Conn. McLaughlin (Blackville), thought the Almonde should be visited and if the Commissioners were doing wrong they should be brought to book.

The motion was carried and a Committee appointed, viz—Conn. McLaughlin (Blackville), Bamford and Rogers.

BY-LAW RELATIVE TO BOOMS. Conn. Bamford moved that Section I, of the By-Law relating to Booms and Booms, be rescinded.

Conn. R. Adams asked what Conn. Bamford intended to put in its place. Conn. Bamford said the Barabury River Boom was built and owned by the State, and now having accumulated some means they thought it best to purchase it.

Conn. Bamford said that the State Master of the Barabury River Boom hereafter receive 2 cts. for each thousand super, 10 logs and 2 cts. on each ton of timber, securely boomed, and that the Sec. Treas. be instructed to provide a by-law to that effect.
