DIOCESE OF TORONTO.

The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Toronto having signified bis intention to assemble the Synod of his Diocese on

FORM OF PRAYER TO BE USED BEFORE AND DURING SYNOD MEETING.

Prayer for the Divine Blessing.

A LMIGHTY FATHER, who in the beginning of the Gospel didst cause the Apostles and Elders to meet together under the guidance of Thy Holy Spirit; and hast promised. hrough Thy Son Jesus Christ, to be with Thy Church to the end of the world; Vouchsafe, we pray Thee, to be present with the Synod of this Diocese now about to assemble [or now assembled]; give unto them the spirit of wisdom, patience, love, and of a sound mind; and so direct, sanctify, and govern them, that they may seek truth and peace; and that through them the saving Gospel of Christ may be more effectually preached and ministered; Thy dispersed sheep gathered into the fold, and Thy Holy Church established, strengthened, settled, united, and sanctified; through the merits and intercession of the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son our Lord.—Amen.

A Prayer for Unity.

- 14. Confirmation of By-laws, Resolutions, and Regulations of last Synod, requiring same, as follows:—
- (a) The following amendment to the Constitution of the Synod (See Journal of Synod, 1876, page 109):

That the word "annually," in Art. 6 of the Constitution, be omitted, and that the word "triennially," be substituted therefor; and that the following words be added to said article:—"That the Delegates to the Provincial Synod do hold their office as such for three years, provided they so long continue members of this Synod, and that the number of substitutes be increased to twelve."

(b) The following amendment to the Canon on "Constitution of Vestries for Free Churches" (see page 112, Journal of Synod, 1876):

That on page 277 of the Canous (Constitution of Vestries for Free Churches) after the words "England and Ireland" the following be added: "and to have communicated at said Church at least three times during the preceding twelve months, and to have taken no part in any vestry meeting in any other parish during the year. And no member of such congregation shall be allowed to take part in the business of the vestry meeting unless he shall have complied with these requirements, and the said declaration shall be signed annually at the Easter meeting. And being so formed," &c.

15. Consideration of Motions in the following order, as received and arranged by the Executive Committee:—

THE REV. RURAL DEAN LETT, D.D.: —That the election of Lay Representatives in the several Parishes and Missions be held on the system of rotation.

CLARKSON JONES, Esq.:—That the Executive Committee be authorized to take steps to have passed an Act of the Legislature of the Prevince of Ontario amending the Act relative to the Rectory Lands of this Diocese, and that the same be made in effect similar to Section 4 of an Act entitled, an Act to amend the Synod and Rectory Sales Act of the Diocese of Ontario, passed in the year 1876.

THE REV. VINCENT CLEMENTI, B. A.:—That in the opinion of this Synod the intrusion of a Clergyman into the Parish of another Clergyman for the purpose of holding a religious, or quasi-religious, meeting therein, contrary to the expressed remonstrance of such Clergyman, is subversive of the "order and decency" essential to the satisfactory carrying on of the Church's work, and is calculated to impair the usefulness of the Clergyman in whose Parish such intrusion is effected.

THE REV. JOHN FLETCHER. M.A.:—That a Memorial be presented to the Provincial Synod at its next Session, praying that Canon 12, "For altering the order of the Public Service of the Church in certain cases," be amended by adding to the first clause, "Use of shortened form of Morning and Evening Prayer," the following proviso: Provided, nevertheless, that if a Clergyman has charge of three or more Churches, in each of which Divine Service is performed on a Sunday or one of the before mentioned holidays, he may, with the consent of his Diocesan, use the

shortened form of Evening Prayer in lieu of the order for Evening Prayer prescribed by the Book of Common Prayer, in one of those Churches on such Sunday or holiday.

ALDERMAN BOSWELL:—That the election of Delegates to this Synod shall be for the period of three years, and that the Constitution of the Synod be amended accordingly.

Rev. J. W. R. Beck, M.A,—That the announcement made in the so-called Evangelical Churchman, that a School of Theology is to be opened under the auspices of the Church Association, is to be condemned by every Churchman as destructive to the welfare of the Church in this Diocese, and that this Synod now respectfully requests the Lord Bishop of the Diocese to refuse his countenance to the same and publicly to declare that he will neither ordain nor license any who may be presented from the said Theological School.

THE CHANCELLOR OF THE DIOCESE:—That a more systematic registration of Church property, and the titles of the same, is necessary in the interest of the Church in this Diocese.

PROPOSED

CANON TO ENFORCE CHURCH DISCIPLINE.

Name and Composition of Court, called the Bishop's Court, composed of the Bishop of this Diocese, and four Clerical and four Lay members of the Executive Committee of the Diocese, of whom five shall form a quorum, is hereby constituted and erected.

3. Such Court shall be presided ever by the Bishop of the Diocese, and, in his absence from any cause, by some member of the Court, selected by him. The Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod shall be the Registrar of such Court,

and he shall, as such Registrar, perform such duties as may from time to time be defined by such Court.

Who may be tried.

4. Every Priest and Deacon duly licensed by the Bishop, or holding any charge under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of this Diocese, or receiving any allowance whatever under the authority of the Synod, shall be amenable to such Court, and shall be liable to trial and subject to punishment in the manner hereinafter stated, in respect of any of the offences following, that is to say

For what effences

- (a) Disseminating any doctrine contrary to the Thirty-Nine Articles of Religion and the Book of Common Prayer, whether by preaching, or teaching, or by means of books which inculcate such doctrine.
 - (b) Any criminal, dishonest, immoral, or disorderly conduct, scandal or evil report, shall constitute a sufficient ground for trial.

- (c) Knowingly celebrating marriage between two persons within the degrees of affinity, as set forth in the Book of Common Prayer.
- (d) Contumacy, that is persistence in disrespectful or disobedient conduct towards the Bishop of the Diocese, in matters in which the Bishop is legally and canonically entitled to exact obedience.
- (e) Wilful violation of the Constitution or Canons of this Diocesan or the Provincial Synods.
- (f) Habitual irregularity or neglect in the performance of the offices of the Church; or the introduction of innovations or novelties in the performance of Divine Worship, opposed to the Book of Common Prayer; or to the "subscription required of such as are to be made ministers" by the 36th Canon; knowingly permitting unauthorized persons to officiate in the Church; or habitually absenting himself from Divine Worship.
- (g) Schism, or separating himself from the Communion of the Church.
- (h) Exercising any lay profession or occupation, inconsistent with his sacred calling.
- 5. For the offences set forth in the next preceding what sentences section of this Canon, the following sentences shall be passed. Shall be passed. and punishments imposed upon offending Clergymen, viz:— Admonition, suspension from the exercise of his office; deprivation or removal from his office in the Church, otherwise called deposition; and degradation from the ministry. monition may be either public or private.

6. When the penalty of suspension is inflicted, the sentence shall specify on what terms, or at what time the suspension shall cease. During his suspension, the Clergyman shall not exercise the functions of his ministry in his own congregation or elsewhere, on pain of such further punishment or extension of the term of his suspension as the Bishop may appoint; and during such suspension, the Bishop may appoint another Clergyman to supply the place of the suspended Clergyman. When sentence of suspension is pronounced, the Bishop shall cause such notice of it to be given to the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese as he shall think sufficient.

Sentence of Suspension.

7. When sentence of deprivation or removal from office sentence of Deprivation. is pronounced, the connection between the clergyman so deposed and his congregation shall be ipso facto terminated; and all offices, rents, issues, profits, and emoluments which

he may have held by virtue of such office or ministry from which he has been removed, shall wholly cease and determine.

8. Whenever a Clergyman is so deposed, or is degraded Notice of deposition to be given from the ministry, the Bishop shall, without delay, cause notice of such deposition or degradation to be given to the Clergy of the Diocese, and also to all the Bishops of British America, and to the presiding Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States.

9. In every case in which from the nature of the When accused Clergyman shall offence charged, it shall appear to the Bishop that great be inhibited from performing ser-scandal is likely to arise, from the Clergyman accused continuing to perform the services of the Church while such charge is under investigation, the Bishop shall cause a notice to be served on the accused at the same time with the service of the copy of the charge, or at any time pending the proceeding, inhibiting him from performing any services of the Church during the investigation, or until the Bishop shall withdraw the inhibition.

10. A charge may be preferred against the persons set Who may prefer charges. forth in the 4th Section of this Canon for any of the offences therein mentioned, either by the Bishop of the Diocese, or any layman of the Church, provided that no charge in respect to preaching or teaching, or circulating erroneous doctrines, or the introduction of innovations or novelties in the performance of Divine Worship (other than such as may be brought by the Bishop) shall be entertained against any clergyman, unless the same shall be certified by at least three laymen of the Church, being Communicants of at least one year's standing.

11. Such charge shall be in writing, and, in the case of Charge shall be in writing. the Bishop preferring it, shall be by him transmitted to the accused, and, in case of the presentment being made by another or others, then the charge shall be by him or them transmitted to the Bishop, who shall forthwith transmit a copy of it to the accused.

If the party accused admit the truth of the charge, admitted, the Biadmitted the Bishop and trequest the Bishop to deal with the same in a summary with it in a sum-way, the Bishop shall thereupon adjudge the party to be guilty, and shall award such punishment under this Canon. as in his judgment and discretion he may think adequate to the offence; and shall attach his sentence, and the answer of the party against whom the complaint is made to the memorial, and file the same of record with the Registrar of the Court, who shall forthwith transmit to the complainant and the party charged, a copy of such decision or sentence.

- 13. If the party accused does not admit the charge, but when charge is not admitted, the he, and the person or persons preferring the same, state in bishop may, by writing that they are willing to submit to the direction of consent of the parties, proceed the Bishop touching the matter of the said charge, without to hear the matter in such manner as he shall think fit, and shall pronounce such judgment, and shall issue such monition, if any, as he may think proper and no appeal shall lie from such judgment or monition, provided that such judgment so pronounced by the Bishop shall be considered as finally deciding only the individual case, and not so determining any question as that it may not be again raised by other parties.
- 14. If the charge be not admitted within fourteen days Procedure, when after the same has been transmitted to the accused, the charge is not admitted. Bishop shall forthwith, after the expiration of such fourteen days, transmit to the Registrar of the Court the charge, and denial, if any; and he shall file the same of record, and shall notify the members of the Court of such proceedings, who shall in due course proceed to try the matter in controversy, and to pronounce such judgment, and pass such sentence, and impose such punishment as to the said Court shall, under the circumstances, seem proper.
- 15. Appeal shall be 20. An appeal from every finding, judgment, sentence, or decision of the Court shall lie to the Metropolitan of the Province.

21. Whereas it is desirable that any person in Holy When clergyman must apply for Orders in this Diocese should not leave the same without authority from the Bishop of the Diocese; therefore, when any person in Holy Orders is about to leave the Diocese for the purpose of seeking employment in any other Diocese in communion with the Church of England, he shall communicate the same to the Bishop, and apply for a Bene Discessit, and if the person shall be of good standing the Bishop shall grant the same. No Clerk in Holy Orders in this Diocese shall be absent from his duties for more than one month, unless he obtain leave of absence from the Bishop, who on application may grant such leave, with letters of recommendation. If such Bene Discessit, or leave, or letters of recommendation, shall be refused, the Bishop shall assign his reasons therefor in writing, and deliver the same to the party applying.
