No. 405.

A By-law to authorize the Treasurer to pay the Salary of the High Constable of the County of York.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the power vested in them by the 23rd Vic., cap. 8, as amended by the 24th Vic., cap. 48, the magistrates of the County of York, in adjourned Sessions assembled, did, on the 26th day of March, 1872, appoint John T. Jones High Constable for the said County, in the place of Wm. Higgins, deceased, accompanied by a recommendation to pay him a certain sum per annum for his services;

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the County of York, that the Treasurer of the County be and he is hereby authorized to pay to the said High Constable the sum of six hundred dollars per annum in equal monthly instalments as the said salary becomes due, said salary to be computed from the first day of January, 1883.

And be it further enacted that By-laws Nos. 221 and 319, be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 428.

A By-law to appoint a County Treasurer.

WHEREAS by the 46th Vic., cap. 18, sec. 252, every Municipal Council shall appoint a Treasurer.

BY-LAWS OF THE COUNTY OF YORK.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows :

1st, That John K. Macdonald, of the City of Toronto, be and is hereby appointed Treasurer of the County of York.

2nd. That before entering upon the duties of his office, he shall give security acceptable to the County Council, to the amount of forty thousand dollars, for the due and faithful performance of said duties, and especially for duly accounting for and paying over all moneys that may come into his hands; the sufficiency of such security shall be examined and reported upon by the Finance Committee at the January Session in each and every year.

3rd. That he be paid at the rate of four teen hundred dollars per annum, in quarterly instalments, in lieu of all fees, percentages, or other profits and emoluments as such Treasurer, and he is hereby authorized to retain the same out of the County funds.

No. 429.

A By-law to Pay the Warden an Annual Salary.

WHEREAS by the Municipal Institutions Act, 46th Vic., cap. 48, sec. 230, County Councils may pay the Warden an annual sum as remuneration for his services.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows :

1st. That the Warden of the County of York be allowed the sum of four hundred dollars per annum, in lieu of payment as member of the Council, Commissioner of County Property, mileage, and all other services rendered by him in connection with the business of the County, said sum to be paid quarterly by the Treasurer.

2nd. That By-laws Nos. 295 and 335, and all other By-laws inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

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No. 563.

A By-law to Reward Persons for Apprehending Parties Guilty of Horse-Stealing.

WHEREAS by cap. 184, sec. 494, R. S. O., 1887, every County Council shall pass a By-law to reward persons for apprehending parties guilty of horse-stealing.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the sum of twenty dollars shall be paid out of the funds of this Municipality, by the County Treasurer, to any person or persons who shall pursue and apprehend, or cause to be apprehended, any person or persons guilty of stealing any horse or mare within this County; such reward to be paid only on the conviction of the thief, on the order of the Judge before whom the conviction is obtained.

2nd. That By-Law No. 438 be and the same is hereby repealed.

No. 570.

A By-Law to define High School Districts, and Repeal all former By-Laws inconsistent therewith.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the Villages of Weston, Markham, Richmond Hill, and Towns of Newmarket and Aurora, be and the same are hereby set apart as five High School Districts, as follows:

District No. 1 to consist of the incorporated Village of Weston.

District No. 2 to consist of the incorporated Village of Markham.

District No. 3 to consist of the incorporated Village of Richmond Hill.

District No. 4 to consist of the incorporated Town of Newmarket.

District No. 5 to consist of the incorporated Town of Aurora.

2nd. And be it further enacted that By-laws Nos. 383, 521 and 537, and all other By-Laws of this Corporation inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 572.

A By-Law to regulate Driving and Riding on Roads and Bridges in the County of York.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of s. s. 14, Sec. 479, of the Municipal Act, County Councils may pass By-laws for regulating the driving and riding of horses and other cattle on highways and public bridges, and for preventing racing, immoderate or dangerous driving or riding thereon;

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. It shall not be lawful for any person to engage in or pursue the practice of immoderate or dangerous driving or racing with horses or other animals, either by riding or driving, running or trotting races on any of the highways in the County.

2nd. In case any person travelling or being upon any highway in the County in charge of a vehicle drawn by one or more horses, or other animals, meet another vehicle drawn as aforesaid, they shall turn out to the right from the centre of the road, allowing the vehicle so met half the road.

3rd. In case any person travelling or being on any highway in charge of a vehicle as aforesaid, or on horseback, be overtaken by any vehicle or horseman travelling at greater speed, the person so overtaken shall turn out to the right and give half the road, and allow the said vehicle or horseman to pass.

4th. In case of one vehicle being met or overtaken by another upon any of the highways in the County, and by reason of the extreme weight of the load on either of the vehicles so meeting, and the driver finds it impracticable to turn out as aforesaid, he or they shall immediately stop, and if required so to do for the safety of the other vehicle, he shall assist the person in charge thereof to pass without damage.

5th. In case any person in charge of a horse or other animal, with or without a vehicle, used as the means of conveyance on any highway as aforesaid, through drunkenness, be unable to ride or drive with safety to other persons travelling on or being on the highway, he or they shall incur the penalties imposed by this By-law.

6th. All persons travelling upon any highway with a sleigh or sled drawn by one or more horses or other animals, shall have at least two bells attached to the horse, harness, or vehicle.

7th. It shall not be lawful for any person to ride or drive any horse or horses or other animal through any body of men assembled on the highways at a faster rate than a walk.

8th. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to ride or drive with one or more horses or other animals on that portion of the public highways set apart and improved for public sidewalks.

9th. If any person contravenes this By-law or any part thereof, and such contravention be truly proved by one creditable witness before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction in the County, the offender or offenders shall incur a penalty of not less than one dollar or more than twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Justice or Justices, together with the costs.

10th. If the penalty and costs are not paid as ordered by the convicting Justice, he shall issue his warrant to levy by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the

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offender or offenders, and the surplus of the sale, if any, after deducting the penalty, costs, and charges of the sale, shall be returned to the owner of the goods on demand.

11th. In default of payment or distress the offender or offenders shall be imprisoned in the Common Gaol for a period of not less than one day nor more than twenty-one days at the discretion of the Justice, unless the fine, costs, and charges of committal, be sooner paid.

12th. When the pecuniary penalty has been levied under this Act, one moiety thereof shall go to the informer or prosecutor, and the other moiety to the Local Corporation, unless the prosecution is brought in the name of the Local Corporation, in which case the whole of the pecuniary penalty shall be paid to the Local Corporation.

13th. And be it further enacted that By-law No. 496, and all other By-laws inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 616.

To fix the fees payable by County Pupils to High School Boards within the County.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of sec. 37 of "The High School Act 1891," County Councils shall fix the rate of Tuition Fees, to be paid by County Pupils attending the respective High Schools within their respective Counties.

And whereas the County Council of York, deem it expedient to pass a By-law, to fix such fees.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York.

That the rate to be paid by County Pupils attending the respective High Schools within the County, shall be the sum of Four Dollars for the First Term, Three Dollars for the Second Term and Three Dollars for the Third Term—payable in advance of each term.

No. 692.

A By-Law to raise by way of Loan the sum of \$25,000 upon the credit of the
Non-Resident Land Fund.

WHEREAS under the provisions of sec. 215 of "The Consolidated Assessment Act 1892," a Municipal County Council may from time to time, by By-law, authorize the Warden to issue under the corporate seal, upon the credit of the Non-resident Land Fund, debentures payable not later than 8 years after the date thereof, and for sums not less than \$100 each, so that the whole of the debentures at any time issued and unpaid do not exceed two-thirds of all arrears then due and accruing upon the the lands in the County together with such other sums as may be in the Treasurer's hands or otherwise invested to the credit of the said fund;

And whereas the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of York have made an application to the Municipal Council of the County of York to issue upon the credit of the Non-Resident Land Fund of the County of York debentures payable not later than eight years after the date thereof to the amount of \$25,000, such debentures to bear interest at the rate of four per centum per annum;

And whereas it is expedient to grant such application;

And whereas it is expedient that the principal and interest of such debentures should be made payable by annual instalments provided by section 342 of "The Consolidated Municipal Act, 1892."

And whereas the amount of the debt which this By-law is intended to create is the sum of \$25,000 and interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned;

And whereas it will require the sums set forth in the schedule to this by-law annexed to be raised annually for the payment of the said debt and interest;

And whereas the amount of the whole ratable property in the County of York according to the last revised assessment roll is \$30,024,174;

And whereas the whole of the Non-Resident Land Fund is upwards of \$40,000.00.

And whereas the existing debenture debt of the County of York is \$11,163.23, of which no part is in arrears for principal or interest;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York as follows:

(1) That it shall be lawful for the Warden of the said Municipal Corporation of the County of York and he is hereby authorized and required to cause any number of debentures of the said Corporation to be made for such sums of money as may be required to carry out the provisions of this by-law in currency, not less than \$100 each, payable at the office of the County Treasurer for the County of York at the City of Toronto, and such debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the said Corporation and be signed by the Warden and the Treasurer of the said Municipal Corporation of the County of York.

(2) That the principal money of said debentures shall in the aggregate be the sum of \$25,000 and no more, and the interest thereon shall be at the rate of four per centum per annum, and no more, payable half yearly, and the said principle money shall be made repayable, by annual instalments, on the 15th day of February each year, during the period of eight years from the date at which this By-law takes effect, as set forth in said schedule hitherto annexed, such instalments as that the aggregate amount payable for

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principal and interest in any year shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of said period. Coupons for payment of interest may be attached to such debentures.

(3) That the debentures to be issued hereunder may contain a provision in the following words:

"This debenture or any interest therein shall not, after a certificate of ownership has been endorsed thereon by the Treasurer of this Municipal Corporation, be transferable, except by entry by the Treasurer or his deputy in the Debenture Registry Book of the said Corporation of the County of York."

(4) This By-law shall take effect on, from and after the second day of February, A.D. 1895.

A By-Law to authorize the payment of certain Debenture Money to the Township of York.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows;

(1) That the Treasurer of the County of York is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the Treasurer of the Township of York the proceeds of the sale of the debentures authorized to be issued by By-law No. 692 upon the performance of the conditions set forth in the second clause of this by-law.

(2) The Treasurer of the said County shall not pay over the said money unless and until a certified copy of a by-law of the Corporation of the Township of York, approved of by the County Solicitor, is deposited with the said Treasurer of the County of York, which by-law is to contain a provision that the Treasurer of the said Township shall pay over to the Treasurer of the said County, and until the debentures hereinbefore mentioned are fully paid, all moneys received by the Treasurer of said Township on account of taxes due on non-resident lands in the said Township of York. And that the said Township will pay all expenses connected with and cause in consequence of the passing of said By-laws Nos. 691 and 692.

No. 694 1-2

A By-Law respecting the Non-Resident Land Fund.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

(1) The Treasurer of the County of York is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the Treasurer of all Municipalities within the County the full amount of any moneys in his hands to the credit of such Municipalities on account of taxes for non-resident lands, provided, however, that no such moneys shall, without further instructions, be paid to the Treasurer of the Township of York.

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No. 697 P-2

Respecting County Commissioners.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. The Board of County Commissioners shall consist of the Warden for the time being and two Commissioners to be elected by the Council, and they shall hold office until their successors are appointed.

2nd. The County Commissioners shall have power—

- (1) To take all the steps necessary for the maintenance and repair of all County buildings, except the Industrial Home, and to purchase all supplies required for such purposes.
- (2) To do all things necessary to keep in a proper state of repair all bridges belonging to the County, but this section shall not be construed to give the Board of Commissioners power to build new bridges, except as provided for in sub-section G.
- (3) To examine and pass, if correct, all accounts presented by the Commissioners of the York Roads, provided, however, that the said Board shall not, in any case, have power to order payment of any money in excess of the grant given to the York Roads Commissioners by the Council.
- (4) To instruct the Solicitor and all other officers of the Corporation to take such steps as, in the opinion of the Board, are necessary for the proper performance of the business of the Corporation.
- (5) To settle, if in their opinion settlement is advisable, all claims for damages made against the Corporation either before or after the issue of a writ against the Corporation, provided, however, that in any case where such claim exceeds \$400, said Board shall not settle without the consent of the Council.
- (6) To superintend the printing of the Minutes and By-Laws of the Council of the said Corporation, and to see that the same are properly printed, and set forth properly and truly the business done at the meetings of the said Council.
- (7) To superintend the leasing of Toll Gates on the York Roads, and to advertise for and accept such tenders for the leasing of the said Toll Gates as in their opinion are advisable in the interests of the County.
- (8) To call Special Meetings of the Council when in the opinion of the said Board, such special meetings are expedient or necessary.
- (9) And generally to exercise the powers of the County Council in cases of urgency in which it is necessary, in the opinion of the Board, that haste should be exercised.
- (10) To order payment of such accounts as may be incurred or ordered by them provided however they shall not order payment of any accounts for their own services, or for services of any Committee of this Council.

3rd. No repairs shall be made to any bridges or buildings, or supplies purchased for

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the same, except for the Industrial Home, without the authority of the said Board of Commissioners by resolution passed at a meeting of such Board.

4th. No supplies of any kind, the cost of which exceeds \$100, shall be purchased by the said Board without submitting the same to tender, provided however that such tenders be called for in such manner as to the said Board may seem proper, and it shall not be necessary for the said Board, unless in their opinion proper to do so, to advertise for such tenders.

5th. The meetings of the said Board shall be held at least once in every two months during the time the members thereof hold office, and oftener if in the opinion of the Warden more meetings are necessary, provided however that any two of the members of such Board shall form a quorum thereof, and may transact all business in the same manner as if the three were present.

No. 712.

A By-Law to abandon the York Roads and Transfer the same to the Minor Municipalities of the County of York.

WHEREAS, it has been ascertained that the present system of maintaining the roads, commonly known as the York Roads; is unsatisfactory, and that tolls collected on the said road do not pay for the maintenance thereof;

And whereas it appears that the most equitable way of maintaining the said roads without the levy of tolls, is to give same to those municipalities through or along which the said roads run or border upon;

And whereas sub-section 7, of section 506, of the Municipal Act of 1892, gives powers to the Councils of Counties to pass by-laws for abandoning or otherwise disposing of the whole or any portion of a toll or any other road owned by a County;

And whereas the Council of this Corporation has resolved that the said roads should be handed over to the minor municipalities in the County of York through or along which the said roads run;

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1. That portion of Yonge street extending southerly from the northerly terminus thereof, to the southerly limit of the Township of East Gwillimbury shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of East Gwillimbury, save and except that portion of said Yonge street within the limits of the Village of Holland Landing, which shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Holland Landing;

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2. That portion of said Yonge street lying between the southerly limit of East Gwillumbury and the southerly limit of the Townships of Whitechurch and King shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporations of the Townships of King and Whitechurch, save and except that portion of said Yonge street lying within the limits of the Town of Aurora, which portion shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Aurora.

3. That portion of said Yonge street lying between the southerly limit of Townships of King and Whitechurch and the southerly limit of the Townships of Markham and Vaughan, shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporations of the Townships of Markham and Vaughan, save and except that portion thereof within the limits of the Village of Richmond Hill, which said portion thereof, shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill.

4. That portion of said Yonge street lying within the the Township of York shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of York.

5. That portion of said Yonge street, lying within the limits of the Town of North Toronto, shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Town of North Toronto.

6. That portion of Dundas street, lying within the Township of York, except the portion therefor conveyed to the Town of Toronto Junction, shall hereafter become the property of, and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of York.

7. That portion of Dundas street, lying within the limits of the Township of Etobicoke, shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Etobicoke.

8. That portion of Kingston Road, lying within the limits of the Township of York, shall hereafter become the property of and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of York.

9. That portion of the said Kingston Road, lying within the limits of the Township of Scarborough, shall hereafter become the property of, and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Scarborough, and the County gravel pits, the old Highland Creek bridge, and stone and other road material now belonging to the Corporation of the County of York in the said Township of Scarborough, shall hereafter become the property of and be owned by the Municipal Corporation of the Township of Scarborough.

10. That portion of the said Kingston Road lying within the limits of the Village of East Toronto shall hereafter become the property of, and be owned as a public highway by the Municipal Corporation of the Village of East Toronto.

11. All bridges now existing upon any of the roads hereinbefore mentioned, shall remain the property of, and be maintained by the Municipal Corporation of the County of York in the same manner, and to the same extent as the other County bridges within the said County.

12. The said, the Municipal Corporation of the County of York shall remain liable for, and shall pay the existing debt or overdraft due, in respect of the York Roads Account of the said Corporation, and the minor municipalities aforesaid, shall not be

called upon to pay any portion of the said existing debt, or overdraft, save and except to the extent of their respective proportions of the County rate, necessary to pay such indebtedness or overdraft based upon the equalized assessment of such minor municipalities.

13. This by-law shall not take effect or be in force unless and until the Municipal Corporation of the City of Toronto shall pass a by-law, and execute an agreement with this Corporation, for the abolition of all market fees in the said City of Toronto, except the fees collected at the Cattle Market.

14. This by-law shall not take effect or be in force, until the local municipalities hereinbefore mentioned have assented thereto, or, in the absence of such assent, until the same shall have been approved of by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council.

15. The leases of the toll-gates upon the said roads shall be renewed to such persons as may be approved of by the County Commissioners, for a term not exceeding twelve months from the 30th day of June, 1896, and a clause shall be inserted in all leases of the said toll-gates that the same may be terminated by giving the lessees a written notice, signed by the Warden, of the intentions of this Corporation to terminate the same at the expiration of one month from the day of the service of such notice upon the lessee.

16. Until this by-law shall come into force the said York Roads shall be superintended and managed by the York Roads Commissioners and the County Commissioners as heretofore.

17. No tolls shall, after the termination of the leases referred to in section 13 hereof, be collected by any of the said minor municipalities, or by any person or corporation whomsoever or whatsoever upon the said roads or upon any bridges thereon.

18. The Clerk shall forthwith, after the passing thereof, forward by registered post, to each of the municipalities mentioned herein, a certified copy of this by-law.

To transfer the Toll Houses on the York Roads to the Local Municipalities in which they are situate.

WHEREAS it is expedient to transfer to the Local Municipalities the Toll Houses in which they are situate;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

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- (1) That on and after the thirty-first day of December next, the toll house and toll gate on Dundas Street shall be and become the property of the Township of York.
- (2) The toll houses and gates on the Kingston Road that are within the Township of Scarboro' shall be and become the property of said Township.
- (3) Toll house and gate No. 1, Kingston Road, shall be and become the property of the Township of York.
- (4) Toll house and gate No. 1 and check gate Yonge Street shall become the property of the Township of York.
- (5) Toll house and gate No. 2, Yonge Street, shall become the joint property of the Townships of Markham and Vaughan, and the Village Richmond Hill.
- (6) Toll house and gate No. 3, Yonge Street, shall become the joint property of the Townships of King and Whitechurch, and the Town of Aurora.
- (7) Toll house and gate No. 4 shall become the property of the Township of East Gwillimbury and the Village of Holland Landing.
- (8) The Commissioners of County Property are hereby directed and empowered (if a satisfactory offer is received) to sell and convey the house and lot on Yonge Street within the City of Toronto, now owned by this County, and pay the proceeds into the County Treasury.

To provide for erecting a Toll Gate on the Rouge River.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Act, 1892," County Councils are empowered to pass by-laws for raising money by toll on any bridge to defray the expenses of making or repairing the same ;

Be it therefore enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York :

1. That a toll-gate be established on the bridge over the Rouge river where it intersects the Kingston Road in the Township of Pickering ;

2. That the following be the rates of toll to be collected at such gate, viz.:

- "A" For every vehicle drawn by two horses 15c.
- "B" For " " " " one horse..... 10c.
- "C" For each saddle horse and rider..... 5c.
- "D" For each extra horse with vehicle or rider..... 2c.
- "E" For each ox, cow or other head of cattle..... 2c.
- "F" For each sheep, goat or pig..... 1c.

3. That no person, except those mentioned in Sec. 95 of "The General Road Companies' Act," shall be permitted to pass over such bridge without paying the proper toll therefor.

4. Any person or persons contravening any of the provisions of this by-law, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the provisions of any act that may be in force relating to offences and penalties for contravention of by-laws or rules regarding tolls on roads or bridges.

5. This by-law shall come into force on the first day of October, 1897.

6. All By-laws or parts of by-laws heretofore passed inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

To divide the County into Districts for the purpose of holding Sales of Land in Arrears for Taxes.

WHEREAS by virtue of Sec. 71, of the Municipal Amendment Act, 1897, Councils are empowered to pass by-laws for dividing the County into districts for sale of land in arrears for taxes;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1. That the County be divided into four districts for the purpose of holding sales of lands in arrears for taxes.

2. That the Villages of Weston and East Toronto compose one district and shall hereafter be known as District Number One.

3. That the Townships of Markham and Vaughan and the Villages of Woodbridge, Richmond Hill and Markham Village compose another district and shall hereafter be known as District Number Two.

4. That the Townships of King, Whitchurch, and East Gwillimbury and the Villages of Stouffville and Holland Landing compose another district and shall hereafter be known as District Number Three.

5. That the Townships of North Gwillimbury and Georgina and the Village of Sutton compose another district and shall hereafter be known as District Number Four.

6. That hereafter all sales of lands for arrears of taxes within the several hereinbefore named Districts, shall be held by the County Treasurer within each of such respective Districts at the places hereinafter named.

7. That the sale of such lands shall be held within the said several districts at the following named places :

For District No. 1.—At the City of Toronto.

“ “ 2.—At the Village of Richmond Hill.

“ “ 3.—At the Town of Aurora.

“ “ 4.—At the Village of Sutton.

8. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on the first day of January, 1898.

To define certain duties of the Clerk.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1. That it shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a record of the proceedings of the Council while in session, copy all by-laws in a by-law book to be provided for the purpose, prepare copies of the minutes, reports, by-laws and other matters ready for the printer, keep a record of proceedings of Special and Standing Committees and County Commissioners, and generally to perform, all the ordinary duties of a County Clerk, and such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Council or County Commissioners.

2. He shall keep his office open on all legal working days (except Saturday) from 10 a. m. until 12 o'clock noon, and from 1 p. m. until 4 p. m., and on Saturday from 10 a. m. until 1 p. m. He shall keep a Property Book in which he shall enter all chattels owned by the County, and prepare and have ready for the Equalization Committee the schedule or tabulated statement, commonly known as Schedule Number One, and such portion of Schedule Number Two as may be practicable.

To fix the remuneration of Deputy Returning Officers, etc.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the "County Councils Act, 1890," when no election is being held for Local Municipal Councils, Counties are required to pay the whole expenses of, and incidental to, the election of members of the County Council;

And whereas it is desirable that a uniform rate shall be paid to all officers, etc. throughout the County;

Be it therefore enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

That the following and no other shall be the sums paid for taking the vote, mileage etc., at elections for County Councillors when payable by the County:

Nominating officers, sixteen dollars, which sum shall include all disbursements for proclamation, etc., except hall rent.

Deputy Returning Officers, four dollars, which shall include Poll Clerks (if any

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and five cents per mile for every mile necessarily travelled in going for and returning with the Ballot Boxes.

Constables, one allowed for each Nomination and one for each Polling Booth, one dollar and twenty-five cents for each.

Halls for holding Nominations and for taking Polls, the sum of \$4.00 each.

That no mileage whatever shall be allowed any of the above named officers except Deputy Returning Officers.

That when an election is being held for Local Municipal Councils at same time as election for County Councillors, the County will not pay any sum whatever for Deputy Returning Officers, Poll-Clerks, or Polling Booths.

That Deputy Returning Officers shall make a return of all their expenses (when such expenses are payable by the County) to the County Clerk immediately after the elections are held, by registered letter.

That whenever an election is being held for County Councillors, the Clerk shall furnish each Local Municipal Clerk within the Division or Divisions wherein such elections are to be held, with a sufficient number of this by-law to enable him to supply a copy thereof to every Deputy Returning Officer within his Municipality in such Division.

That the Printing Committee be instructed to have 500 copies of this by-law printed.

That the Clerk be furnished with 50 copies of schedules similar to schedule "A" hereto attached in which he shall enter the proper returns as soon as he can conveniently do so after he receives them.

That By-Law No. 716 be and the same is hereby repealed.

That each Juror attending any session of the High Court, County Court, or General Sessions of the Peace, shall be entitled to receive from the Treasurer of the County of York, in addition to the fees and mileage they are now entitled to receive under the Jurors Act, upon any adjournment of the said Courts for a period of more than one day and for Saturday adjournment, a sum of money equivalent to five cents per mile one way from their homes to the Court House.

This by-law shall come into force forthwith.

A By-Law to appoint a County Solicitor.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a Solicitor, to be paid by a fixed salary, be appointed to perform the legal business of the County,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

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- 1st. That C. C. Robinson be appointed Solicitor for the County.
- 2nd. That the said Solicitor shall have an office in Toronto.
- 3rd. That the said Solicitor shall for and in consideration of the yearly salary hereinafter mentioned perform the following duties :
- (a) He shall at all times, upon the request of the Warden, the County Commissioners, the Chairman of Committees, the Treasurer, or the County Clerk, give his opinion either verbally or in writing as requested, upon any question affecting the interests of the County, and shall give his assistance to any legislation required.
 - (b) He shall act as Solicitor for the County in any litigation or arbitration that may be commenced by the County, or by any corporation or person in any matter in which the County may be interested, whether as a party to said litigation or arbitration or otherwise.
 - (c) The County Commissioners or the County Clerk shall at all times be entitled to ask the advice or assistance of the said Solicitor in any matter which in any way affects the legal rights of the said County.
 - (d) The said Solicitor shall receive as his sole remuneration for the said services the salary hereinafter provided, save and except in the cases hereinafter excepted.
- 4th. The said Solicitor shall act as counsel for the County in all matters of litigation, arbitration, or dispute, without extra assistance unless the said assistance is recommended in writing by the County Commissioners, the Warden, or the Council.
- 5th. The salary of the said Solicitor shall be the sum of eight hundred dollars, payable monthly.
- 6th. The said Solicitor shall, however, be entitled, in addition to the said salary, to receive all legal disbursements for counsel fees, or otherwise, actually paid out by him according to this by-law in the course of legal proceedings affecting the interests of the County.
- 7th. When there has been a suit or action decided in favor of the County, in which by the judgment of the Court the County is entitled to costs, to be paid by the opposing party, the said Solicitor shall, in addition to his said salary, be entitled to whatever amount of said costs are collected from the opposite party, exclusive of disbursements for witness fees and court fees which may have been paid by the County, that the said judgment may award.
- 8th. And that By-Laws Nos. 578, 630, 674, and all other by-laws inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

A By-Law to appoint Officials for the Industrial Home and to provide Payment for the same.

WHEREAS by the provisions of Sec. 524, Chap. 223, R.S.O., 1897, County Councils are authorized to provide by by-law for the appointment and payment of an Inspector, Keeper, Matron, Physician, and other servants, for the superintendence, care, and management of such House of Industry and Refuge.

And whereas it is expedient to pass a by-law to give effect to the above provisions,

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That J. C. Landy be and is hereby appointed Inspector of the House of Industry and Refuge, at a salary of one hundred and twenty-five dollars per annum.

2nd. That the Inspector shall enter into a bond with two or more good and sufficient sureties in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for the due performance of all duties pertaining to his office. The sufficiency of such sureties shall be examined annually by the Finance Committee at the June session and reported to this County Council.

3rd. That James Kavanagh be and is hereby appointed Keeper of said House of Industry and Refuge, at a salary of three hundred dollars per annum, with board and lodgings in the said House at the expense of this Corporation.

4th. That Maria Kavanagh be and is hereby appointed Matron of the said House of Industry and Refuge at a salary of two hundred dollars per annum, with board and lodgings in the said House at the expense of this Corporation.

5th. That J. H. Wesley, of Newmarket, a legally qualified medical practitioner, be and he is hereby appointed Physician to the said Industrial Home;

That he shall receive for his services as such Physician a salary of one hundred and seventy-five dollars per annum.

6th. The above-mentioned officers to hold office during the pleasure of this Council; to be paid quarterly, on the 1st days of the months of April, July, October, and January, in each year, and to be subject to such rules and regulations as may, from time to time, be made by this Council.

7th. That By-Laws Nos. 453, 463, 500, 529, 567, 613, and 756, and all other by-laws of this Council inconsistent with this by-law be and the same are hereby repealed.

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No. 780.

To make Rules and Regulations to govern the Proceedings of Council.

WHEREAS by Sec. 320, Chap. 223, R. S. O., 1897, Councils are given power to make regulations for governing their proceedings;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York, that—

1st. In all the proceedings had or taken in the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York, the following shall be the Rules and Regulations for the order and despatch of business in the Council, and in Committee of the Whole.

2nd. The Warden or Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Council.

3rd. When the Warden or Chairman is called upon to decide a point of order or practice, he shall state the rule or authority applicable to the case, if objection is taken to his ruling, he shall submit it to a vote of the Council in the following words: "Shall the ruling of the chair be sustained?"

4th. The Council shall meet each day at 10 o'clock a. m., unless otherwise ordered by special motion; if there be a quorum present the Warden shall take the chair, and call the members to order, when the Clerk shall call the roll and read the minutes of the preceding day of session, to the end that any mistakes therein may be corrected by the Council.

5th. Should the Warden not be in attendance within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for meeting of Council, the Clerk may call the meeting to order for the purpose of appointing a chairman, who shall preside until the arrival of the Warden.

6th. If, at the time appointed for the meeting of the Council, there should be no quorum present, the Warden and Chairman may take the chair, and if, after the lapse of fifteen minutes, there should still be no quorum, he may adjourn the Council; in which case the hour of adjournment, and the names of the members present shall be inserted in the minutes.

7th. When the Council adjourns, the members shall keep their seats until the Warden or Chairman has left the chair.

8th. The minutes of the Council shall consist of a record of the names of all members present or absent at any meeting of the Council, and of all resolutions and proceedings taken in Council.

9th. All reports adopted and by-laws passed by the Council, shall be printed in the appendix to the minutes.

10th. Reports of Committees submitted to the Council and not adopted in their original form may, at the written request of two members of the Committee, be printed in the appendix to the minutes, with the words added, "not adopted."

11th. If the Warden or Chairman desires to leave the chair to take part in the debate, or any other purpose, he shall appoint one of the members of the Council to fill his place until he resumes the chair.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS IN COUNCIL.

12th. Every member desiring to speak, is to rise in his place uncovered, and address himself to the chair.

13th. When two or more members rise to speak, the Warden or Chairman shall call upon the member who rose first in his place, but the other or others may appeal to the Council, if dissatisfied with the Warden's or Chairman's decision, by the question, "Which member was first up?" which shall be decided without debate.

14th. No member shall speak twice to a question, except in explanation of a material part of his speech, in which he may have been misconceived, but then he is not to introduce new matter. A reply is only allowed to a member who has made a substantive motion.

15th. No member shall speak beside the question, nor use offensive language against any member of the Council.

16th. Any member may require the motion or question under discussion to be read at any time of the debate, but not to interrupt a member while speaking.

17th. A member called to order from the chair shall sit down, but may afterwards explain. The Council, if appealed to, shall decide on the case but without debate. If there is no appeal the decision of the chair shall be final.

18th. Every member present in the Council Chamber, when a question is being put, shall vote thereon, unless the Council shall excuse him; and no member coming into the Council Chamber after a question has been put shall be allowed to vote. The Warden or Chairman shall cause notice to be sent to members in committee or ante-rooms when a vote in Council is about to be taken.

19th. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except when a vote is being taken.

20th. When the Warden or Chairman is of the opinion that a motion offered is contrary to the rules or privileges of the Council, he shall rule it out of order, subject to an appeal to the Council, as provided in Rule Three.

21st. When the Warden or Chairman is putting a question, no member shall walk out of or across the chamber, nor when a member is speaking shall any members hold discourse to interrupt him (except to call him to order) nor pass between him and the chair.

22nd. One day's notice shall be given of all motions for the introductions of new matter or for the appointment of any committee; but this rule shall not apply to motions or questions arising out of any matter at that time before the Council.

23rd. All motions shall be in writing, and seconded (except for adjournment, going into Committee of the Whole on By-Laws and Reports, or for receiving reports or petitions) before being read from the chair or debated.

24th. After a motion has been read by the Warden or Chairman, it shall be deemed to be in possession of the Council, but may be withdrawn at any time before decision or amendment with permission of the Council.

25th. A motion for commitment, until it is decided, shall preclude all amendment to the main question.

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26th. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received unless to amend it, or commit it, or to postpone it to a certain day, or for the previous question, or for adjournment, or to lay it on the table.

27th. The previous question, until it is decided, shall preclude all amendment and debate of the main question, and shall be in the following words: "That this question be now put," and if decided in the affirmative, the original question shall be put forthwith, without amendment or debate.

28th. All questions, whether in Council or Committee, shall be put in the order moved (except in filling up blanks, the shortest time and the smallest sum shall be put first), and amendments shall take precedence of original motions, and shall be put in the reverse order made, not more than two amendments to an amendment, shall be received.

29th. Upon a division of the Council, if the yeas and nays are called for by any member before a vote is being taken, the names shall be recorded in the Minutes.

30th. By-laws shall be introduced upon motion for leave (of which one day's notice has been given) specifying the title thereof, except when upon motion to appoint a committee to prepare and bring it in, or upon report of a standing committee.

31st. No by-law shall be committed or amended until it shall have been twice read, after which it shall go to the Committee of the Whole, unless otherwise ordered.

32nd. Amendments made in committee shall be reported to the Council by the Chairman. After report is received and by-law read a third time, it may be subjected to debate and amendment in the Council before the question to pass, sign, and seal shall be decided.

33rd. By-laws shall be read throughout by the Chairman in Committee of the Whole, and considered by clauses leaving the preamble and title last.

34th. No by-law, resolution or question, substantially the same, may be twice considered in the same session.

35th. Every by-law shall receive three several readings, each on different days, previous to its being passed.

36th. When a by-law has been read in Council, the Clerk shall endorse the reading and time on the back therefore.

37th. When a by-law or agreement has passed the Council, it shall be dated, signed by the Warden and Clerk, and have the Corporate Seal attached.

38th. Persons whose property may be affected by any by-law shall have the privilege, either in person or by agent, of appearing before the Committee having charge of the same on their making a request to that effect.

39th. Any municipality in the County requiring a by-law confirmed for closing a road allowance shall petition the Council to that effect and produce evidence satisfactory to the Standing Committee on By-Laws and Legislation that they have passed the by-law in accordance with paragraphs a, b and c of sub-section 1, and sub-section 2, 3, and 4 of sec. 632, Chap. 223, R.S.O., 1897.

40th. All by-laws submitted to the Council by private members shall be referred, after the first reading to the Standing Committee on By-Laws and Legislation to report thereon.

41st. Petitions by the Council shall be treated as reports and shall be presented through a Committee, and be read by the Clerk, after which they go to Committee of the Whole, unless otherwise ordered.

42nd. When the Council is in Committee of the Whole on any By-Law making an appointment, after the Chairman has received nominations to fill the blank or blanks in the By-Law, the vote shall be taken by ballot (unless otherwise ordered) in the same manner as provided for in the By-Law for Election of Warden.

PETITIONS, ETC., TO THE COUNCIL.

43rd. Petitions and Memorials addressed to the Council, shall be presented by a member in his place, who shall be answerable to the Council that they do not contain improper or impertinent matter, who shall endorse the name of the applicant and the substance of such application, and sign his name thereto, which endorsement only, shall be read by the Clerk, unless a member shall require the reading of the paper, in which case the whole shall be read.

44th. No petition shall be received after the third day of each session, unless it shall arise out of any matter before the Council.

45th. All Petitions, Memorials, Reports, and Communications laid before the Council, shall be read once by the Clerk (or the endorsement thereon), after which they belong to the Council, and if required to be read must be moved for.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE COUNCIL.

46th. In forming a Committee of the Whole, the Warden or Chairman, before leaving the chair, shall appoint a member to preside, who shall have the same authority as the Warden in the chair. If any disturbance should arise, the Warden or presiding officer, shall resume the chair forthwith that order may be restored. Any member may appeal to the Warden against any ruling of the Chairman.

47th. Motions must be in writing and members may speak more than once on the same subject.

48th. A motion to rise and report shall be decided without debate, and a motion to rise, if carried, shall dispose of the question in the negative.

49th. The Chairman shall report the decision of Committee to the Warden or presiding officer.

50th. Rules 22, 30, 31, 35, 40, 41 and 44 may at any time be suspended upon a two-third vote of the members present.

STANDING COMMITTEES.

51st. In the first session of Council in each year, Standing Committees shall be appointed for the following purposes, viz. :-

Finance,

Education,

County Property,

Equalization of Assessment,

By-Laws and Legislation,

Printing and Contingencies,

to whom all documents relating to those subjects shall be severally referred, unless referred to a Special Committee.

52nd. The Warden shall, for purposes of consultation, but not to vote, be, ex-officio, a member of every Standing Committee.

53rd. A majority of members composing a committee shall form a quorum, unless otherwise ordered by Council.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

54th. When any order or orders of the day shall be left undisposed of at any time of an adjournment, either for want of a quorum or otherwise, such order or orders shall be taken up in succession as the first business after the daily routine at the next meeting of the Council.

ROUTINE BUSINESS OF THE COUNCIL.

55th. The daily routine business of the Council shall be as follows:—

1. Calling the Roll.
2. Reading Minutes of the preceding day of Session.
3. Presenting and Reading Communications.
4. Presenting and Reading Petitions.
5. Enquiries.
6. Motions.
7. Presenting Reports by Committees.
8. Giving Notices.
9. Orders of the day.

56th. That By-Laws Nos. 573, 588, and all other By-Laws inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 781.

A By-Law to appoint Inspectors for Public Schools and Examiners for the County of York, to divide the County into two Territorial Districts for purposes of School Inspection, and to fix remuneration of Public School Inspectors, etc.

WHEREAS by the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1897, cap. 292, sec. 82, and subsections thereto, it is the duty of County Councils to appoint one or more persons to be Inspector, or Inspectors of Public Schools in the County and to prescribe and number the territorial limits of each.

And whereas, under and by virtue of the provision of sec. 79 of aforesaid chapter 292, County Councils are empowered to appoint a Board of Examiners for their respective Counties.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows;

1st. That for purposes of inspection of Public schools the County of York be and the same is hereby divided into two territorial districts to be known respectively as the Northern and Southern Districts, and to be bounded as follows, that is to say—The Northern District shall be composed of the Townships of Georgina, North Gwillimbury, East Gwillimbury, Whitechurch, King, and so much of the Township of Vaughan as lies to the north of the side line between lots ten and eleven throughout the respective concessions of that Municipality, also the incorporated towns of Newmarket and Aurora, and the Villages of Holland Landing, Sutton, and Richmond Hill; and the Southern District shall be composed of the Townships of York, Markham, Scarborough, Etobicoke, and so much of the Township of Vaughan as is not included in the Northern District, also the incorporated villages of Markham, Stouffville, Weston, Woodbridge, East Toronto, and the Town of North Toronto.

2nd. Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that A. B. Davidson be and he is hereby appointed Inspector of Public schools for the Northern District; and that David Fotheringham be and he is hereby appointed Inspector of Public schools for the Southern District of the County of York.

3rd. Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that M. H. Thompson and Robert W. Doan be and the same are hereby appointed examiners, who, in connection with the Inspectors of Public schools, shall constitute a Board of Examiners for the County of York.

4th. And be it further enacted that the Inspectors of Public schools aforesaid, during their continuance in office and no longer, shall receive the sum of five dollars per annum for every teacher occupying a separate room, with a separate register, in the schools inspected by them in their respective Districts; also a further sum of fifty dollars to cover travelling expenses, as provided by cap. 292, sec. 82, of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1897, but not to include the sums allowed by law for the performance of their respective duties as examiners of teachers, and examiners for the admission of pupils to the High School; and the Treasurer of this County is hereby authorized and required to pay to said Inspectors the above respective sums in four quarterly instalments, upon the certificates of said Inspectors that they have faithfully performed their said duties.

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5th. Be it further enacted that all school returns by Trustees of Public schools in that portion of the Township of Vaughan situate or lying in the Southern District of this County, as provided in the first section of this by-law, made to the Inspector of the Southern District, shall be handed over to the Inspector of the Northern District, who shall make all returns of Public schools required by law for the Township of Vaughan to the Education Department.

6th. Be it further enacted that By-Laws Nos. 500, 503, 682, 653, 656, and all other by-laws inconsistent with this by-law, be and the same are hereby repealed.

That the County Commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to lease from time to time all such rooms or offices in the Court House as to them may seem expedient upon such terms as they may deem proper, and they are hereby further empowered to take all necessary steps for collections of such rents.

And that By-Law No. 229 be and the same is hereby repealed.

No. 784.

To Make Rules and Regulations Governing the York County Industrial Home.

WHEREAS, by the provisions of Sec. 521, 1907, of Chap. 223, R.S.O., 1897, County Councils are authorized to make rules for the management of House of Industry and Refuge.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York :

That from and after the passing of this by-law the York Industrial Home shall be governed and managed in accordance with the following rules and regulations :

ADMISSION OF INMATES.

1st. Any member or members of the County Council of the County of York may, under their hands, commit to the "York Industrial Home" all bona fide residents of the County of at least two years' standing, who are poor and indigent and incapable of supporting themselves, and who are not idiots or dangerously insane; to be therein employed and governed according to the rules and regulations herein provided.

2nd. Such commitment may be in the form of Schedule "A" to this By-Law or like effect.

3rd. Persons so committed shall forfeit all right to return to the Home again, if they refuse to obey the reasonable demands of the keeper or matron as to their employment or government, or absent themselves for twenty-four hours, without the consent of the keeper.

4th. The expenses of sending inmates to the home shall be paid by the County, at the rate of fifteen cents per mile one way, when only one person committed; when more than one person is committed at same commitment, ten cents per mile shall be paid for the second person, and five cents per mile for each additional person more than two, unless the second or additional person be a child under two years of age, in which case no mileage shall be allowed for conveying it to the Home. Such payments to be made by the keeper on the order of the person issuing the commitment, who shall certify to the number of miles necessary to be travelled, and shall endorse on the commitment the amount the conveyer is entitled to receive, mileage to be counted the nearest way to the Home.

BOARDS OF COMMISSIONERS.

5th. That this Council shall annually, at its first session in January, select by ballot two members of the Council (the first to be chosen Chairman), to constitute a Board of Management of the said Industrial Home and Farm, to be known as "Industrial Home Commissioners," whose duty it shall be to meet at the Farm within three days after the close of each month for the purpose of examining and passing accounts in connection with the Home for the previous month, and to order payment of the same in due course; and the Chairman shall send or cause to be sent a statement of the amount required to pay the same, together with a further sum, not to exceed fifty dollars, as in the opinion of the Board of Commissioners may be required for incidental payments, to the County Treasurer, who, on order of the Warden, shall deposit to the credit of the Inspector, in a bank in Newmarket, to be named by the Board of Commissioners, the amount so required.

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- (a) All accounts for purchases, for the Home or Farm, shall become payable on the tenth day of the month following that in which the purchases are made and delivered.
- (b) The Board of Commissioners shall exercise a general supervision over and direct all matters in connection with the government and maintenance of the Home and Farm and the keeping of accounts, books, and registers hereafter provided for.
- (c) The Board of Commissioners shall, in a book provided for that purpose, keep a full and complete account of all expenditure in connection with the Home and Farm as per schedule "E," or to like effect, of this by-law; said book to be submitted to the County Council at the January and June meetings.
- (d) It shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to examine into any case in which they consider an inmate has been wrongfully committed, and dismiss such inmate from the Home if they consider it expedient to do so, and report same to Council.
- (e) That the Board of Commissioners shall purchase all supplies and material by tender, or otherwise as they may deem best for the interest of this County.

6th. That the Board of Commissioners shall investigate all charges and complaints made against any official of the Home, and they shall have the power to suspend when the evidence in their opinion is sufficient, and report to this Council at the following meeting.

OFFICERS' DUTIES.

7th. It shall be the duty of the Inspector to visit the Home at least once in two weeks to see that the rules and regulations herein provided are duly enforced, and to hear any complaints that may be made by the inmates or others in reference to its management, and to report the same to the Commissioners. He shall also act as Secretary to such Board.

8th. He shall, subject to the direction of the County Council, or Board of Commissioners, procure all necessary help for the Home and Farm; also all raw materials for manufacture, and such tools and implements as may be required for the full employment of such of the inmates as are able to work.

9th. He shall also, in books to be provided at the expense of this Corporation, keep the following registers and accounts, that is to say:

- (a) A burial register, in the form of Schedule "C" to this By-Law, and report the same to Council annually.
- (b) A register of children bound out to service, in the form of Schedule "B" to this By-Law.
- (c) A cash book, in which he shall enter all items of receipts and expenditure, at least once in two weeks, and balance the same at the close of each month.
- (d) A ledger to the accounts, in which he shall post from time to time the transactions shown in the cash book.

10th. He shall, at the time set forth in this by-law, and as directed by the Board of Commissioners, pay the accounts duly passed and ordered to be paid by the said Board of Commissioners, and shall, as soon as may be, and not later than the fifteenth day of each month, transmit to the County Treasurer, a transcript or copy of the entries in the cash book for the preceding month, attested by the said Board of Commissioners, together with the vouchers, which he shall take in duplicate.

11th. In addition to the foregoing it shall be the duty of the Inspector to make a yearly report to the County Council for the year ending the 31st of December in each year, and at such other time as he may be directed by resolution of this Council, in the form of Schedule "F" to this by-law, together with any other matter he may think of sufficient importance to bring under the notice of the Council.

12th. He shall also, on or before the 31st day of December in each year, check the inventory of personal property belonging to the institution, and value the amount of the produce on hand, and report the same to the County Council at the time of his annual report.

DUTIES OF THE KEEPER.

13th. It shall be the duty of the Keeper, and he is hereby authorized and required to receive into the said House of Industry and Refuge, for their maintenance and support, such persons only as are legally committed under the provisions of this by-law. It shall also be his duty to undertake the general superintendence of the House of Industry and Refuge and the Industrial Farm attached thereto, and, when not otherwise engaged, devote his time cultivating and tilling said farm, sowing and harvesting the crops, or at other manual labor according to the requirements of the several seasons of the year, and in order to work said farm in a skilful and husbandlike manner he shall give all his attention and time to the benefit of the institution, and shall carry into effect all the rules and regulations from time to time adopted by the County Council for the government for the management of said House; he shall also provide, under the direction of the Commissioners, all the provisions required for the House, and shall see that the provisions furnished to the inmates are of good quality, and sufficient in quantity, and that no waste thereof be permitted: he shall not permit the use of intoxicating drinks by any of the inmates.

14th. He shall dispose of all surplus products, keep regular accounts in writing, of materials, provisions, fuel, clothing and other necessaries, provided for the use of the institution, and of such expenses and charges attending the maintenance and support of the poor as shall be paid by the Board of Commissioners, and of all moneys received by him from sale of the products of their labor or otherwise, for which purpose the following books are placed in his charge:

- (a) A blotter book, in which he shall enter a full memorandum of all purchases and sales made by him or the Commissioners, and from which the Inspector may be able to make the proper entries in the cash book.
- (b) A petty cash book, in which he shall enter all his receipts and payments as they occur, and shall balance the same at the close of each month; also for the Inspector's use.
- (c) A book in which he shall enter particulars of the produce of the farm.
- (d) He shall see that in all cases of purchases for the Home or Farm, so far as made by him, that an invoice is obtained, and that in case of sales, an

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- (c) He shall keep a wearing apparel book and therein keep a correct and particular account of each and every article issued to the inmates, and shall keep a complete inventory of all personal property in and about the place, and assist the Inspector in making any valuation required.
- (f) He shall also keep a visitor's book, in which parties visiting the Institution may enter their names with any remarks or comment they may see fit to make.
- (g) In the event of the death of any inmate of the Home, the Keeper shall notify by wire or telephone the reeve of the municipality and County Councillors of the Division from which such inmate was committed, and also the nearest known relative of said death, so that friends and relatives of the deceased may be notified of the same, that unless instructions are received as to the disposition of the body within twenty-four hours after such notice has been sent, the Keeper will dispose of it as directed by statute.
- (h) In the case of the death of any person committed to the Industrial Home and a demand has been made by a bona fide friend or relative of the person so dying, previous to his or her death, the body shall not be handed over to the Inspector of Anatomy; but shall be decently interred by such friend or relative, or by the Keeper of such Home, upon a deposit being made of the sum of five dollars at the time of the aforesaid demand.
- (i) It shall be the duty of the Keeper to order all goods, groceries, etc., from the contractor by telephone, and not to be absent from the Home without permission from the Commissioners or Inspector.
- (j) He shall also keep a register of the names of all paupers, vagrants, etc., admitted to the Home, in the form of schedule "D" to this by-law.

15th. He shall also examine all paupers on their admission to the House; note such facts in regard to them as are important to be preserved; shall cause them to be thoroughly cleansed and suitably located, having reference to their age, sex, and general character; shall be especially careful that the infirm inmates and children are treated with considerate care and kindness and shall see that proper attention is given to the sick.

16th. He shall also see that every department, and all furniture and utensils, are kept neat and clean and in order, and that all provisions, fuel, and every other article consumed in and about the premises are used with the strictest economy.

17th. He, or his assistants detailed for the purpose, shall also visit each and every occupied room after the ringing of the retiring bell, and see that the inmates have all retired (excepting those on duty), and shall see that all the fires are made secure and safe, and that all lights are extinguished, save and except only where lights are permitted to be kept.

18th. He may also, for violation of any of the rules, for disobedience or bad conduct by any one of the inmates, inflict suitable punishment at his discretion, (but employ no improper means), by confinement or otherwise, but, in cases of solitary confinement,

not for a longer period than twenty-four hours, unless by the direction of the Inspector.

DUTIES OF THE MATRON.

19th. It shall be the duty of the Matron to take charge of, and generally direct all indoor operations; to see that all female inmates are provided for according to their respective wants; and that cleanliness and order be observed both in their persons and apartments.

20th. It shall also be her duty to exercise due care over such of the County's property as may be committed to her charge; see that the same be not lost or embezzled, direct the detailing of the women under her charge to such branches of industry as in her judgment they are best fitted to perform.

21st. She shall also, at proper and seasonable times, have all the clothing of the inmates and all bedclothes changed and replaced.

DUTIES OF THE PHYSICIAN.

22nd. It shall be the duty of the Physician to undertake the sanitary supervision of said Home; and to attend all cases of sickness that may occur, and, with the consent of the Commissioners, to cause to be removed to the Haven, or some suitable lying-in hospital, at the expense of the County, all such pregnant females as he may deem advisable.

23rd. He shall also, in a book furnished for that purpose, note all cases of treatment by him; in case of death to certify therein the cause, and shall also record in such book the births that occur in said Home, and shall prepare the necessary registration certificate in each case.

24th. He shall also, when called upon by the Keeper, examine any of the inmates feigning illness or otherwise, as to their ability to work, and shall visit the Home at least once in each week, and report to this Council at the June session in each year the number of deaths, all cases of illness, cause of illness, the disease in each case, the number of visits made in each case.

RULES FOR THE INMATES.

25th. The following shall be and are hereby adopted as Rules and Regulations to govern the inmates:

RULE I.—At the ringing of the morning bell, every inmate in the Home (the sick excepted), must rise, dress, wash, and be in readiness to proceed to the duties of the day.

RULE II.—The bell shall ring ten minutes before each meal, when all shall get in readiness to repair to the dining-room, and take such seats at the table as are assigned to them, when they shall observe decency and order.

RULE III.—No inmate shall be allowed to loiter about the kitchen, nor shall any provisions (except at regular meals) be carried to any part of the House without the consent of the Keeper or Matron.

RULE IV.—The evening bell shall be rung at nine o'clock, when the inmates

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shall secure the fires, put out the lights, and retire to bed in their respective apartments.

RULE V.—No inmate shall be allowed to trade or exchange clothing, or any other article in their possession, nor beg of those visiting the Home.

RULE VI.—Every person committed to the Home, capable of so doing, shall, during such hours and times (consistent with health and ability), perform such manual or other labor as may respectively be allotted to them by the Keeper or Matron.

RULE VII.—Any inmate guilty of drunkenness, disobedience, immorality, obscenity, disorderly conduct, profane or indecorous language, theft or waste, or who shall absent himself or herself from the premises without the permission of the Keeper, or who shall be guilty of injuring or defacing any part of the House or furniture therein, or who shall commit waste of any kind, shall be punished as the case may seem to demand.

RULE VIII.—In all cases of solitary confinement, the prisoner shall be debarred from seeing or conversing with any person, except the Inspector, the Keeper, or the person employed to supply their wants; and the food of such prisoners shall consist solely of bread and water, unless otherwise ordered by the Inspector or Physician.

RULE IX.—Any inmate who shall have communication, either directly or indirectly, with any one thus confined, without permission, shall be subject to punishment by a like confinement.

RULE X.—No inmate shall go beyond the limits of the Industrial Farm, unless by the permission of the Keeper, nor remain out beyond the time specified by the Keeper.

RULE XI.—The Sabbath Day shall be strictly observed, and no irreligious diversion, or unnecessary labor, be indulged in. At the ringing of the bell for the purpose of assembling for religious instruction and worship, every person (unless excused by the Keeper) shall appear, dressed in clean apparel, in the instruction room, and shall behave with decency and sobriety. No noise or disturbance shall be made in any part of the House during such exercises.

RULE XII.—Every inmate, previous to admission to the House, shall be subjected to examination and search by the Keeper, or one of his assistants.

RULE XIII.—No visitor shall have admission to the House on the Sabbath, without permission of the Keeper upon good cause shown, or to attend religious worship.

RULE XIV.—All persons aggrieved may prefer their complaints to the Inspector when he is visiting the House, or to a member of the County Council.

20th. Persons admitted to the House, being the possessors of money, shall deliver over said moneys to the Inspector, and by him placed to the credit of the funds of the Home; and should such person so admitted possess a life interest in any real estate, it shall be incumbent upon them to make such assignment thereof as will enable the County to utilize the annual value thereof for the benefit of the County; provided further that in case said person so admitted deliver to the Keeper or other employes of the Home, any article of value other than money, it shall be their duty to hand over

the same to the Inspector, who shall keep a proper inventory of the same in a book to be provided by the County for that purpose; and in case of the death of said inmate, on the order of the Commissioners, said Inspector shall deliver such articles of value to the relatives or other parties entitled to receive the same, or to whom said articles may be bestowed by deceased; but when not so delivered may be disposed of by order of the Council, on the recommendation of the Commissioners.

27th. Be it further enacted that By-Laws Nos, 451, 500, 547, 567, 620, 630, 733, 750, 700 and 771, be and the same are hereby repealed.

To provide for the Election of Warden.

WHEREAS by Sec. 201 of Chap. 223 of R.S.O., 1903, every County Council is directed at its first meeting to elect a Warden,

And whereas it is desirable to provide a method of selecting a Warden :

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York :

1st. At the first meeting of the Council in each year immediately after the County Clerk or Chairman has taken the chair, as provided for by the Municipal Act, and when a majority of the members of the County Council are present, nominations shall be received by such Clerk or Chairman for the position of Warden for the then current year, fifteen minutes being allowed for nominations.

2nd. Five minutes shall be allowed each candidate, mover, and seconder, to address the Council.

3rd. Any member nominated may retire before an Election.

4th. The vote shall be by ballott, and shall be taken by writing the name of the candidate proposed, for whom the member intends to vote upon the ballot paper.

5th. Any candidate proposed receiving a number of votes equal to a majority of the members present, shall be declared elected.

6th. Should none of the candidates proposed receive a majority of the votes of the members present, after five votes have been taken, proceedings shall commence "de-nova" and thereafter the name of the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes cast at each balloting shall be dropped and balloting shall continue until an election shall have been made.

7th. Where the number of votes cast for a Warden is even, and no election can be had during the first day of meeting, if no choice is made after two ballots have been taken on the second day, the senior member representing the Division having the largest equalized assessment shall have two votes.

8th. By-Law No. 676, and all other by-laws inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

To provide for the Payment of County Councillors attending the County Council or Committees of the same.

WHEREAS by Chap. 223, Sec. 533, Sub-Sec. 1, R. S. O., County Councils may pass By-Laws for paying the members for attendance in Council or on Committees;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the members of the County Council shall be paid the sum of three dollars per day for each day's attendance at the session thereof, and on Committees when Council is not in session; also the sum of five cents per mile necessarily travelled to and from their respective residences to the place of meeting; provided that when an adjournment takes place over one day, each member shall be entitled to an additional allowance of five cents per mile for mileage as aforesaid.

2nd. That the Treasurer of this County on the certificate of the Clerk, be and is hereby authorized and required to pay the indemnity as provided in the first clause of this by-law.

3rd. And that By-Law 500 and all other by-laws inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 789

To provide for Licensing Hawkers, Pedlars, and Petty Chapmen.

WHEREAS by the provisions of the Municipal Act and amendments thereto, County Councils have power to pass by-laws licensing and regulating Hawkers and Pedlars.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1. From and after the passing of this by-law it shall not be lawful for any person to carry on business or act as a hawker or petty chapman, or for any person to go from place to place, or to other men's houses, on foot, or with any animal, bearing or drawing any goods, wares or merchandise for sale, or in, or with any boat, vessel or other craft,

or otherwise, carrying goods, wares or merchandise for sale, (and the word "hawkers" in this section shall include any person who is an agent for anyone not resident within the County of York) to sell or offer for sale tea, dry-goods, watches, plated ware, silver-ware, or jewelry, or to carry or expose samples or patterns of any of such goods, to be afterwards delivered within the County of York, to any person not being a wholesale or retail dealer in such goods, wares or merchandise, unless such Hawker, Petty Chapman, or other person shall have first obtained a license therefor, as hereinafter provided.

2. No such license shall be required for hawking, peddling, or selling from any vehicle or other conveyance, any goods, wares or merchandise to any retail dealer, or for hawking any goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, produce or manufacture of this Province, not being liquors, within the meaning of the law relating to Taverns or Tavern Licenses, if the same are being hawked or peddled by the manufacturer or producer of such goods, wares or merchandise, or by his bona fide servants or employes having written authority in that behalf, and such servant or employe shall produce and exhibit his written authority when required so to do by any Municipal or Peace Officer.

3. This by-law shall not apply to or be in force in any town within the County, not separated from the County for municipal purposes, that passes a by-law under Section 583 of the Municipal Act, while such by-law of such town remains in force.

4. Any person selling, or offering goods for sale, for which a license is required under this by-law, shall, upon demand made by any Municipal or Peace Officer, forthwith exhibit his license to such Municipal or Peace Officer.

5. The sum payable for a license under this by-law shall be as follows, viz.:

To travel on foot with basket	\$ 1 00
" " " push cart.....	8 00
" with one horse vehicle.....	20 00
" " two " 	20 00
To sail or travel with a boat.....	50 00
" " " deck vessel.....	30 00

And each of such licenses shall exist for the period of one year from the date of the issue thereof, and no longer.

6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of the County of York to provide blank forms of licenses, of the several different kinds herein named, and, on the receipt of the amount herein named, he shall issue such license or licenses under the Corporate Seal of this County, and signed by himself and by the Clerk of the County.

7. Any person guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this by-law shall, upon conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a fine of not less than \$1.00 or more than \$40.00, in the discretion of the Justice or Justices convicting, together with the costs of such conviction, and in default of payment of such fine and costs, the same shall be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the person convicted, and if no distress shall be found, out of which such fine and costs can be levied, the Justice or Justices of the Peace convicting may commit the person convicted to the common goal of this County for any time not exceeding thirty days,

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and with or without hard labor, unless such fine and costs, including the costs of the committal, are sooner paid.

8. All fines collected under this by-law shall be paid one-half to the informer and the other to the Treasurer of the Local Municipality, unless the prosecution is brought in the name of the Local Corporation, in which case the whole of the penalty shall be paid to the Local Corporation.

9. By-Law Number 711 of this Corporation, and all other by-laws inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

COUNTY OF YORK.

Report of Commissioners dividing the County into County Council Divisions.

To His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in Council :

We, the undersigned Commissioners appointed by His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, under the provisions of "The County Councils Act, 1896," to divide the County of York into County Council Divisions, report that having heard and duly considered the evidence adduced before us, and having had due regard to the provisions of the said Act, we have divided the said County into nine County Council Divisions for the purposes of the said Act, as follows :

The First County Council Division to consist of the Township of Scarborough, the Village of East Toronto, and all that part of the Municipality of the Township of York lying north of Eglinton Avenue and east of Yonge Street, to be known as Scarborough Division.

The Second County Council Division to consist of the Town of North Toronto, and all that part of the Municipality of the Township of York lying to the south of Eglinton Avenue, to be known as the York Division.

The Third County Council Division to consist of the Township of Etobicoke, the Village of Weston, and all that part of the Municipality of the Township of York lying north of Eglinton Avenue and west of Yonge Street, to be known as Etobicoke Division.

The Fourth County Council Division to consist of the Township of Vaughan and the Villages of Richmond Hill and Woodbridge, to be known as Richmond Centre Division.

The Fifth County Council Division to consist of the Township of Markham and the Village of Markham, to be known as Markham Division.

The Sixth County Council Division to consist of the Township of King, to be known as the King Division.

The Seventh County Council Division to consist of the Township of Whitchurch and the Town of Aurora and Village of Stouffville, to be known as Hartman Division.

The Eighth County Council Division to consist of the Township of East Gwillimbury, the Town of Newmarket and the Village of Holland Landing, to be known as Sharon Division.

The Ninth County Council Division to consist of the Townships of North Gwillimbury and Georgina, and the Village of Sutton, to be known as Simcoe Division.
