

AGN OF INGORPORATION.

Granted under the provisions of the Act 48 Vict., chap. 12 entitled "A. Act to facilitate the formation of Fish and Game Protection Clubs in the Province."

By virtue of an order in Council No. 223 approved by His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, on the 28th day of May 1887, A. L. Light, C. E.; E. B. Garneau, merchant; Henry Ievers, dentist; Veasey Boswell; L. F. Burroughs, advocate; J. D. Gilmour, merchant; Edmund G. Joly and J. L. Bell, advocates, and J. Lacon Weich, accountant, Esquires; all of the City of Quebec, in this Province, and all other persons who are now or who may hereafter become members of the Club incorporated in virtue of the said order in Council, are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic under the name of "QUEBEC FISH AND GAME PROTEC-TION CLUB," and its aim and end is to aid in the enforcement of the laws and regulations for the protection of fish and game in the Province, and for the other objects mentioned in the said Act.

- 1.—This organisation shall be called the "Quebec Fish and Game Protection Club," constituted under and in virtue of 48 Vic., Cap. 12, Quebec.
- 2.—The Club shall be composed of the original members enrolled at the meeting of foundation and of such gentlemen as shall subsequently be elected.

Objects of Club

3.—The objects of the Club shall be the preservation and protection of Fish and Game in the Province of Quebec, and to aid in the enforcement of the Acts of Parliament which are now, or hereafter may be in force, having reference to the same.

Officers

4.—The Officers of the Club shall be an Honorary-President, President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and five other members of the Club who shall together form a Committee to carry out the objects and conduct the general business of the Club, and who shall be elected to office at the Annual General Meeting to take place at the City of Quebec on the second Saturday of May in each year. The Officers and Committee elected at the formation of the Club to wit on the twenty-sixth day of April last past shall hold office for the current fiscal year. All Officers shall retain office until their successors are elected.

Quorum

5.—At the Annual General Meeting or Special General Meetings, ten (10) shall form a quorum, and at all Committee Meetings five (5) shall form a quorum.

6.—The fiscal year shall date from the first day of Fiscal Year May to the thirtieth day of April then following.

7.—All elections shall be by nomination or by Voting ballot as decided upon by the majority of members present at the meeting for such election. The Committee may be voted for collectively.

8.—The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall Annual be called by the Secretary who shall give notice of such meeting by three advertisements both in an English and in a French newspaper published in the City of Quebec, the first of which shall appear one week prior to the day of such meeting, and by mailing to each member a similar notice, at least one week before date of such meeting.

BY-LAWS

1.—Candidates for membership shall be proposed Candidates by a member and seconded by one of the Committee: the approval of the President, Acting-President or Secretary of such nomination shall constitute membership.

2.—After election, members shall only enjoy the Privileges of privileges of such when they have signed the Constitution and By-laws and paid their subscription to the Treasurer. Each member will be required to pay the annual subscription, which shall become due on the first day of May in each year, so long as his

name remains on the list; and he shall have no power to withdraw his name (unless prior to the Annual General Meeting) he shall forward to the Secretary his written request so to do and have paid to the Treasurer all dues and arrears.

Annual Subs- 3.—The annual subscription shall be two dollars (\$2.00) currency.

President's Report 4.—Sec. 1.—At the Annual General Meeting of the Club, the President shall furnish in writing a report of the transactions of the Club during the past year.

Election of Officers Sec. 2.—The Office Bearers and Committee shall be elected to office for the ensuing year.

Sec. 3.—For the purpose of such election, two Scrutineers shall be appointed by the Meeting.

Order of Meeting Sec. 4.—The Meeting will then follow the usual course of business as laid down in article 18 of these By-Laws.

5;—The person receiving the highest number of votes for the respective office balloted for, shall be declared elected, and in the event of a "tie" the President or Chairman shall have a casting vote,—voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

Members in arrears for subscription will be entitled to vote at an election or on any question put to the meeting.

will be testion 7.—The Predident shall preside at all Meetings, President's when it shall be his duty to enforce the By-Laws duties and Constitution, and his privilege to give the casting vote in case of a "tie". He shall have the power to call, or cause the Secretary to call a General, Special, or Committee Meeting when it may seem to him expedient in the interest of the Club to do so.

8.—The Vice-President shall, in the absence of the Vice-Presid-President be vested with all the functions of the Pre-ent's duties sident.

9.—In the absence of both the President and Vice-Chairman's President from any meeting, a member of the Committee may be elected to act as Chairman for the dispatch of business for which the meeting may be convened.

10.—The Secretary shall read the minutes of the Secretary's last meeting which when confirmed, shall be signed duties by himself and the President or Chairman; he shall read all correspondence, and shall write in detail an account of the proceedings of each meeting; he shall keep a record of all correspondence passing through his hands; of all actions of whatsoever nature instituted by, or at the instigation of the Club; he shall from time to time with the concurrence of the President or Vice-President call General, Special or Committee Meetings as may be deemed expedient, and he shall hand to the Treasurer a list of all subscriptions, fines, and confiscations at such

times as the same may become due to the Club, in order that he (the Treasurer) may cause the same to be collected.

Treasurer's duties

11.—The Treasurer shall collect or cause to be collected all money and effects due to the club; and he shall deposit such money (when the same shall amount to the sum of ten dollars) in an Incorporated Bank of this City, in the name of the "Quebec Fish and Game Protection Club", such money to be paid only on cheques signed by the President and Treasurer, and out of the Club's funds discharge all debts incurred, on the order of the President or Committee. He shall keep a statement of receipts and disbursements which shall be open to inspection at any time by the President, Vice-President or Secretary; he shall submit his accounts at the Annual General Meeting, and he shall surrender on demand of the President, all books, papers, vouchers, money and property of the Club in his hands, to his successor.

Committee's duties

12;—The Committee shall meet whenever called upon so to do by the President, Vice-President or Secretary, they shall exercise supervision over, and aid in directing the general management of the Club; they may elect as Honorary Members such gentlemen as they may deem expedient; they shall decide what money shall be expended and for what purposes; they shall authorize the Treasurer to pay any liabilities (such authority to be countersigned by the President or acting President); and they shall

A majority of the Committee who shall vote by ballot, may declare said member suspended, and he shall be in consequence suspended, pending out the decision of the next General Meeting of the Club. Member reins-A majority of said General Meeting shall declare the tested or expelled.

13.—Members shall be bound to aid and support Members duthe protection of Fish and Game in the Province of ties Quebec to the best of their ability and to report (in writing if possible) to the Secretary, President or a member of the Committee any infraction of the Fish and Game laws which may come under their observation, or to their knowledge.

14.—Any five members in good standing shall Special Meehave power to cause the President or Secretary to call a Special Meeting of the members of the Committee, on making a requisition to that effect and stating the object for which the same shall be called.

15.—No discussion of any kind shall take place Discussions without the President's consent: except upon a motion made in writing, duly proposed and seconded.

Addressing the Chair

Any member desirous of speaking shall address the chair and remain standing while so addressing it.

Vacancies

16.—In the event of any vacancy occurring in the number of Officers or Committee-men by death, accepted resignation, suspension, or otherwise, it shall be the duty of the Secretary to report such vacancy and the Committee shall, within two weeks from the date of such report, call a Special Committee Meeting and appoint from among the members of the Club a member or members to fill such vacancy or vacancies.

By-Laws amended 17.—By-Laws may be made, amended, or annulled at a General or Special Meeting of the Club called in the manner provided by article 8 of the Constitution, but in such case a summary of the proposed alterations must be inserted in such notices. The assent of two thirds of those present at such meeting shall be necessary to effect such change.

Order of business 18.—At all meetings, the following order of business shall be observed:

The President, Vice-President or Chairman-elect shall take the chair and call the meeting to order.

The notice calling the meeting shall be read.

The Minutes of last meeting shall be read and put to the vote, and when confirmed, shall be signed by the Chairman and Secretary. all address addressing

HUNTING & FISHING

- CLOSE SEASONS -

HUNTING

(47 VICTORIA, CH. 25) 50 VICTORIA, CH. 16)

- 1. Caribou and deer.... From 1st January to 1st October.
- 2. Moose (male and female)
 at any time, until...... the 1st October 1890.

N. B.—The hunting of moose, caribou or deer with dogs or by means of snares, traps etc., is prohibited

No person (whitemen or Indians) has a right, during one season's hunting, to kill or take alive—unless he has previously obtained a permit from the Commissioner of Crown Lands for that purpose—more than three caribou and four deer.

After the first ten days of the close season, all railways and steamboat companies and public carriers are forbidden to carry the whole or any part (except the skin) of any moose, caribon or deer, without being authorized thereto by the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

From 1st April to 1st November.

4. Hare.....

5. Musk-rat(only in the counties of Maskinongé, Yamaska, Riohelien and Berthier)

8. Birds known as perchers, such as swallows, king-birds, warblers, flycatchers, woodpeckers, whippoor-wills, finches, (song spar-rows, red-birds, indigo birds, etc.,) cow-buntings, titmice, goldfinches, grives,

And at any time of the year, between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, and also to keep exposed during such prohibited hours, lures or decoys etc.

- N. B.—Fine of \$2 to \$100, or imprisonment in default of payment.

No person who is not domicited in the Province of Quebec, nor in that of Ontario can, at any time, hunt in this Province without having previously obtained a license to that effect from the Commissioner of Crown Lands. Such permit is not transferable.

N. B.—Angling by hand, (with hook and line), is the only means permitted to be used for taking fish in the waters of the lakes and rivers under the control of the Government of the Province of Quebec.

No person, who is not domiciled in the Province of Quebec, can, at any time, fish in the lakes or rivers of this Province, not actually under lease, without having previously obtained a permit to that effect from the Commissioner of Crown Lands. Such permit is valuable for a fishing season, and is not transferable.
