

They are entirely different from any Corn Sheller heretofore known, and being contracted with great simplicity and durability, are not liable to get out of repair—an important consideration.

The large machine, driven with power, is capable of shelling, in a superior manner, 500 bushels in a day, acting on twelve ears at once. It is only necessary to keep the hopper supplied, but of no consequence, how promiscionalsy the ears are thrown in, as it feeds itself with regularity and precision. Thus one man may casily attend several machines; and in case the corn is deposited in an upper loft, and the skeller on a lower floor, with a feeding trough of proper dimensions, it might run for hours without any attention. The machine is compact, cocapies but small space, and requires but little power.
