \$20.00 in advance, and any Diplomatic or Consular representative of any foreign state or nation who, being a citizen of such state or nation, and who is resident in Hamilton, but who had not been previous to his appointment a resident of Hamilton, and who is engaged in no business or calling other than performing the duties of such diplomatic or consular representation may be admitted after being balloted for and elected in like manner and on payment of an annual subscription of \$25.00 in advance. Such members shall be called privileged members, and shall not be entitled to vote or have any voice in the management of, or hold any interest in the property of the Club, in right of such membership. If such members should become permanent residents of Hamilton, they may be admitted as full members on payment of the usual entrance fee and regular annual subscription. Such members already or hereafter to be elected under this rule shall pay a proportionate amount of their subscription up to the first day of the next December, after which their subscriptions

shall be payable in advance on the first day of December in each year as in the case of ordinary members.

14. The Committee shall have the power <sup>Power of</sup> to admit to the privileges of the Club, as <sup>Committee</sup> visiting members, for such period as they <sup>as to visitors</sup> may from time to time see fit, the Governor-General of the Dominion, the Lieutenant-Governors of the Provinces of the Dominion, the Judges of the Superior Courts of the Province of Ontario, and any stranger of distinguished rank or position visiting Hamilton, to whom it may seem proper to offer such a compliment, but the resolution to admit them must be agreed to by a majority of the Committee.

Provided, that in order to avoid the necessity of calling the Committee together on every such occasion, the Committee may at any meeting authorize the Secretary alone or together with one or more of the Committee to exercise such discretion, and the Committee may change and alter such authority at any subsequent meeting, provided that the parties so authorized may in their discretion refer any such question to the full Committee.

15. Officers in Her Majesty's Army and <sup>Officers in</sup> Army and



Navy, etc., admitted on payment of the ordinary subscription half-yearly, in advance. Navy, and all persons holding civil and military appointments under the Imperial government who may be stationed in Canada temporarily, shall be admitted to the privileges of the Club on payment of the subscription semi-annually in advance; and also such strangers as may be temporarily resident in Canada, whose names shall have been previously submitted to and approved of by the Committee, shall be admitted in like manner, on payment of \$5 monthly in advance.

Privileged members to have no vote or voice in the management of the Club. The above shall be called privileged members, and shall not be entitled to vote or have any voice in the management of, or hold any interest in the property of the Club. The temporary residence of such strangers not to exceed twelve months.

Officers of Banks admitted on special terms. 16. Officers of Chartered Banks having branches or agencies in Hamilton, and who are not settled residents thereof, may, during their temporary residence in Hamilton, be admitted to the privileges of the Club, after having been balloted for and elected in the manner pointed out for the election of ordinary members; and on payment of twenty dollars half-yearly in advance for ten consecutive years, shall be entitled to full membership without further ballot. bers, previous to becoming full members, shall be called privileged members, and shall not be entitled to vote or have any voice in the management of, or hold any interest in the property of the Club, in right of such membership.

17. Life members may hereafter be elected Life mem-  
bers—how  
elected. only at any of the annual general meetings of the Club, on the vote of a majority of two-thirds of the members present in person or by proxy, provided the name of the person or persons who are proposed to be so elected shall have been first submitted to the Committee, at a meeting held at least three months before the day fixed for holding the annual meeting ; and a notice stating the name and residence of each candidate and of his proposer and seconder shall have been posted in the Reading Room one month prior to the holding of the annual meeting. Life members now elected, or who shall hereafter be elected, shall not be liable to pay any yearly subscription to the Club, nor have any interest in its affairs or voice in its management, but they shall be subject to all other rules and regulations of the Club in the same way as ordinary members.

18. Any ordinary member shall have the Introduction

two weeks. privilege of introducing a friend resident

elsewhere than in Hamilton, or within fifty miles thereof, for a period not exceeding two weeks, provided the name of such person has (with the written recommendation of two ordinary members) been submitted and approved of by the Committee, and the person so admitted shall thereafter be a privileged member of the Club for two weeks, subject to such regulations as the Committee may, from time to time, prescribe. Such friend shall not for the ensuing six months be eligible for re-introduction. Any ordinary member shall have the privilege of introducing a friend resident elsewhere than in Hamilton, or within fifty miles therefrom, for a period not exceeding three days, provided the name of such friend shall have been previously subscribed in the Visitor's book.

19. All privileged members whose terms of subscription shall have expired, whether resident in Hamilton or otherwise, shall be considered as retaining their membership if they continue to make use of the Club, and shall be held liable for their subscription half yearly, in advance, as usual.

20. The member introducing a friend or a privileged member shall be answerable for any debt he may incur to the Club or the

21. All members of such other Clubs as the Committee may, from time to time designate, whose usual place of residence shall be distant thirty miles from Hamilton, shall be eligible for election as members of this Club, and on election shall be entitled to all its privileges (except that of voting, having any voice in the management, or holding any interest in the property of the Club) on payment of an annual subscription to be fixed by the Committee, provided such Club or Clubs extend the like privileges to this Club. The ballot to be dispensed with as regards the members of those Clubs extending the like courtesy to the members of this Club, and in such case the introduction by a member of the Club and the sanction of the Committee shall alone be necessary.

22. Any member whose dues are all paid shall be at liberty to withdraw from the Club, on his written application to that effect, sent to the Committee before the annual meeting of the Club.

cause in accordance with the regulations of this Club, shall cease to be a member of the Club, and shall forfeit *ipso facto* all right or claim thereon or in or to its property or funds, except in respect of any debt the Club may owe him for moneys advanced or lent to the Club; and any member who shall be expelled shall forever thereafter be ineligible to be re-admitted a member of the Club.

Management of Club Committee.

24. All affairs of the Club shall be managed by a Committee to consist of nine members, who shall be elected by ballot at the annual general meeting of the Club, and no member shall be so elected as one of the Committee who has not been first proposed by one member and seconded by another member, and such ballot shall be taken after at least nine members have been proposed and seconded, and after that when five minutes shall have elapsed without any name being proposed and seconded. They shall thereafter from their number, elect by ballot a Chairman, and appoint a Secretary and Treasurer (who shall not be a member of the Committee), or one person to hold both offices as they think best; and the said Committee shall have full power to make such regulations for the conduct of the business entrusted to them, and all other matters consistent with these General Rules

The annual financial statement of the year shall distinctly shew the total amount of revenue that should be received from members subscribing for the year, and the net amount of subscriptions paid up, together with the balance due for subscriptions for the year; further, that the amount of subscriptions due be also shewn, and the names of the members by whom they are due.

30. The annual statement shall shew the amount of assets and liabilities of the Club; and the accounts of the Club when presented by the Committee shall be audited by one member (not being a member of the Committee) who shall have been appointed by the Club at the last preceding general meeting of the Club, and the auditor already

elected shall audit the accounts for the current year.

31. The Committee shall have power Extraordinary meetings of members—how called. at all times to convene an Extraordinary Meeting of the Club on giving seven days' notice, to be posted up during that period in the Reading Room, specifying the object of such meeting in the form of a resolution, at which meeting no subject shall be discussed beyond that specified in the notice. Country members to be notified by circular.

32. The Committee, on being requested in Special General Meeting—how called writing by twenty members of the Club, shall call a general meeting, giving a week's notice thereof (such notice to specify the object of the meeting) by posting the same in a conspicuous place in the Reading Room, and notifying the Country members by circular.

33. A quorum of fifteen qualified mem- Quorum. bers shall be necessary to constitute any annual or special meeting of the Club.

34. The Club shall be open every day for Hours when Club open. the reception of members at 8 o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be closed, and the lights extinguished at 1 a. m., except on Saturdays and Sundays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight; and no member shall be



admitted into, or remain in the Club after these hours, on any pretence whatever, unless specially authorized by the Committee.

No member to receive any emolument except Secretary and Treasurer and Auditor.

35. No member shall, on any pretence or in any manner whatsoever, receive any profits, salary or emolument from the funds of the Club, except the Secretary or Treasurer or Auditor, if a member of the Club be appointed to those offices, or either of them; nor shall any member give any money or gratuity to any of the servants of the establishment upon any pretence whatever; it being understood that this rule is not intended to preclude any member of the Club from selling property or goods, or stocks, or other money securities to the Club, or buying any of the same from the Club.

No member to take away anything belonging to the Club.

36. No member shall take away from the Club, upon any pretence whatsoever, any newspaper, pamphlet, book, map, or other article the property of the Institution.

Servants not to be sent on errands.

37. No servant of the Club shall be sent out of the house on any errands on any pretence whatever, unless on Club business by a member of the Committee, or to post letters at stated periods, or to call a cab from the nearest cab-stand.

38. Any cause of complaint that may arise is to be written and signed by the member so complaining, in the Complaint Book established for that purpose, or by letter to the Secretary, which complaint must be specially noticed by the Committee at their next meeting; and any overcharge, inattention, or improper conduct on the part of a servant is to be stated by letter, under the signature of such member, which being put into the Secretary's box, must be laid before the Committee at their next meeting.

39. All members are to pay their bills for every expense they may incur in the Club, before they leave the house

40. No game shall on any account be played for money, except ecarte, whist, cribbage, picquet, euchre, billiards and pool, and such other games as the Committee shall from time to time authorize; nor dice used in the Club Room except at backgammon.

No higher stakes than quarter dollar points shall be played for at whist, nor shall any bet exceed one dollar.

The games of ecarte, whist, cribbage, picquet, euchre, billiards and pool, may be played for limited stakes, the limits to be fixed by the Committee, and the Committee

shall have power to fix a limit to the hours during which cards shall be played in the Club, and to make such regulations in respect thereof as circumstances may hereafter call for. The charges for cards and the use of the billiard tables shall be fixed, from time to time, by the Committee.

Any member deviating from, or committing any breach of the foregoing regulation shall be liable to expulsion, and the mode of proceeding shall be as provided for in Rule 44.

Restrictions  
as to guests  
of members.

41. Any member, at his sole expense, shall have the privilege of introducing a friend or friends to breakfast, lunch or dinner provided the name or names of such friend or friends shall have been previously entered on the Visitors' Book, but no member shall at any time introduce any person, being a resident of the City, to the privileges of the Club except for the purposes in this Rule mentioned, unless by the consent of the Committee.

42. Smoking shall not be permitted in the Reading room, or in the Dining room, except on the occasion of house dinners, and then only after the removal of the cloth.

43. No member is on any account to bring <sup>No. dogs allowed.</sup> a dog into the Club.

44. Any member wilfully infringing the <sup>Penalty for breach of Rules.</sup> Rules and Regulations of the Club, or being guilty of conduct in or out of the Club, which in the opinion of the Committee or of any ten members, who shall certify the same in writing to the Committee, is detrimental to the character or the interests of the Club, or is conduct unbecoming a gentleman, shall be liable to suspension from all privileges of the Club on a vote of a majority of the Committee, subject to an appeal to a meeting of the Club, to be held within fourteen days after notice of such suspension, of which meeting at least seven days' notice must be given, and if such suspension is sustained by a majority of qualified members at the General Meeting so called, or if the member suspended fail to notify the Secretary to call such meeting, he shall be considered to be expelled and forfeit all privileges of the Club, including his entrance fee and his subscription for the current year.

45. Any article of these rules may be <sup>Alteration of Rules.</sup> altered, amended or suspended for any length of time, or any new rule or regulation introduced, by consent of two-thirds of the members present at any meeting specially

convened for that purpose, provided such alteration, amendment, suspension or new rule shall have been specified in the notice summoning such meeting.
