REPORT OF KIRK SESSION, 1889.

THE year 1889 has been a prosperous year to the congregation and will be remembered as a new starting point in its history. In October the new church, in process of erection for the past year, was finished, completing the evolution from the old wooden church to the substantial brick edifice which has risen to replace it.

SABBATH SERVICES.

The services on the Lord's day have been well attended, the attendance being greater than that of any former year. The average attendance at the Communion Services was also greater than that of the preceding year.

MISSIONS.

In the month of December, the Session placed a missionary letter in the hands of the members and adherents asking for a contribution to the schemes of the church. To this appeal the amount realized was \$75, being the offerings of about 50 members. Mr. J. Edwards, who has been such a warm friend of missions, gave \$50 to Missions in the North-west, and the Sunday School and Bible Class contributed \$35.96 to Missions.

Y. P. S. C. E.

A remarkable movement known as the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor has of late years made remarkable progress in the christian church. Great good has already been accomplished by this agency, and the christian zeal and devotion of many a young believer has been quickened thereby. We have organized a society in connection with this congregation and already good results have been realized.

LOSSES AND GAINS.

During the year our church has suffered from the loss of several families and individuals whom we esteemed highly for their good works and christian character. We mourn the loss by death of two esteemed members, viz., Mrs. James Wallace and Mrs. Peter Scott, both called home comparatively young and in the midst of useful lives. To those upon whom sore affliction is now lying, and to those who mourn the loss of loved ones the Session tenders their sincere and heartfelt sympathy. On the other hand we have been strengthened by the addition of several new families and adherents, so that we have no reason for discouragement.

Sunday School Association.

During the early part of the year we moved into our new Sunday School room which has been found to be very suitable for carrying on Sunday School work. Our attendance has been up to the average of 1888. The welfare of the school demands more teachers. We need three or four Christian workers willing to give themselves regularly to this work. The Sabbath School gave a contribution of \$83.04 to the Building Fund, also \$35.96 to Missions and paid for all Sunday School papers, etc. The average attendance of the Sunday School, including teachers and officers, was 120; average of bible class 20; total average 150.
