




## Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto and Quebec, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in Canada.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the two meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitude of  $0^\circ$ ,  $90^\circ$ ,  $180^\circ$  and  $270^\circ$  east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i.e. the times when the sun's centre is  $18^\circ$  below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude  $45^\circ$ . When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than  $45^\circ$ .

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of Toronto.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

The times of the Sun's RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction both for Toronto and Quebec.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto and Quebec.

The Moon's MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for Toronto. They are uncorrected for parallax or refraction.

The column SUN ON MERIDIAN gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of Toronto. When in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) that day.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of Toronto. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 9, and in the afternoon the rest of the year, excepting on October 10, when it does not cross the meridian.

The four last columns, although computed for Toronto, will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of preceding upper transit.

From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.






## Star Table.

From the times of the transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of meridian, and of the setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude. To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. Or the setting of a Star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

## Eclipses.

In the year 1863 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

- I.—A partial Eclipse of the Sun, May 17, invisible in Canada.  
 II.—A total Eclipse of the Moon, June 1, partly visible in Canada.  
 III.—An annular Eclipse of the Sun, November 10, invisible in Canada.  
 IV.—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, Nov. 21-25, visible in Canada.

## TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE MOON, June 1.

The end of the total phase will occur before the Moon rises at each of the places named in the following table, which gives the local mean time (p.m.) of the last contacts of the shadow and penumbra. The last contact with the shadow occurs at 108° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the west.

The year 1861, with respect to its temperature, exhibited, as a whole, nothing extraordinary, the mean of the year differing from the average of twenty-two years to the extent of only .01 in excess. The monthly means, moreover, did not differ in a marked degree from the means proper to the several months derived from twenty-two years, the average deviation, without regard to sign, being .24; whilst the average deviation in the whole period of twenty-two years, and referred to the same standard, was .24. If, however, the signs of the deviations be taken into account, it will be seen that the compensations by which the annual mean was maintained, were of the kind that may be styled *unseasonable*, being such as tended to weaken rather than to intensify the distinctive characters of the different parts of the year. Thus, from May to August—comprising the greater part of the year in which the temperature is *above* the yearly mean—the monthly means were relatively *low*; while in February and December, the monthly means were relatively *high*. The depression (.09) in the temperature of May, was never exceeded in any May of former years, and was nearly approached only in 1849 and 1851, when in both cases the cold of May was succeeded by unusual warmth in June and July. The abnormal warmth of April served only to aggravate the evil, by hastening the vegetation that was thrown back by the frosts that followed in May. The bad effects of a generally low summer temperature may perhaps be modified, as regards some plants, by occasional bursts of heat, though they be necessarily balanced by unusually low temperatures at other parts of the season. No such mitigating circumstances occurred in 1861, as the warmest day and the absolutely highest temperature of the year were both below the twenty-two years' average.

The hygrometric condition of the summer was not favourable; the mean relative humidity of May, June and July, being 70 against 74, the twenty-one years' average for these months. But as the temperatures were low, the foregoing numbers do not present so strong a contrast as do the tensions of vapour, which for the same three months were .359 in 1861, and .303 on the average of twenty-one years. The contrast in this respect between 1860 and 1861, was very conspicuous in May, the tension of vapour for this month being more than 41 per cent. greater in 1860 than in 1861.

May and June were 8 per cent. and 16 per cent. less cloudy than is usual in those months; while later in the season, when a bright sun is more in request, clouds were more than 20 per cent. in excess.

The depth of rain, which on the whole year was three inches in defect, was deficient in June and July to the extent of more than an inch and a half. In May, when rain is an hindrance to gardening and agricultural operations, it was rather in excess; while, as before stated, there was a want of that moisture in the air whose presence is favourable to the development of young leaves.

In the following summary, the chief meteorological elements relative to the year 1861, are compared with the average results derived from a series of years, as well as with extreme values that have occurred during the same series:

## THE EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES OF CANADA.

The Educational resources of a country differ essentially from its resources of almost every other kind. Thus, when we speak of the physical or industrial resources of a country—the mines, its fisheries and its timber—we attach a definite meaning to the term. So also of its more important commercial resources, such as rivers, lakes, natural harbors and indigenous products. All these are in themselves real, actual, tangible. They are God's noble gifts of nature to man, scattered in almost every land with bounteous profusion. Even the Military resources of a country are, to a great extent, uncreated by man's skill. Mountain heights, deep valleys, positions of natural strength, navigable rivers, mines of lead, iron and saltpetre, and even climate, present such a variety of military resources, that for a country possessed of them, and not destitute of patriotic zeal, to be overrun or conquered, could

not fail to dim the lustre of its arms, even if it would in itself be a national disgrace. But the Educational resources of a country are purely artificial. They are the result of man's own forethought and care, but when rightly applied to the cultivation of man's no powers and faculties, never fail to obtain the blessing that divine Being who is the great central source of human knowledge.

In this paper we propose to speak of these artificial Educational Resources of Canada under the general head of—I. Educational lands endowments. II. State ements of education, &c. III. Municipal assessments. Local aid to education. V. The number, character value of our Educational Institutions. VI. Library VII. The various supplementary aids to education which are in active operation among us.

Few taking an interest in the chequered mingled feeling come the more noble aspirations of the people of the present heightened, while we learn the disappearance of character in Canada, before ever the establishment of the Upper and Lower Canadian Governments, especially the English Governors, the statesmen of those great and composite which they evinced, designed to embrace us, to the Grand Special, especially his famous motto, "Debt for the foundation of the naval Union," which he endeavored to establish for the permanent Schools and Grammar Schools at Quebec.

As an example of George III., in this words of the despairing Russell, (Interim government, 1797,) and written in the history of Upper Canada.

His Majesty \* expressed his most gratified regard for the sentence of no importance, and to assist the Province in laying the foundations of a religious and a religious press his most gratified wishes of the Legislature in such manner as to afford, by the establishment of districts in the process of the larger and more comprehensive religions and moral sciences."

On receipt of the news, directed the Interim Council, the J. meet, and after the formation of the Executive Council, a portion of the appropriated and reserved of a fund for the despatch. The report, dated the 1st of August, recommended (1) the purchase of 10,000 acres of land in the Island of Montreal, one at Kegosha, (2) the appointment of a teacher for each school, (4) an annual grant of \$10,000 for the erection of its superintendents, to be added to the revenue of the Island. Canada, for the year 1862. On receipt of this despatch, the Hon. Mr. President Russell directed the members of the Upper Canada Executive Council, the Judges and Law Officers of the Crown, to meet, and, after due consultation, to report for the information of the King, "in what manner and to what extent a portion of the waste lands of the Crown might be appropriated and rendered productive towards the foundation of a fund" for the promotion of the objects named in the despatch. The Committee presented an elaborate report, dated the 1st of December, 1798, in which they recommended (1) an appropriation of ten townships, or 10,000 acres of land, (2) the erection of two free Grammar schools, one at Kingston and the other at Newark (Niagara), (3) the appropriation of \$12,000 for the erection each school, (4) sale of lands to raise these funds, (5) an annual grant of \$720 to each school, (6) a grant of \$8,000 for the erection of a University, and \$2,880 per annum for its support. Other minor recommendations were added to the report.

The 550,274 acres of land set apart in pursuance of the Duke of Portland's despatch were afterwards, upon the recommendation of the Executive Government, divided between the Grammar Schools, King's College (now the University of Toronto and University College), and Upper Canada College.

Into the manner in which the splendid endowment which was thus set apart for Grammar and Collegiate education in Upper Canada, was dealt with, it is not our province nor intention to enter; but we will briefly refer to the several divisions of our subject in the following order, viz.:

Our first point of illustration is—

## I.—THE EDUCATIONAL LANDS ENDOWMENT.

The grants of land for religious and educational purposes in Lower Canada were made by the French monarch before the conquest in 1759, and were confirmed by treaty. Those to the community of Jesuits were made as early as 1634. Grants were also made to this Religious Order in the years 1647, 1651, 1652, 1656, 1659, 1682, and the last in 1699. Upon the suppression of that Religious Order, and after the death of the surviving member in Canada in 1799, the lands reverted to the Crown as equitable trustee to the estates for educational purposes. The Jesuit College of Quebec was however retained by the Imperial Government, and converted into a military barracks, to which purpose it is still applied. Various efforts have been made to obtain the transfer to the estates of this "Jesuit Barrack," but as yet without effect. Intimation has however been given by the Imperial Government that the Jesuit Barrack would be surrendered upon the condition of providing another suitable building for barrack purposes. This cannot be done, however, unless at a disproportionate cost to the value of the barracks, and thus the matter rests for the present.

The Parliamentary Grant of a million of acres for Common School purposes in 1859 was chiefly made through the active exertions of the late Hon. Wm. H. Merritt, who at that time was a member of the then existing government. The revenue from the investments arising out of the sale of these lands does not yet equal the parliamentary grant, but it is expected that before many years it will do so, and thus relieve the consolidated revenue of the present annual charge upon it for common schools.

Thus we see that, in addition to the three millions and a half of acres of the public domain set apart permanently for educational purposes in Canada, the annual expenditure of money derived from these lands and other grants on behalf of education and knowledge in the Province, amounts to nearly three millions of dollars. Of these three millions of dollars upwards of two millions are derived from local sources; but of these two millions not one penny is raised by a government tax. Such a thing as a government educational tax is unknown in Canada. Even the amount contributed towards education by the government is chiefly derived from investments arising out of the proceeds of the sale of school and college lands, formerly set apart for these purposes. The balance is paid out of the general provincial revenue.

It is worthy of remark, too, that the imposition of the local rate for school purposes is a voluntary act on the part of the municipal authorities. They are not required by law to raise this rate, and may decline doing so at their pleasure, without suffering any legal penalty. It is true that an apportionment is made from the legislative school grant, on condition that the municipalities raise a sum equal to the amount granted. But this is simply the wise application of the paternal and equitable principle of helping those who help themselves, and involves no compulsion, nor the arbitrary acceptance of the proffered grant. Even in the rural school sections, no rate for the support of the school can be imposed by school trustees without the consent of the assessed freeholders and householders, as expressed at a public meeting called for that purpose.

In Upper Canada, the school and college lands set apart by George III, as already intimated, have for years formed the chief source of revenue for higher education; and in Lower Canada, investments arising out of the proceeds of the sale of the forfeited Jesuit estates and of the Seminary

lands have furnished the principal portion of the means for that part of the Province; while for common school purposes a large portion of the annual parliamentary grant is derived from instalments arising out of the proceeds of the sale of the million of acres of lands set apart in 1860 by act of the Provincial Legislature. The balance of the fund is annually made up, out of the general revenue by a vote of the House of Assembly.

Although the aggregate sum expended on behalf of education from various public sources is comparatively large, yet the burthen of this expenditure is so adjusted or distributed as to press lightly upon the whole community. The income which is set apart from the public domain, chiefly for the education of the sons of the wealthy classes at the Grammar School and University, is contributed equally by rich and poor in proportion to their respective interest as rate-payers in the value of these public lands, so also is the income from the same source set aside for Common School purposes, contributed in similar proportions, chiefly for the benefit of the other or less wealth class. Both are thus alike called upon to contribute towards the support of elementary and higher education not unequally, nor as rich and poor, but as citizens, in exact proportion only to the respective values of the assessed property and to the interest which they have in the public lands as members of the body politic. Thus the burthen of supporting the educational institutions of the country falls justly and equitably as well as proportionably on each class alike. So universally is this obligation felt to rest upon these classes alike, that the objection can stand some years since in Upper Canada against supporting free school in cities, towns, and rural places, on the part of those who only sent their children to be educated at a Private School, the Grammar School or the University has almost entirely ceased to exist. As well might one class object to the support from public sources Grammar Schools and Universities, as for the other object to a similar support being extended to the Common Schools, either directly by the legislature, or indirectly by making a portion of such support a lien upon the landed property of the country. Indeed, so strong a hold has the general system of public instruction now upon the public mind, that for the legislature to omit a grant of education from its annual votes, or for the municipalities to neglect raising the necessary funds for the support of the public schools, would be deemed the omission of an important and positive duty, and would give rise to serious disappointment and dissatisfaction.

This state of feeling is of comparatively recent growth and has arisen chiefly during the last ten years. For in the fluctuations which our earlier educational system underwent, in the matter of grants and the progress of education the public seems to have tacitly acquiesced, or have been indifferent to them. Thus, in 1807, when Grammar Schools were first established in Upper Canada only \$2,200 were granted for their support, while no provision whatever was made for Common or Elementary Schools until 1816—nearly ten years afterwards. In that year \$24,000 were granted for the support of those schools; in the following year, this sum was reduced to \$10,000. Even in 1832, this annual grant had only reached the sum of \$9,000, and that to Grammar Schools \$1,000. In the following year, however, the grant to Common Schools was increased nearly four-fold, while that to Grammar Schools remained about the same. These grants were continued undiminished until the union of the Provinces in 1841.

During the civil troubles which occurred in 1837 Canada seems to have reached the lowest depths in her educational history. But, as brighter days dawned, she rapidly recovered herself, and has since gradually advanced in educational as well as material and political prosperity.

Thus we see that, with a population of two millions and half, the total number of Educational Institutions in Canada of all grades is about 8,130; or one for about every 250 of the population. The number of students and pupils attending these institutions is 547,000; the estimated value of the sites and buildings devoted to the purposes of education reaches the princely sum of \$7,000,000; the value of school furniture, libraries, maps and apparatus, is about 5,000; while the aggregate annual income of these

Educational Institutions amounts to \$2,072,500, or more than the entire revenue of the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick taken together!

These statistics, with those in the preceding part of this article (in many cases approximate—though understated) are most cheering in their character, and present the *Educational Resources of Canada* in a very favourable light. They combine in themselves the evidence of what has been done and is still doing both by the government

They clearly demonstrate that the hearts of the people of the Province are deeply penetrated with the conviction of the national importance of a comprehensive scheme of education, embracing every description of educational institution and combining in its support all classes and creeds in the community.

The sixth point of illustration of our educational resources relates to the number and extent of the

#### VI.—PUBLIC LIBRARIES IN CANADA.

Before inserting the table on this head, it may be interesting to show what has been the extent of the demand for books in Canada for the last twelve years. The facts are highly encouraging, and speak well for the prevalence of an enlightened literary taste and growing intelligence among the various classes of the people.

The following STATISTICAL TABLE, which has been compiled from the Trade and Navigation Returns for the Province, shows the gross value of books (not maps or school apparatus) imported into Canada during the twelve years specified.

Up to 1854, the Trade and Navigation Returns give the value on books entered at every port of Canada separately; after that year, the Reports give the names of the principal ports only, and the rest as Other Ports. In 1854, the proportion entered in Lower Canada was within a fraction of a third part of the whole, and, accordingly, in compiling this table for the years 1855-61, the value entered in Other Ports is divided between Upper and Lower Canada, in the proportion of two-thirds to the former and one-third to the latter.

Our seventh and last point of illustration is—

#### VII.—VARIOUS SUPPLEMENTARY AIDS TO EDUCATION.

It is not easy to form an estimate of the number or extent of these supplementary aids to education among us. They are very numerous and diversified, but are difficult to classify. In a summary sketch like this of our *Educational Resources*, no aid to education should be overlooked, however humble; for each in its place performs an important function, and contributes materially to the progress of education and intelligence among the people.

Among these supplementary aids we may enumerate the following, although we can in many cases scarcely classify them or estimate their number.

1. The Religious, Educational, Literary, Scientific, and Secular Press.
2. Bible and Tract Societies.
3. Religious Meetings and Public Lectures.
4. Historical Societies, Literary and Scientific Institutes.
5. Scientific Observatories and Museums.
6. Professional Schools of Theology, Law and Medicine.
7. Nurseries, Private and Indian Schools.
8. Literary Clubs and Debating Societies.
9. Young Men's Christian Associations.
10. Mercantile Library Associations and Reading Room.
11. Mechanics' Institutes and their Libraries.
12. Agricultural and Horticultural Associations and the Exhibitions.
13. Orphan Asylums and similar Benevolent Institutions.
14. Reformatory Schools and Jail Libraries.

These all perform their duty silently and effectively. Separately they are diverse, both in their character and operations; but combined, they form a mighty supplementary agency in the after-training of an individual. They develop his intellect, call forth his benevolence, cultivate his taste, extend the range of his sympathies, and give additional interest to his daily life. Each one also, having in view a definite object of pursuit or taste or benevolence, gives when combined a concentration of purpose or effort and thus supplies a want which cannot be furnished by ordinary educational training.

What nobler tribute to the spirit and genius of Christianity can be presented in any land than that such a vast supplementary agency, which in itself is chiefly benevolent or gratuitous, is being kept constantly at work through many hands to give living, practical effect, to the teachings of that Christianity in ameliorating the condition of society, and in uplifting the masses who have either passed from the school and the university into the outer world, or who have never enjoyed the advantages of either. To recapitulate, it may be sufficient to say that the *Educational Resources of Canada* consist of—

3,613,000 acres of land set apart for educational purposes \$53,803 annual state endowment of education. 2,327,282 local aid to education.

8,130 educational institutions.

547,000 pupils and students.

\$7,000,000 estimated value of school sites and buildings. \$415,000 estimated value of school furniture maps and apparatus.

\$530,000 worth of books annually imported into the province. 2,876 public libraries, containing— 767,644 volumes of books.

Together with numerous supplementary education agencies to which we have just referred.

Canada, yet in comparative intancy, may well be proud of her *Educational Resources*. They are princely in the character and priceless in their worth. They demonstrate that her inner life is vigorous and active, and that it fulfills in her high destiny as the brightest colonial jewel the crown of her most gracious Majesty the Queen, whose sons must have sadly degenerated from the noble spirit and heroic self-sacrifice of their devoted fathers, the United Empire Loyalists of America, and from those extraordinary men, who, fired with an untiring national zeal, sought amid unparalleled privation and suffering, to extend the dominion of France over this entire continent.

As these resources have yearly accumulated and have come down to us in such rich abundance, let us sacredly guard them and seek to extend their value and usefulness. Taking warning by other nations, let us neither dwarf their growth nor extinguish their light; but through God's blessing let us transmit them undiminished and unimpaired to those who come after us.

## THE ROYAL FAMILY.

HER MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY (ALEXANDRA)—VICTORIA, By the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith. Her Majesty, the only daughter and heir of the late Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III., and of Victoria-Maria-Louisa (Princess Dowager of Leiningen), Duchess of Kent, and sister of the King of the Belgians. Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, on the 24th of May, 1819; baptised on the 24th of June, 1819; ascended the throne on the demise of her uncle, King William IV., 20th June, 1837; and was crowned at Westminster, on the 28th June, 1838. Her Majesty was married at St. James's Palace, on the 10th of February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis-Albert-Augustus-Charles-Emmanuel, Duke of Saxe, Prince of Coburg and Gotha.

*All importations for the use of H.M. Army and Navy serving in Canada, when the duty otherwise payable thereon would be paid or borne by the Treasury of the United Kingdom or of this Province.*

**COURT OF CHANCERY.**—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, account, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery, and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. **Chancellor:**—Hon. **PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.**—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice Court," for hearing matters relating to the adding or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, bearing and determining matters on motion, and making rules and orders in causes and business depending in either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the judges of the said courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single judge out of court. **Clerk:** Wm. **HEIR AND DEVISES COURT.**—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assigns. **Sittings:**—At Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. **Clerk of Commissioners:** W. B. Heward.

**COURT COURTS.**—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount: but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crim. con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery.

**SURROGATE COURTS.**—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the

RECORDERS' COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorders' Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December. Recorders—Geo. Duggan, jun., Toronto; Arch J. McDonald, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—The County Judge in each county presides.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, election, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim. con., seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

#### Terms of the Courts.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the fourth Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd

Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Trinity begins Monday next after 21st August, and ends on the Saturday of the ensuing week; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—Examination Terms—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. Hearing Terms—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. ## LETTER RATES.

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 7 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

On Letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 5 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., with optional prepayment.

The rate on Letters to the United Kingdom, by Canadian Packet,

Not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. .... 12¢ cents.

Exceeding " and not exceeding 1 oz. .... 25 "

" 1 oz. and not " 2 oz. .... 50 "

and so on, increasing two rates of postage for each additional ounce.

And by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., &c.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the U. States,

(except California and Oregon) 10 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

" for California and Oregon ..... 15 "

" to Cuba ..... 20 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

The Postage rate to British Columbia is,

Letters..... 25 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

Newspapers ..... 2 cents each.

## MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: Canadian Packet on every Thursday, and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 6d. stg. per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada, alternately to Boston and New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 8d. stg. per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

## REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America ..... 2 cents.

On Letters for the United States ..... 5 "

On Letters for the United Kingdom ..... 12½ "

On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England ..... 25 "

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via England, an amount equal to the postage rate.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

## MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Province, is 25 cts. per lb. (with 3 cts. additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by Postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage). Price Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The charge on Books, &c., by Book Post to England, is 7 cents on packets not exceeding 4 oz. in weight, 12½ cents on  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. packets, and 12½ cents additional for every additional  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. These charges must be prepaid. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to England at the Book rate of postage.

The Book Post regulations between Canada and England apply to matter between Canada and France.

## NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

For a paper published 6 times a week, 40 cents per quarter.

" 3 " 20 "

" 2 " 13 " "

" 1 " 6½ "

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

## TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

*Transient Newspapers*—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

## NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American can transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

## PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

The rate on Periodical Publications is, if not exceeding 3 ounces in weight, 1 cent; over 3 ounces, 4 cents.

If prepaid by postage stamps from the office of publication, Periodicals published in Canada, weighing over 3 oz., may pass for 2 cents each.

Periodicals, printed in this Province, other than Newspapers, when specially devoted to the Education of Youth (both religious and general), to Agriculture, to Temperance, or to any branch of science, and addressed directly from the office of publication, to be transmitted to any post office in this Province, are exempt from charge.

*Transient Periodicals*—including Canadian Periodicals not prepaid the committed rate from the office of publication—nor exempted by the preceding clause, and all other Periodical publications posted in this Province, must be prepaid by Stamp, the full rate, at the time of posting.

Periodicals received in Mails from the United States are charged with the rates named in the last case of this section.

## MONEY ORDERS.

Money Orders payable in the Province may be obtained at any Money Order Office in the annexed list, at the following rates of commission:

*N.B.*—No half cents to be introduced in the Orders.

No single Order can be issued for more than \$100.

Money Orders, payable at any Money Order Office in Great Britain and Ireland, can be obtained at any Canadian Money Order Office. The Orders are drawn in Sterling, the commission chargeable being: for £2 and under, 25¢; over £2 and up to £5, 50¢; over £5 and up to £7, 75¢; over £7 and up to £10, \$1. No order can be drawn for more than £10, but any number of orders of £10 each may be procured.

## POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided for sale of the respective values of 1 cent for Newspapers; 5 cents for ordinary Provincial Letters; 10 cents for United States rate; 12½ cents for Canadian Packet; and 17 cents for Cunard Packet.

Letter Envelopes are provided, impressed with medallion stamps, and equivalent to the prepayment of postage to the amount of 5 cents and 10 cents respectively.

The 5 cent envelopes will be sold to the public at the rate of \$5 50 per hundred, or 60 cents per dozen. The price of a single envelope is 6 cents.

The 10 cent envelopes will be sold at the rate of \$10 50 per hundred, or \$1 25 per dozen. Single envelopes 11 cts.

## PENAL CLAUSES.

The Act contains the following penal clause:—

To inclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted, for the Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

To inclose a letter or any writing, or to make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers,) shall be a misdemeanor.

The College year commences with the Autumn Term.

The Autumn Term begins September 10; Winter do., Nov. 20; Spring do., Feb. 15; Summer do., May 1. Reports of the progress and conduct of the pupils are sent to parents twice each Term, or oftener if desired. Deducting the Vacation, the Terms are ten weeks each. The Tuition Fee is \$10 for one Pupil, \$9 each for two (Brothers), \$8 each for three (Brothers), \$7 each for four (Brothers); and the Fee for Boarders, inclusive of Tuition, is \$45 per Term. The many improvements made in the arrangement of the College Boarding House have been found to add very materially to the comfort of the boarders. A large paved Hall Court and a Gymnasium, fitted up with the most approved modern appliances, and a spacious play-ground and cricket ground afford ample facilities for out-door exercise and amusement within the College bounds. The Boarding House is conducted strictly as an integral part of the Institution, its disbursements paid out of, and its returns paid into, the general funds. Prizes of books and certificates of honor are given every year to those who distinguish themselves in any of the subjects taught in the College. His Excellency the Governor General offers annually a valuable Prize of Books for the best examinations in the higher departments of the College Curriculum. At the Annual Public Examination in July Exhibitions are compensated for, varying in value from \$120 to \$40 per annum. Competition for them all is open to the Grammar Schools of the whole Province. More than 2,500 of the youth of the Province have received their education, in whole or in part, in Upper Canada College. The First Classical, and the Mathematical Master, were pupils of the institution; as were likewise the greater portion of the Medal-men, Scholars, and Honor-men of our Universities.

THE CANADIAN LITERARY INSTITUTE is located at Woodstock, and is under the control of the Regular Baptist Denomination. It has three different departments, viz.: Primary, Higher and Theological, the average attendance on which consists of fully 100 students. The Primary School is attended by pupils over eleven years of age, who study the various branches of an ordinary English education. In the Higher Department the students are prepared for the study of Theology, or for matriculation in Arts, Law or Medicine. The fees for attendance on these departments vary from \$20 to \$23 per year. In the Theological Department, attended by about 30 students, the tuition is *gratis*. GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.—Each of these Schools (which form the intermediate link between the Common Schools and the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed by the County Council. There is one Grammar School in each County Town, which receives at least \$100 per annum from the government, and where the funds will admit of it, others may be established in different parts of the County. Pupils attending these Schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities. There were 60 Grammar Schools, with 4,768 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1861.

In cities, towns, and villages, the schools are managed by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Municipality. There were 4,010 Common Schools, with 320,918 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1861.

PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the end of Dec. 1861, about 481 Libraries had been established, containing more than 1100 sub-divisions, and 193,220 vols.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connected with the Educational Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian, Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and busts. The Museum is freely open to the public.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds reported by the Educational Department as in operation in Upper Canada during 1861, was 4,450, attended by 344,118 pupils, and expending \$1,670,023 in their support.

The Ladies of the Ursulines have charge of the boarding department of the female pupil-teachers, and attend to part of the Normal School teaching, and the girls' Model School.

**THE BELLEVILLE SEMINARY.**—Incorporated, 1857.—This Institution is the property of the Methodist Episcopal Church, but free to all denominations, no religious creed being taught in it, and students being required to attend such places of worship as their parents or guardians may direct. It is affiliated to the University of Toronto. Ample accommodation is afforded for the instruction of two hundred students. Both sexes are included in the provision: ladies being instructed in the ornamental as well as solid branches, and gentlemen being afforded a commercial, mathematical, and classical education. Ladies may take a thorough course of instruction, prepared expressly for them, and receive degrees and diplomas. The following compose the Faculty and Board of Instruction: Rev. A. Carman, M.A., Principal, and Professor of Mathematics, History and English Literature; Rev. H. P. Shepard, M.A., Professor of the Latin and Greek Languages; II. W. Bennett, B.A., Professor of Natural Science, and Rector of English Department. Miss Julia McKellar, Preceptress, and Teacher of Music, Piano, Melodeon and Guitar and the

French Language; Mrs. A. Carman, Assistant in French and Music; Mrs. H. P. Shepard, Teacher of Drawing and Painting of all kinds. Besides the above, others, not of the Faculty, are employed to teach in the institution. The academic year is divided into two sessions; the first session, which consists of twenty-nine weeks, or two terms, commences on the first Thursday in Sept., and ends about the middle of April following; the second session commences on the first Thursday in May, and continues thirteen weeks.






