Make the Appeal Yourself.

Our Church and Congregation has raised a large amount of money this year. The debt on the Organ is gradually being paid according to agreement. The whole cost will be paid at the expiration of the four years, but the Committee could square all accounts even sooner, if every one would help in the good work. The Committee on Repairs have met with a very gratifying response from the people, but they have now come to a hard place. Bills to the amount of \$395 are now due, other bills are not due until next July. It is necessary that the \$395 be paid at once. The Committee look for generous response. The current expense account with all these extras has suffered, though the Financial Secretary was able to report that thus far \$200 more has been raised this year than last. It is quite likely there would have been a surplus instead of a deficit of \$395 had there not been so many extras. It now devolves upon every member of the church and congregation to do an extra part towards bringing the current expense account square at the end of the year. The balance sheet must be right on Dec 31, and the time is short. No part of the work should be neglected. With such a grand financial record for the year, let us exert ourselves to close the year even better.

Convention Fund Report. Three months of Convention year has passed and only forty-five (45) out of 321 members on "Convention Fund" list have responded to the request sent out for regular monthly subscription. The sum received has been very small. It was thought by the Committee that the printed appeal would save trouble in calling on each member. The different Boards distributing our Denominational funds need the money quarterly at least, and our members, who possibly can, should pay monthly, as a few already do. Let each church member pay something each month, and our allotment will easily be made up.
