BRITISH PARLIAMENT'S TRIBUTE TO KITCHENER

Asquith Moves Resolution to Authorize Erection of National Monument.

"K'S" CAREER REVIEWED

Labor Representative Joins in Eulogy of Britain's Great Soldier.

LONDON, June 21.—In moving a resolution authorizing the erection of a memorial to the late Field Marshal Lord Kitchener out of the public funds, with an inscription expressing admiration of the hero for his illustrious career and gratitude for his services, Premier Asquith in the house of commons today, recalled the recent meeting of Lord Kitchener with members of the house which ended in the field marshal and his most persistent and irreconcilable critics parting on terms of mutual respect. When Lord Kitchener said farewell to him after nearly two years of intercourse thru all the strain and stress of the war, continued the premier, there was no thought of anything more than a temporary parting; no foreshadowing of a separation which neither time nor space could bridge.

Reviewing Lord Kitchener's career, Premier Asquith said he believed was associated inseparably with that of Lord Cromer in one of the greatest achievements of the time—the emancipation and regeneration of Egypt, the premier went on, Lord Kitchener was called to cope with a great imperial emergency in South Africa, where, in due time, he brought hostilities to a close and helped lay the foundation of that great and rapidly consolidating fabric, which has welded alienated races and given the great conflict of today an example of the services which local autonomy could render to imperial strength. In the next stage, he reconstituted and re-organized the armies, native and British, of India, and on being recalled to Egypt he was displaying the same gifts in civil administration that he had shown in his military career when the present war broke out.

KENOVA OIL COMPANY DRILLING NEW FIELDS

Operations Start on Fourteen Thousand Acres Near Clay City, Kentucky.

It is officially reported that the Kenova Oil Company has started drilling operations on its centrally located tract of 14,000 acres in the new oil fields of Kentucky, only a few miles from Clay City. The first well is being put down at a place where a small flow of oil was struck a number of years ago at a depth of fully 500 feet above the main oil bearing sands of the locality. This oil, the experts of the Kenova Company figure, was merely seepage, forced thru approximately 500 feet of shale. The machinery in use at the time the well was drilled would not penetrate deeper. The Kenova management believes that an important producing pool will be encountered at the proper level, or about 750 to 800 feet.

CORTON LIGHTSHIP SUNK.

LONDON, June 21.—The Corton Lightship, situated several miles off the English east coast, has been sunk, with the loss of five members of its crew drowned or killed, says a Central News despatch today from Great Yarmouth.
