



SHOWERS OF ROCKS. Thirty Acres Torn Up By Subte

Explosion of Gas.

Coffeyville, Kas., July 25.—Shortly after midnight a series of subterranean explosions occurred at a natural gas well situated a short distance from this city. People were awakened and found the town brightly illuminated and the earth trembling, while showers of rocks could be seen bursting from the gas well. These were hurled high in the air, and, descending, orashed into the cottages in the neighborhood. Daylight brought a dismal sight. For 30 acres around the well the earth was torn np as if by a volcano. Huge boulders lay about, while several holes, many of them 15 to 30 feet deep, showed whence they came. Houses had been shattered, barns tippled over, and masses of earth appeared where before the ground was level. The phenomenon is unaccountable.

Cheese at the Industrial.

A signal evidence of the development of the eese industry is the increased prominence ry exhibits at the Toronto Industria Last season the space provided i Exhibition. Last season the space provided in the Dairy Building proved utterly inadequate for the reception of the numerous exhibits, competition in this department having been stimulated by the liberal special prizes given by the Eastern and Western Dairymen's Associations of Ontario and the Quebec Association. This year the prize list for cheese has been doubled. Heretofore premiums have been awarded for August-made cheese alone, but this season prizes equal in amount are also to be given for June cheese, both colored and white. The Eastern Dairymen's association of Ontario contributes \$50 of the amount. In order to furnish the requisite space open during the entire fair instead of only one week as in the past. All entries must be made by Aug. 11. A great many have already made application, and among the names of intending exhibitors are 19 from Prince Edward Island, forwarded by Mr. T. J. Dillon of the dairying service of that Province.




