Such a reformation in our Constitution when viewed in all its aspects is infinitely more important to the American people and to mankind, than our change from Colonies into independent States, or our adoption of the Federal Constitution. Both were steps toward the birth of a great and free nation. On the contrary, we found it perverted to aid Bonapartism by a war with England, and to extend Slavery by a war on Mexico."
