WAR NEWS IN PARAGRAPHS.

It is reported that Martial law has been proclaimed and is being rigidly enforced in the Canary Islands. The London Daily News suggests that Sampson make a dash into Santiago harbor and crush Cervera; and The London Times thinks it would be a good scheme for the United States to land an expedition in the vicinity of Santiago, invest the place by sea and land, and by that means force a surrender.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

Powerful Austrian Warships Coming to Cuban Waters—Lattimer Shotting at Sea. New York, May 25.—(Special to Toronto World).—A Vienna special cable to The Journal says: "The sailing from Gibraltar to-morrow of the powerful Austrian warships Franz Joseph and Maria Theresa for Cuban waters have strengthened the supposition well-informed circles that a clash subject, and his ill-will towards the United States has been intensified by his failure to secure aid from European powers for his niece, the Queen Regent of Spain."

EULOGY TO GLADSTONE

Sir Wilfrid Laurier Pays Eloquent Tribute to the Deceased.

NOTABLE DAY IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

Resolution Appointing a Commission to Draft a Suitable Resolution Passed After the Premier Had Delivered One of the Grandest Orations of His Life—Sir Charles Tupper in a Few Words Gave Way to Mr. Costigan, Who Specially Referred to Home Rule Matters—Other House Proceedings.

Ottawa, May 25.—(Special.)—Once in a while the Commons of Canada has an oratorical treat, and to-day was one of these occasions. The Premier was not present when the committee was struck to draft a resolution of condolence on the death of Mr. Gladstone, and fortunately for the House and the country Sir Wilfrid was able to-day to move the adoption of the report that he spoke well goes without saying. His review of the career of the great statesman was critical, as well as admiring, and few men who know something of Gladstone's services to mankind will venture to say that Sir Wilfrid misjudged him.

THE PREMIER'S EULOGY.
