Washington, March 23.—President Wilson declared today that in seeking the repeal of the Panama tolls exemption he not only was asking that the nation do that which it was bound in honor to do, but was going the way of the majority in the Democrationarty. He pointed out that when the Panama Canal Act was passed a majority of the Democrats then in the House of Representatives voted against the tolls exemption, and that only by a coalition of a minority of Democrats with a number of Republicans did the measure become law. This announcement was taken in administration circles as the President's answer to the argument that the Baltimore platform made the tolls exemption democratic doctrine. The President is understood to believe that the majority opinion of the Democrats at the House, as last expressed was a result of more deliberate consideration of the question than was possible at the Baltimore convention.

The President is confident that he will have the majority of his party behind him in the House when the repeal comes to a vote.
