Sarely this whole question of debt law needs revision. There should be a line drawn between solicited credit and unsolicited. If a man obtains credit by fails representations he should be treated as a criminal—which he is; but if orfeitis offered or pressed upon a man and he is unable to pay at maturity, the law, which should protect the weak against the strong, should protect the small debtor, as it does the merchant, by a settlement according to his means. This would only be just, for observe, the creditor is not obliged to sell his goods or reat his house on credit. He is better able to stand a loss than the poor debtor he has chosen to trust.






