








An Act to ratify the incorporation of the Montreal Club and grant to it certain additional powers.

WHEREAS "The Montreal Club" has, by petition, represented that it is expedient to ratify its incorporation and corporate rights, and to grant to it certain additional powers, and whereas it is advisable to grant its prayer:

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

- 1. The incorporation and corporate rights of "The Montreal Club" already granted to the said "The Montreal Club" by and in virtue of articles 5,487 and following of the revised Statutes shall be and are hereby ratified for all legal purposes.
- 2. The corporation by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may have a common

seal and power to change, alter, break or renew the same iden and as often as shall be thought proper.

- 3. The corporation by such name shall at all times hereafter, be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess, enjoy and have, exchange, take and receive all lands, tenements and hereditaments, and all real or immoveable estates being and situate in the city of Montreal or its vicinity, necessary for the actual use or occupation of the corporation, for the purpose for which it is created, and the said property to hypothecate, sell, alienate and dispose of, and to acquire other instead thereof when the said corporation may deem it proper so to do, but such real estate shall not exceed the annual value of ten thousand dollars.
- 4 By the same name the corporation may be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, emplead and to be empleaded, answer and to be answered in any manner whatsoever.
- 5. The corporation shall also have power to draw, make, accept and endorse all bills of exchange and promissory notes necessary for the purposes of the Club under the hands of the

officers duly authorized thereto by the general committee

- 6. The constitution, rules and regulations now in force, touching the admission and expulsion of members, and the management and conduct generally of the affairs and concerns of the corporation in so far as they are not inconsistent with the laws of this province, shall be the constitution, rules and regulations of the corporation; provided always that the corporation may, from time to time, alter, repeal and change, in whole or in part, such constitution, rules and regulations as the corporation may see fit.
- 7. The present act shall in no manner or form diminish or alter the present obligations and liabilities of the corporation.
- 8 No member of the corporation shall be personally liable for any of the debts thereof.
- 9. Any member of the corporation not being in arrears, may retire therefrom and shall cease to be such member on giving notice to that effect in such form as may be required by the constitution, rules and regulations thereof, and thereafter shall be wholly free from liability for any debt or engagement of the Club: and every mem-

ber expelled or retiring from the Club and whose name shall have been struck off the list of members for any of the reasons mentioned in the constitution, rules and regulations of the Club, shall *ipso facto* forfeit all rights of membership

The corporation shall have power to appoint such committees, officers, administrators and servants as may be required for the due management of its affairs, and to allow them respectively a reasonable and suitable remuneration

All the officers so appointed may exercise such other powers and authorities for the due management and conduct generally of the affairs of the corporation as may be required of them by the constitution, rules and regulations of the club

of every description of moveable and immoveable property belonging to the corporation, shall be appropriated and employed to the exclusive use of the corporation, to the construction and repairs of buildings required for the purposes of the corporation, and to the payment of expenses legitimately incurred in carrying out any of the objects relating to the aforesaid purposes.

adopted by the majority of its members, present at a special meeting convened for such purpose, issue stock to such extent as may be deemed necessary not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of fifty thousand dollars in shares of one hundred dollars each; such stock to be subscribed for in a book to be opened for that purpose by the general committee of the said Club, and to be paid up in such manner and within such delay as may be determined by the general committee.

The funds arising from such stock shall be applied to the erection of a club house or to the purchase or leasing of property or for other purposes connected with the corporation, as the general committee may see fit

- 13. The paid up shares of such stock shall be transferable by assignment on the books of the corporation, subject, however, to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the general committee
- 14. Each holder of such paid up stock shall be entitled to receive an annual dividend at a rate not exceeding six per cent. on the amount of stock held by him, such rate of interest to be

fixed and made payable as the general committee may regulate.

- 15. The corporation may, in the like manner, issue such stock on the condition that the same may be redeemed and paid up from time to time, as may be judged desirable, the share or shares so to be redeemed or paid up, to be selected by the said committee by drawing lots.
- 16. Such payments to redeem the stock may be made by depositing in any of the chartered banks in the city of Montreal, to the credit of the holder of such shares, the amount of such shares and all dividends unpaid thereon, and upon notice of such deposit being addressed by registered letter to such holder at his last inscribed address at the Club, the said shares shall ipso facto cease to exist.
- 17. The corporation may, upon resolution adopted by the two-thirds of its members present at a special meeting convened for such purpose, issue such stock with the condition that the said stock after due registration in the office or offices of the registration division or divisions in which the immoveables of the corporation are situated (which must be described in a notice to that

effect given to the registrar), shall constitute, with all dividends to accrue thereon, a privileged claim in favor of the holders thereof against the corporation, and give a right of preference over all other debts and claims against the said corporation posterior to the issuing of such stock.

- 18. The corporation may raise or borrow money to be applied in the manner regulated by section 12 of this act, and may execute and issue debentures therefor, subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by article 4,705 of the Revised Statutes, and its amendments concerning the powers of joint stock companies to issue debentures.
- 19. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

The Montreal Club.

CONSTITUTION.

Name.

1. This Association shall be known as "The Montreal Club," with a limited membership of 250.

Politics and Religion. 2. Politics and religious questions of every description shall be absolutely excluded from the objects of the Club.

Candidates.

be proposed by one member and seconded by another, such proposal to be in writing, and signed by both mover and seconder, and shall be ballotted for at any ballot which may take place after the lapse of one week from the time of such proposal. The names of the candidate and of his proposer and seconder shall be posted in the manner directed by the General Com-

mittee, and also inserted in a notice addressed to each member of the Club, at least one week before the day of the ballot. No ballot shall be valid unless twenty-eight members actually ballot; and one black ball in seven shall exclude.

- 4. The ballot shall take place between Rules of the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m on the first Wednesday in each month
- 5. On the admission of each new New Memmember, the Socretary shall notify the same to him and furnish him with a printed copy of the Constitution and Regulations, and request him to remit the amount of his entrance fee and subscription to the Treasurer.
- 6. The Entrance Fee shall be seventy-five dollars, and the Annual Subscription twenty five dollars; the subscription to be payable in advance on the first of January in each year
- 7. No member shall be admitted to Members vote on any occasion whatever, or enjoy Voting. any of the privileges of the Club, until he shall have paid whatever Entrance Fee or Subscription shall be due by him.

Members tailing to pay on Entrance.

8. Any member failing to pay his Entrance Fee or Subscription within two weeks after his being notified of his admission, shall be reported to the Committee, who shall cause his name to be erased from the list of members. unless the delay can be justified to the satisfaction of the Commtttee.

Members failing to pay Auscriptions.

9. The name of every member failing to pay his Annual Subscription on the ist of January, shall be posted on the ist of February, if not then paid; and if the Subscription be not paid on or before the first day of March, the Secretary shall report accordingly to the Committee, who shall cause his name to be erased from the list of members; but he may be re-admitted by the Committee upon assigning to them reasons which they shall consider satisfactory for his failure of payment.

10. Any member shall have the privitwo weeks, lege of introducing a friend for a period of 14 days in any six months, providing such friend shall not be a resident of, or have a place of business on the Island of Montreal. Upon his introduction a card will be sent to him by the Secretary specifying the terms for which the privileges have been extended. The names and residence of such visitors, and the names of the members introducing them must be recorded, and members shall be responsible for any indebtedness incurred by their guests.

- 13. Any member, whose dues are all Tables, Members paid, shall be at liberty to withdraw may withdraw from the Club, on his written application

to that effect, sent in to the Committee before the next ensuing Annual Meeting of the Club, and no other mode of resignation shall be binding or effective.

Expulsion of Member.

14. Any member wilfully infringing the Constitution or any of the Regulations of the Club shall be liable to suspension or expulsion by a vote of two-thirds of the Committee at any meeting specially held for that purpose; reasonable notice of such meeting being previously given such member.

If any member be guilty of conduct which, in the opinion of the Committee or of ten members, who shall certify the same in writing, is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, the Committee shall summon such member to appear before them to explain his conduct, and if he neglects to appear before the Committee, or, having appeared, shall fail to satisfy the Committee, the Committee may suspend such member from the privileges of the Club for a period not exceeding two

months, or the Committee may call an extraordinary meeting of the Club to consider the matter, and it shall be competent to such meeting, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present thereat, to suspend or expel such member from the Club.

- resign, or be expelled shall cease to be Claims. a member of the Club, and shall forfeit, ipso facto, all right or claim thereon, or in or to its property or funds, and any member who shall be expelled shall forever thereafter be ineligible to be readmitted a member of the Club.
- 16. Persons not residing within fifty Non-resident Members of Montreal may be elected non-bers. resident members, and shall have all the rights and privileges of membership in the Club, except that of voting, but they shall not be counted among the number to which the membership is lin ited.
- 17. Candidates for non-resident mem-Election of Non-resident members, bership must be proposed and elected dent Members, in the same manner as provided for the

proposal and election of candidates for full membership.

Membership & Subscription Non-resibers.

18. Non-resident membership shall be limited to twenty five, and the annual dent Mem-subscription shall be fifteen dollars.

Committee of Management.

19. The Committee shall consist of nine members, who shall exect their own chairman and officers; three of whom shall, subject to the provisions of the next Article, be elected every year. The said Committee shall have full power to make such rules and regulations from time to time as they may think fit, not inconsistent with the Constitution.

Retiring and New Members

20. The Committee shall cause to be posted on the bulletin board in the hall of the Club, fourteen days before the Annual General Meeting, a list of retiring members and of the names of those proposed by them to supply the vacancies. Any member desiring to substitute for the vacancies occurring on the Committee by retirement, the name or names of any other member or members for those proposed for the Committee, shall send a list of such name or names at least seven days before the election to the Secretary, who shall thereupon post such name or names; but no member shall be put up for election unless at least two members sign the proposal.

- 21. At each Annual Meeting three of Term to the nine members of the Committee shall retire, so that no member shall remain more than three years on the Committee the three members so to retire to be selected by the Committee at some meeting previous to the date of election.
- on the Committee shall resign, or should a death vacancy occur, or should any member of the Committee have ceased to attend the regular meetings of the General Committee for a period of three months consecutively, the Committee shall have the power to choose a qualified member to act in his stead until the Annual Meeting next ensuing, when the member so chosen shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

Meetings of Committee, 23. The Committee, three of whom shall form a quorum, shall meet monthly on a stated day, to transact current business and to audit the accounts of the preceding month.

Infraction of Rules.

24. It shall be the duty of the Committee to take immediate cognizance of any infraction of the Constitution or Regulations of the Club.

Annual Meetings. 25. The Annual Meeting of the Club shall be held on the third Wednesday in January, for the purpose of electing the Committee for the succeeding year; previous to which meeting it shall be the duty of the Committee to present a report and abstract of the state of accounts and general concerns of the Club for the past year, together with an estimate of the receipts and disbursements of the current year.

Quorom

26. A quorum of fifteen qualified members shall be necessary to constitute any Annual or Special Meeting of the Club.

27. The Committee shall have power Extraordinary meetat all times to convene an extraordinary ings. meeting of the Club, on giving seven days' notice, to be posted up during that period on the bulletin board in the hall of the Club, specifying the object of such meeting in the form of a resolution; at which meeting no subject shall be discussed beyond that specified in the Notice.

- 28. No smoking shall be permitted smoking. in the Coffee-Room.
- 29. The Club House shall open every House day except Sunday, and such other holidays as the Committee may decide for the reception of members at 8 o'clock a.m., and shall be closed after 7 pm., providing no members are present, otherwise at 12.30 a.m and the lights extinguished at 12.30 a.m. except on Saturdays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight. It shall be the duty of the waiters in attendance to announce the hour of 1130 p.m. on Saturdays, and 12 o'clock midnight on all other days, in each room then occupied by

required to leave the Club before the time fixed for closing and putting out the lights The servants on duty at the time of closing the Club must report to the Secretary the names of members remaining in the Club after such time, on pain of instant dismissal.

Take away Papers,

30. No member shall take away from the Club, upon any pretence whatsoever, any newspaper, pamphlet, book, map or other article, the property of the Club, unless upon such terms as may be decided upon by the Committee.

Provisions, &c., taken out.

31. No provisions cooked in the Club House, or wines or other liquors to be sent out of the house on any pretence whetever.

Complaints.

32. Any member having cause for complaint, and desiring it to be investigated, shall communicate same in writing to the Secretary, who shall forthwith lay the matter before the Committee.

- 33. No servant of the Club shall be No servants sent out of the house upon any errand, out on on any pretence whatever, except by the sanction and order of the Secretary or Steward.
- 34 No member shall give any money Gratuities or gratuity to any servant of the Club, or permit any stranger to do so. Mem bers are strongly urged to support the Committee in securing the strictest observance of this rule which is framed in the interest of every member of the Club.
- 35. Members will sign tickets for all Members sign orders given, as no cash down payments Tickets can be made.
- 36. The Secretary shall notify each Members' member as soon as possible after the end of each month the amount of his account for the preceding month, and such accounts unpaid on the 15th of each month shall be posted on the bulletin board in the hall. If any member neglects to pay his account within one month, he shall forfeit his membership,

unless the time is extended by the Committee of Management for good cause shown

Address of Members.

37. Each member of the Club is requested to communicate his address to the Secretary, and all notices shall be mailed to such address.

Ladies admitted.

38. Ladies may be introduced to the Club after 6 pm., when accompanied by a member.

Constitution may

39. Any article of this Constitution be altered, amended or suspended for any range of time, by consent of two-thirds of the members present :: any meeting specially convened for that purpose; provided that such alteration, amendment or suspension shall have been specified in the notice summoning such meeting.

COMMITTEE.

The ordinary monthly meetings will be held on the third Wednesday in each month at 1.15 o'clock p.m., at which three shall form a quorum. In the absence of the duly appointed Chairman, or Vice-Chairman, a Chairman for the day will be first elected.

After the disposal of the minutes of the previous meeting, all such matters as require the consideration of the Committee will be brought before them, discussed and decided upon.

SUB-COMMITTEES.

For the despatch of business the Committee will appoint annually three Sub-Committees, to consist of three members each, to be known as the "House Committee," the "Billiard and Reading Room Committee," the "Finance Committee," and the "Wines and Cigar Committee." Each Committee will submit a

monthly report of their proceedings to the General Committee.

The House Committee will have charge, except as hereafter provided, of the Club property, of the purchase of all supplies, except wine and cigars, of the employment of servants, and generally see to the efficiency of the cuisine.

The Wines and Cigar Committee will have charge of the purchase of all wines, liquors and cigars, and will instruct the steward as to quantities and brands to obtain.

The Billiard and Reading Room Committee will have charge of all matters pertaining to these rooms, and they will formulate such regulations as they may from time to time deem necessary for their proper maintenance. They will also purchase the necessary supplies for these rooms.

The Finance Committee will have charge of all the finances, including accounts due to and by the Club, and will make such regulations as they may from time to time deem necessary.

HON. SECRETARY.

The Committee will annually appoint from

their number an Honorary Secretary. He will give instructions to the Secretary-Treasurer.

HON. TREASURER.

The Committee will annually appoint from their number an Honorary Treasurer, who shall also be one of the members of the Finance Committee.

He will give instructions to the Secretary-Treasurer, and will monthly inspect the books of the Club, and ascertain if they are correctly kept.

SECRETARY-TREASURER.

. #

As Secretary he will attend all the meetings of the Committee, note their resolutions, and minute them in the book of their proceedings.

Subject to the approval of the Honorary Secretary he will conduct all the official correspondence of the Club, draw up reports, and issue such notices as may be necessary, or from time to time ordered by the Committee.

As Treasurer he shall receive the monies of the Club, and discharge bills when sanctioned by the Sub-Committees, or the General Committee. He will keep regular accounts of the financial concerns of the Club, and prepare annually the statements required by Article 25 of the Constitution.

He will st.' hit to the Committee a monthly statement of the financial condition of the Club.

AUDITOR.

The Auditor sha'l make an audit of the Club books and accounts annually, and render a certified statement to the Committee

STEWARD.

The Steward, under the direction of the House Committee, will have the custody of all supplies, including wines, liquors, cigars, etc. He will receive all goods and ascertain that they are in strict accordance with the orders given. He will examine and certify to all accounts of the tradesmen previous to their being submitted to the House Committee. He will be responsible for the cleanliness and order of the house, the care of linen, etc. He will have the general control and superintendence of servants, and be responsible for their conduct and cleanly appearance.

Subject to the Committee, he shall make the established charges for all provisions, wines, etc.

BARMAN.

He will have the custody of all wines, liquors, cigars, etc., as issued to him by the Steward.

He will account daily to the Secretary for all monies received from the members, and give in an account of all amounts due by members for supplies received from the Bar. He will be charged with any deficiency that may occur in the stock of wines, liquors, cigars, etc., placed in his custody.

HA!L PORTER.

He will enter in his book, once a day, the name of every member coming into the Club House He will have charge of the Visitors' Book.

Strangers calling to see members will be shown by him into the Strangers' Room, and intimation of their arrival immediately sent by him to the member inquired for in the Club.

He will have charge also of the Lavatory and Cloak Room, and see that the rooms are regularly supplied with paper, pens, etc.

He will assist the Secretary in the writing and despatching of circulars, etc.

WAITERS.

The Waiters and all other servants in the establishment will be subject to the order of the Steward, and will perform such duties as he may prescribe.

COOK.

The Cook will have the immediate direction of the kitchen department, and of the assistants therein as far as concerns the performance of their duties; and will prepare the daily bill of fare, with the concurrence of the Steward.

COFFEE-ROOM.

Breakfast will be served from eight o'clock until ten o'clock a.m. Lunches and dinners from twelve o'clock noon until three o'clock p.m. Hot and cold meals up to eight o'clock p.m., but later hours may be arranged for with the House Committee.

Articles of glass, earthenware, etc., which may be broken by the members, either in the coffee-room, or elsewhere in the house, must be paid for by them.

PRIVATE ROOM.

A private lunch room will be provided for as the circ astances of the Club and the con-

venience of its members may require. It may be so used between the hours of one and three o'clock p.m; after this hour it shall be open for Club purposes. Any member may secure the use of this room, between the hours named, for a private lunch, on giving notice to the Steward before noon of the day upon which the room is desired, and on payment of a charge of one dollar.

PAMPHLET AND NOTICES.

No pamphlet, advertisement, or notice of any kind will be laid on the tables, or put up in the Club by a member; but any pamphlet, etc., which it may be wished to make known to the Club, shall be sent to the Secretary, to be laid before the Billiard and Reading-Room Committee for approval.

The foregoing may be altered by a majority of the General Committee.

Permission from the Committee must be obtained before soliciting, in the Club's premises, subscriptions for any purpose.

HOUSE RULES.

All servants of the Club are strictly enjoined to use the greatest civility and attention to

members, and they will refer all complaints made to them to the attention of the Steward.

Servants while on duty will not talk to each other except on matters connected with the business of the Club, and no servant is permitted to address an individual member in the house on matters personal or relative to the concerns of the Club. All communications of the latter kind to be made, through the Steward, to the Secretary or the House Committee.

Any money or articles, found by the servants in the Club House, shall be delivered to the Secretary, through the Steward.

Servants are strictly prohibited from receiving visitors or followers in the Club.

No large boxes or articles of luggage belonging to members shall be admitted into the hall.

Hats, coats, umbrellas, sticks, etc., must not be left lying about the Club, but placed in one of the rooms provided for the purpose.

No application for re-instatement of a servant who may have been dismissed on the representation of a member will be read or taken into consideration, unless it come through and be recommended by the member on whose representation he or she was dismissed.

No officers or servants will receive, under penalty of immediate dismissal, any present whatever from the members or tradesmen of the Club; and any tradesmen detected in giving such will be forthwith discontinued, and never dealt with again.

Any servant absenting himself or herself without leave from the Secretary or Steward will forfeit all wages during time of absence, unless he or she can fully satisfy the Committee that the absence was caused by sickness.

Eatables left on the dishes will be taken direct to the kitchen, and in no way appropriated by the servants.


