REVOLTING TRAGEDY. In the Heart of Delaware a Lynch.

ing is Popular. New York, June 26 .- The Herald says : The revolting tragedy at Wilmington, Delaware, midway between the commercia metropolis of the country and its political capital, brings lynching pretty close home to us. Among the thoughts suggested by

the dreadful story are: First, the negro criminal had served several terms for felonious assaults. Penalties should be cumulative so that a repetition of such crimes should consign the perpetrator to imprisonment for life instead of letting him loose like a ferodous animal to prey upon society.

Second, when the Attorney-General, after the negro's arrest, requested the empanelling of a grand jury and a special panelling of a grand jury and a special session of the court the judges refused to act. In view of the peculiar atrocity of the crime and the excited state of public feeling, the judges' action was inexcusable. The law's delay, with attendant miscarriage of justice, is the most plausib's excuse for mob law.
