



## ANNUAL MEETING.

---

The adjourned Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society of this Island, was held at the Infant School House, on Thursday evening, the 8th of January, 1857, at 7 o'clock; the Rev. C. Lloyd, E. C., in the Chair.

After the offering up of prayer and the singing of the 100th Psalm, the Chairman opened the business of the meeting by directing the attention of those present to two principal features connected with the Society, the interests of which they were that evening met together to promote, namely, its being a Church, as well as a Native Society,—Church in its character and principles, and native in its operations and sphere of labor; a Society which not only represented the interests of the Church of England in this colony, but expended all its means within its borders; means, however, which, he regretted to say, were as yet but small, and nothing equal to the demands which were made, or even likely to be made, upon it; a Society which had the free and full disposal of its own funds, and over whose laws the Bishop of the Diocese had a controlling power. The prospects of the Society, he was glad to see, were brightening, especially if he were to take the attendance this evening, at such an inclement season, as an indication of the interest felt in its operations. The time, he was persuaded, was drawing near, when the venerable Society which had hitherto so generously sustained the cause of the Church in this Island, would be obliged to withdraw its funds to younger and more destitute colonies, and therefore there was the more need, ere they were altogether thrown upon their own resources, to promote the welfare of that native Society to which they must ultimately look for

the support of their ministers in this Island. And after some further observations, in which he pointed out the duty of sustaining their own Church, he called on the Secretary to read the Annual Report.

The Report having been read, and the Treasurer's account submitted to the meeting, it was moved by the Rev. W. Meek, seconded by Charles Palmer, Esq.,

Resolved, That the Report now read be adopted, and printed, under the direction of the Committee.

Moved by the Rev. D. Parnter, and seconded by H. Haszard, Esq.,

Resolved, That this meeting desires to return thanks to Almighty God for the many blessings, both temporal and spiritual, which he has vouchsafed to this Island during the past year.

Moved by the Rev. H. Read, and seconded by Capt. Orlebar, R. N.,

Resolved, That this meeting gratefully records its sense of thankfulness to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and also to the Colonial, Church, and School Societies, for their liberal and ready help towards the members of the Church of England in this Colony, whereby they are enabled to worship God after the manner of their fathers.

Moved by the Rev. D. FitzGerald, and seconded by the Hon. the Attorney General,

Resolved, That this meeting thankfully acknowledges the valuable assistance and co-operation of the Ladies' Branch of this Society.

Moved by Theos. DesBrisay, Esq., and seconded by T. B. Tremain, Esq.,

Resolved, That whereas it is a matter of convenience to the country clergymen, and appears to be conducive to the general interest of the Society, to alter the time of holding its Annual Meeting: it is therefore resolved, that the Annual Meeting of this Society shall in future be held on the 3rd Tuesday in January, at the hour of 7 o'clock, P. M., and that the fourth Quarterly Meeting of the Committee be held on the same day, at 12 o'clock, A. M.

## R E P O R T .

In the good providence of God, your Committee are enabled with renewed expressions of thankfulness to the Great Head of the Church, who disposeth the hearts of his members, to give of their substance to the extension of his kingdom, and the promotion of his glory, to lay before you the report of the proceedings and operations of your Society for the past year.

Your Committee are enabled to report favourably as to the state of your funds, and would refer to the following returns from the different stations in the Island in proof that the Society has not ceased to interest its subscribers and friends, and has not lost ground in public estimation.

CHARLOTTETOWN.—A renewed effort has been made to add to the subscription list opened last year in aid of the erection of a Parsonage, which has reached the sum of £203 4s., including a grant of £10 made this year by the Ladies' Branch. About 80 volumes have been added to the Library, which makes the present number on the catalogue amount to 788, the reading of which is open to all who subscribe the moderate sum of five shillings per annum. The Sacramental and other collections, for Missionary and Church purposes, are not behind those of former years.

Your Committee still regret that the £10 which was wanting last year to complete the Parish half certificate in aid of Windsor College has not yet been made up.

Contributions made to the Society, including those received from the Ladies' Branch, and the Bishop's subscription, together with a collection made in the Parish Church after the annual sermon, amount to £53 14s 6d

ST. ELEANOR'S.—Your Committee have voted the sum of £15 towards paying off the debt on the Parsonage

connected with this mission. Rev. H. Read, reports a hope that the work of the Gospel is going on favorably among his people, and states that the Parish Church has been considerably enlarged at an expense of £160 borne by the congregation; that the Parsonage has been completed, a new church has been commenced at Barrett's Cross Roads, and £30 has been subscribed towards the minister's salary, all which he trusts are indicative of progress in missionary operations.

Contributions to the Society, £17 18s 3d

NEW LONDON.—Your Committee have granted the sum of £10 in aid of the new church at Irishtown, which has been regularly attended from the time of its opening in March last, by very full congregations gathered from the surrounding neighborhood. Rev. W. Meek, reports that he has raised, independently of what has been done in the locality and by your Society, about £130 which is all expended, though the interior of the Church is not yet finished: he further states, that in addition to sundry repairs made to the old church, the new stone dyke is being continued round the church-yard, and that the services at both churches have been continued on Sundays and on week days without interruption, as also services at Long River, Third Pond, the Baltic, Fermoy, and occasionally at Cavendish. Contributions to the Society, £8 0s 11½d.

PORRHILL.—Rev. H. Swabey reports that the old church in this mission has been shingled anew and painted externally. The Glebe School House at New Bideford has been plastered and otherwise repaired, so that divine service has been held therein during the summer; he further reports, that the church at Lot 11 is so far advanced that he expects to hold divine service therein at all seasons of the year, and looks forward to being able to finish it in a plain manner, as he has in hand the sum of £50,—£23 of which being a donation from a clergyman of our church and late proprietor of Lot 11, and the remaining £27 being the proceeds of a tea party held in the parish, and a grant of £10 from your Society. Contributions to the Society, £12 2s 9½.

**GEORGETOWN.**—Rev. R. Roach, reports that during the current year the sum of £42 17s 5d has been collected for the purpose of paying off a debt on Trinity Church and other incidental expenses, and £55 subscribed towards the minister's salary; that arrangements have been made for properly enclosing the church property early the ensuing summer, and the sum of £7 10s allowed by your Society to the missionary has been handed over by him in furtherance of that object, and that a valuable clock has been given by Capt. Westway for the use of the church. At Murray Harbour the grant made by your Society has been expended in repairing the church and making it fit for the celebration of public worship; he further reports, that through the Divine blessing a permanent attachment to the ministrations of the church is clearly apparent in the congregation of Georgetown; and in Murray Harbour the most kindly feeling is evinced towards the occasional services of the church by the full attendance and devout attention of the people, and also that the religious services held frequently at Montague, Cardigan, &c., are encouraging evidences of an enlightened appreciation of the Episcopal church and her evangelical offices. Contributions to the Society, £10.

**MILTON AND RUSTICO.**—Rev. M. Swabey reports that at each of his stations the congregation has increased, and at Milton the people have given evidence of their desire to have their clergyman resident among them, by contributing gladly towards the erection of a Parsonage, for which purpose the sum of £107 has been already raised, in addition to £10 voted by your Society; the exterior of the church at Rustico is being painted by the exertions of the people, £32 has been contributed towards the minister's salary, and on the whole the missionary hopes that increased numbers at the service of the Sanctuary may be an indication of a more lively interest in the things of God. Contributions to the Society, £5 10s.

**CRAPAUD, &C.**—Rev. D. Parnter reports that notwithstanding the liberal grant made by your Society and the

exertions of the people there still remains a debt of about £20 on the Parsonage; your Committee have voted toward its liquidation the sum of £15. Contributions to the Society, £14 3s.

**CHERRY VALLEY.**—Rev. W. Stewart reports that the attendance of the congregation has been good and their attention devout, and that his services, he has reason to hope, have been productive of the desired effect; that he has a very interesting Sunday School about 5 miles from the ferry; that the new church at Southport has been externally completed, and since July last, been, with a few exceptions, regularly opened for divine service; and that £15 has been paid toward the ministers salary. Your Committee have voted the sum of £7 10s, in addition to £10 given by the Ladies' Branch, towards the erection of the new church connected with this mission. Contributions to the Society, £8.

The Treasurer will now lay before you the Receipts and expenditure of the last year; and your Committee are encouraged to hope, from the increased efforts made in several of the country districts towards enlarging the annual income of your Society, notwithstanding the many local demands made upon them, that the labors of your Society are duly appreciated, and that the means placed at their disposal for benefiting the church of their fathers, even though they should be, as at present, laid out in building up her outward walls, and adding to her outposts, have not been injudiciously expended.
