

## THE SYNOD．

The aunual session of the Synod of the Diocese has taken place during the past mouth．The opening services were in St．George＇s．

Our Church，as usual，was largely represented in the numbor of its members who were menbers of the Synod ：besides Messrs．Murray Boswell，and Chadwick，for our own Parish，Dr．Snelling，Dr．Lett，and Messrs．Cartwright，Cumberlaud，McMurray，and Gosling，were returned for various country Parishes．Our Church was also represented，we believe，on every Syecial Committee，and has one or more of its members on eight out of the ten Standing Committees．
liy a statistical return from the various Parishes of the biocese， presented to the Synow，St．George＇s appears as the largest contributor to the liocesan Funds，excenting the Cathedral．This return is for the year cuding Easter，1881．During the year ending Easter 1882，however，we fcar that a complete return would show that we have failed to keep the first place，for in the amounts mentioned in reports of Committees we compare cufavourably with several other parishes．

A scheme for the distribution of the surplus income from the Toronte cadowment anong the city Parishes was presented to the Synod，and approved．The principle aliopted in making the distribution comsists in arrauging the Churches in four classes－the first，Endowed Churches： seconi，Churches not endowed，but considered as in a yood financial position；fourth，Churches especially in ueed of help，and the third class compriscs all others．Churches in the first and second classes to receive smaller amounts than those in the thind and fourth．The second list cousists of St．George＇s，St．Peter＇s，and St．Paul＇s．The present amuual value of the share of our Parish is calculated at $\$ 880$ ．
No payments can，however，be made at present．as there is a legal difficulty in dealing with the endowment，while the Rectory of St．Jamen＇s is vacant ；and it is not probable that the clergy interested will receive any－ thing from this source for some time to come，as the representatives of St． James＇s intimated pretty plainly their intention to use all means in their power to retain the income，or as much of it as possible，for themselves． And at any rate uothing can be douc without an appenl to the Courta， which will in all prohability have to be followed by an application to the Legislature．
