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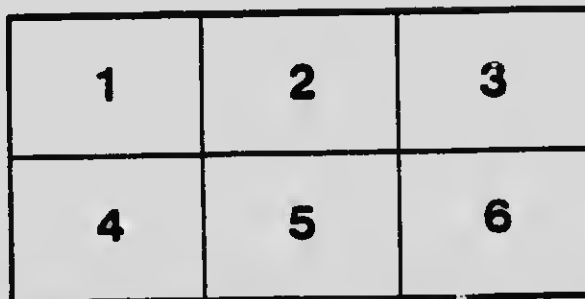
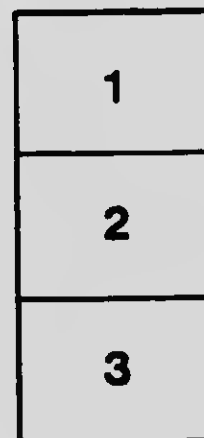
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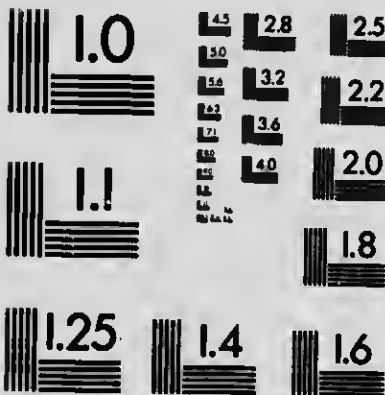

Ottawa, Canada

The City of Ottawa—Capital of the Dominion of Canada—nestles snugly in a veritable forest of heavily foliated soft maple and other trees, on high cliffs, overlooking the Ottawa river, and commands a magnificent view of varied scenery, combining mountain, river and vale, indescribable for beauty and grandeur. The Laurentian chain to the north; to the east, west and south, the Ottawa and Rideau rivers and Rideau canal, to the northeast the Rideau river emptying into the Ottawa river over most beautiful twin falls.

The City of Ottawa is particularly noted for its magnificent architecture. The Parliamentary and other government and public buildings, and a large number of private homes, constructed of splendid native stone and brick, are elaborate and striking in design, as well as in the appointment of beautiful grounds.

OTTAWA is abundantly provided with playgrounds, beautiful parks, picturesque driveways, shady avenues and splendid boulevards. There are 237 acres in playgrounds and park lands in the city limits, and about 2,000 acres natural park lands immediately adjacent to the city.

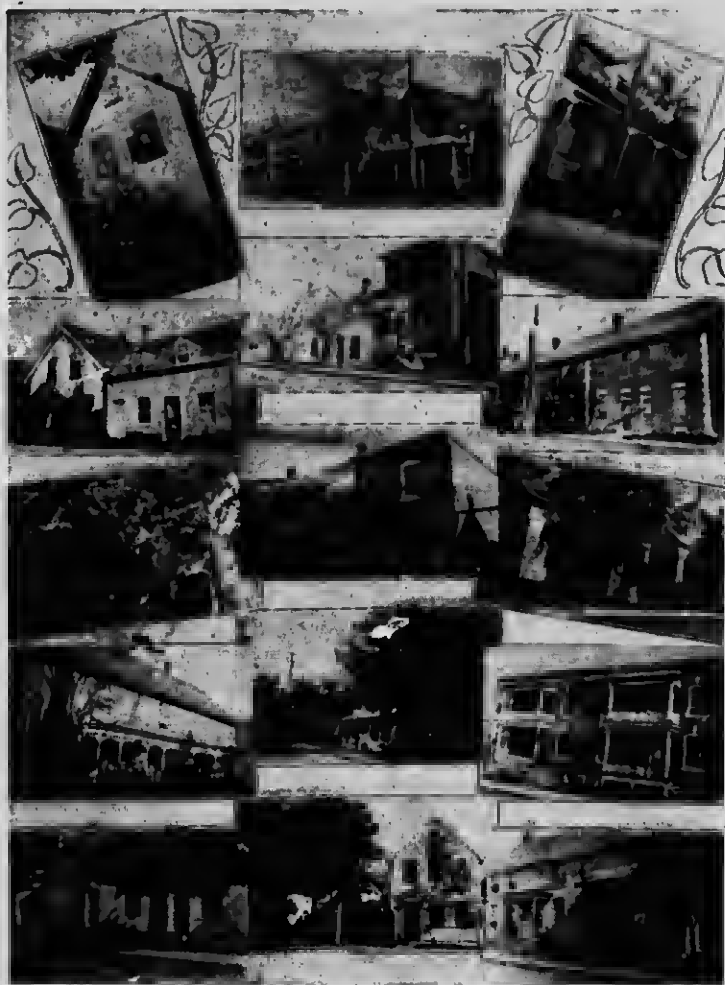




OTTAWA, CANADA.—Class of Homes Renting from \$15. to \$35

Many houses, in good repair, are occupied at a monthly rental of from \$7.00 to \$15.00 per month, including water, while first-class modern houses may be rented throughout the city at \$22.50 to \$35.00 per month.

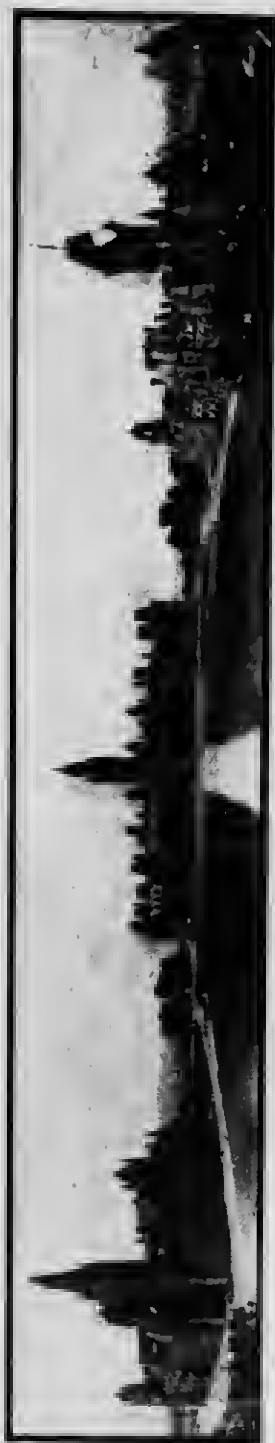


OTTAWA, CANADA.—A Section of the Most Beautiful Driveway in the World.

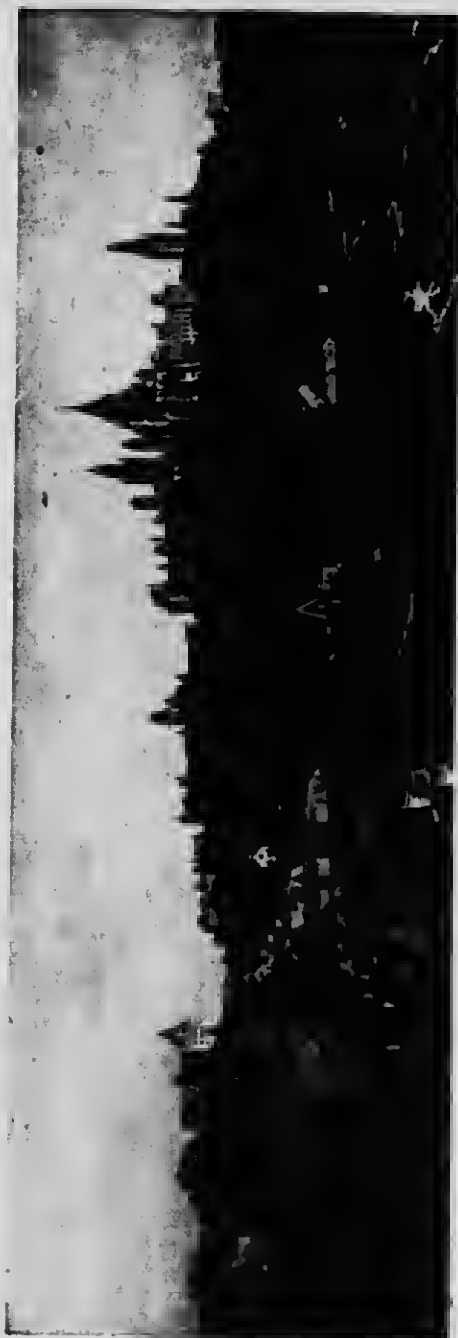

Ottawa holds annually the best Industrial and Agricultural Exhibition, Automobile and Motor Fat Stock, Poultry, and Horse Shows in Canada.

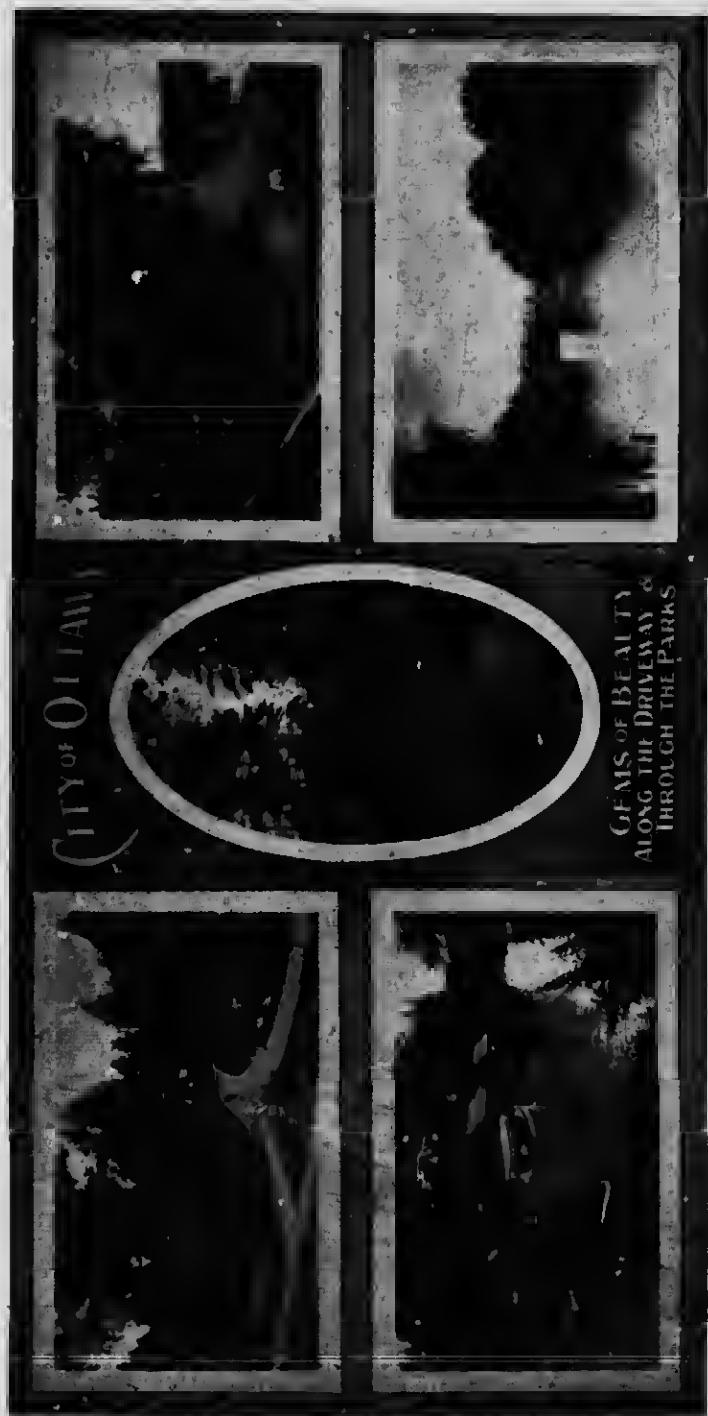

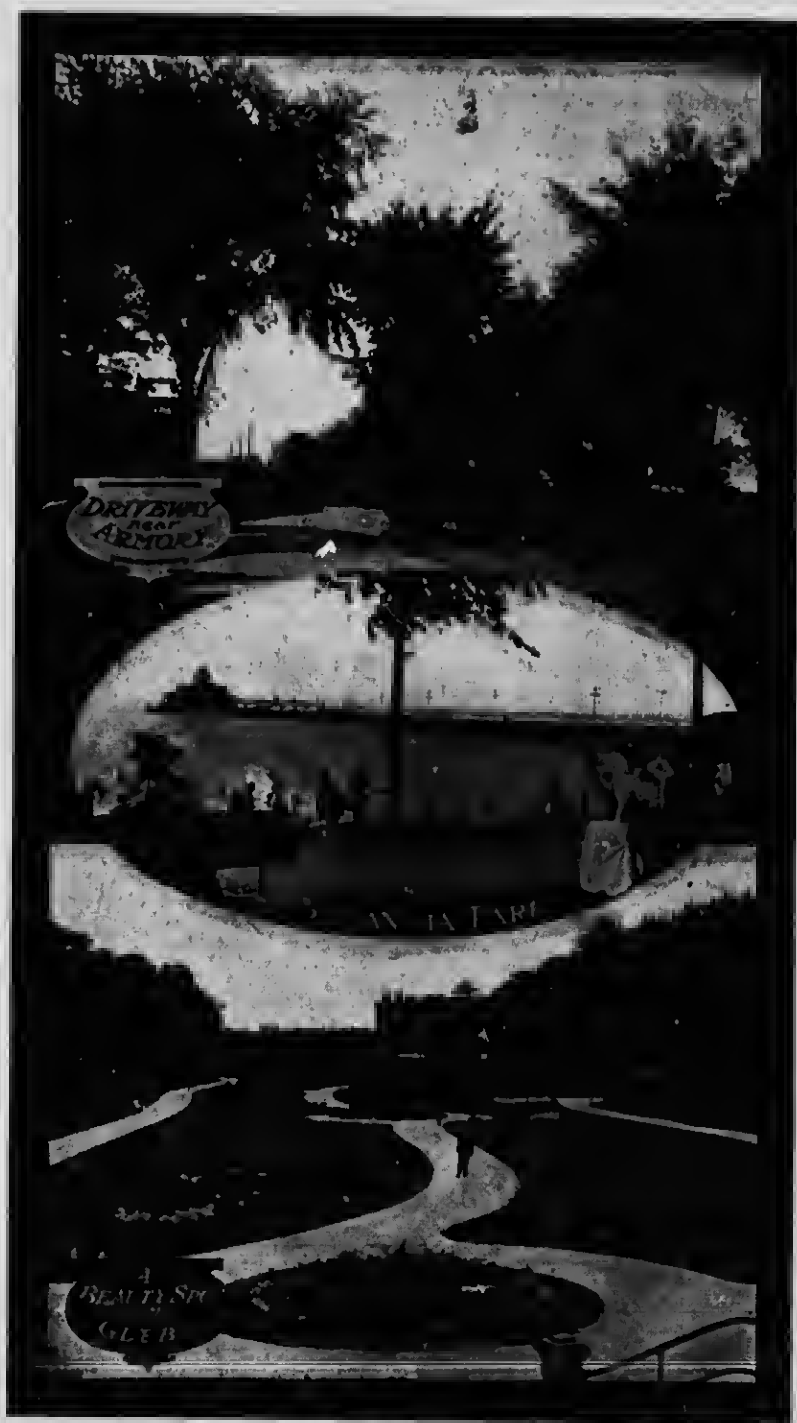

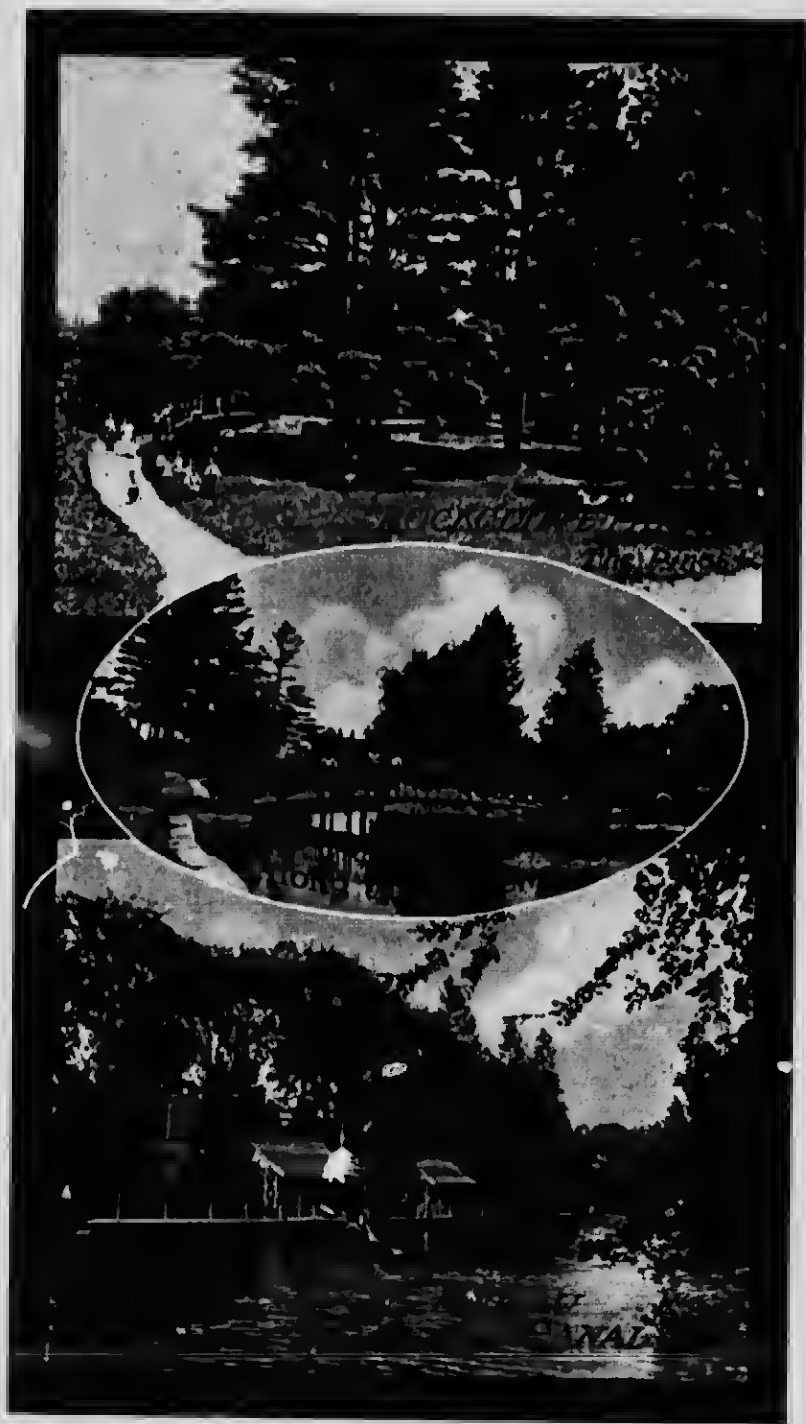

Transportation Facilities

Twelve Steam Roads enter the city; two others and one electric line under construction; eight water lines.

Ottawa ranks second to no place in Canada, in transportation facilities.

RAILWAYS—Grand Trunk, Canadian Pacific, Canadian Northern, New York Central.

WATER LINES—Via Rideau Canal to the St. Lawrence and the Great Lakes, Ottawa and St. Lawrence Rivers to the Great Lakes, Montreal, and the Atlantic Seaboard.

FREIGHT RATES

Freight rates from Ottawa to the great markets of Western Canada are identically the same per class, per cwt., as rates from Toronto, Hamilton, London, Woodstock, Welland, Windsor, Walkerville and other industrial centres of Ontario, and with the advantage of one-half to two days quicker service from Ottawa to western points, by reason of direct haul (see Ry. map of Canada) without transshipment, as is necessary on consignments of freight from points not on the main line of the only *three* transcontinental railway lines.

On eastbound and export traffic, Ottawa, of course, has the advantage, in both rates and time, over all other Ontario and Western Canadian cities, by reason of location and more direct lines and transportation facilities between this point, the Atlantic ocean and the United States.

RAW MATERIALS.

Woodworking, paper-making, and for kindred industries, raw materials are available in the city and within easy access.

Timber and other materials abound throughout the district: Ash, Apatite, Beech, Basswood, Birch, Barite, Corundum, Clay (brick, tile and Pottery), Cedar, Elm, Granite, Graphite, Iron, Hemlock, Limestone, Marble, Marl, Mica, Maple, Magnesite, Peat, Pine (red and white), Poplar, Phosphate, Sand, Water (good, soft, cold).

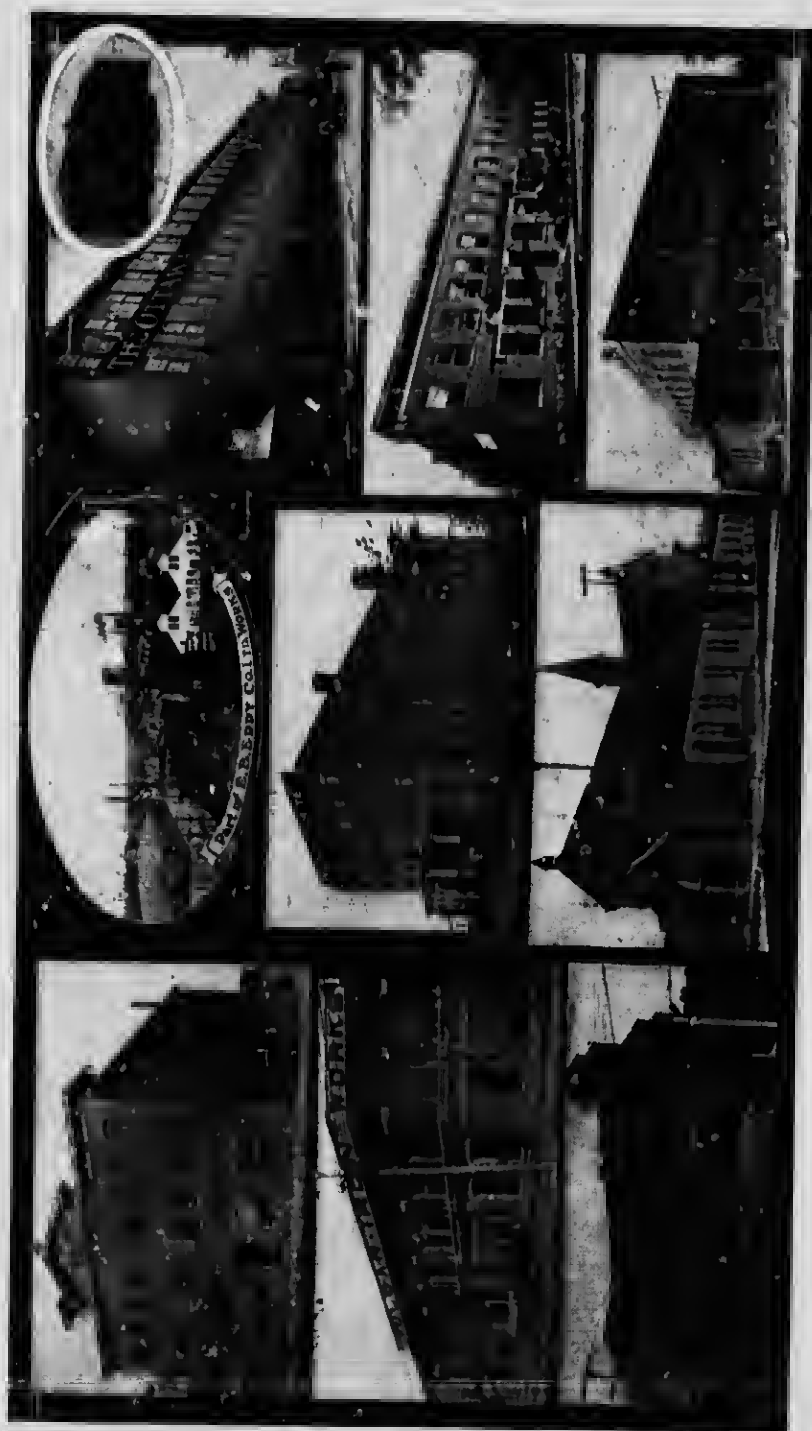

INDUSTRIOUS—PROSPEROUS

Ottawa's three principal payrolls—Industrial, \$8,500,000.00—Governmental, \$5,135,000.00—and Railways, \$3,000,000.00—combined, distribute annually nearly \$17,000,000.00.

Ottawa has the largest individual factories in the world producing Paper, Cardboard, Tents and Awnings, Marine Signals, and Cement.

Ottawa has now 192 important industries of various kinds, giving employment to about 18,500 persons—male and female—and paying out, in salaries and wages, approximately \$8,500,000.00 per annum. Total products 1912 estimated at \$40,000,000.

Ottawa is still the largest individual manufacturer of lumber in the world—the district output of 1912 aggregating 559,000,000 feet, board measure, with a monetary valuation of about \$16,800,000.00.
