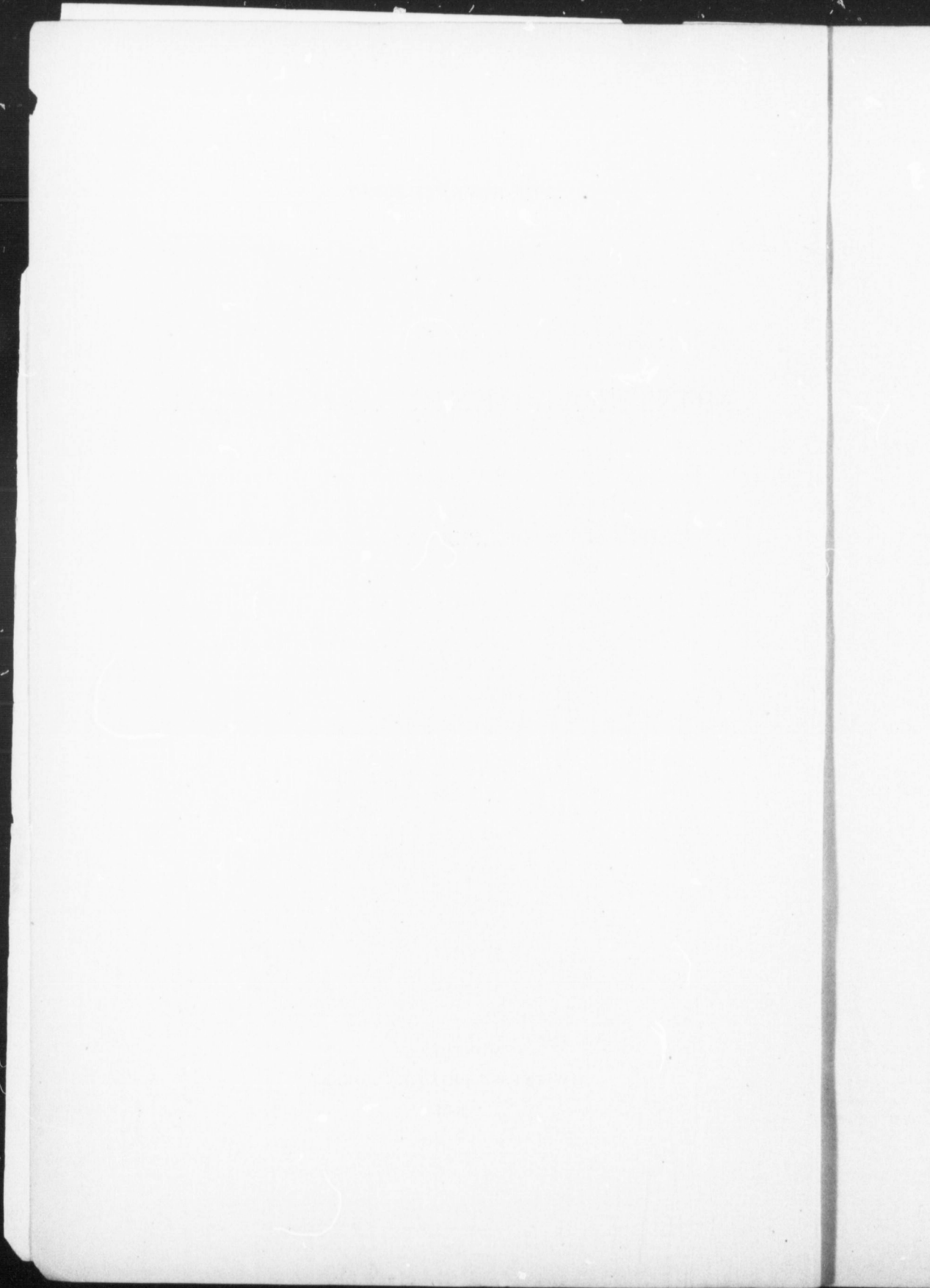


REAR VIEW OF THE GREENSHIELDS WING AND OF THE CAMPBELL MEMORIAL BUILDING

THE SEVENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT OF THE
MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The Seventy-first Annual Meeting of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital was held in the Governor's Hall of the Institution, on Tuesday, the 16th of May, 1893—Mr. John Stirling, President, in the chair. The Secretary read the following Report, which was adopted and ordered to be printed for circulation amongst the subscribers:—

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN OF THE CORPORATION OF THE
MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL :

I have the honor to present a brief report of the Receipts and Expenditure of the Hospital and of the proceedings of the Governors during the year which terminated on the 30th of April, 1893.

The ordinary income of the year was.....	\$53,729 13
The ordinary expenditure was	63,742 36

An analysis of the year's outlay shows that the chief items in which there has been an increased disbursement have been the following: Provisions and groceries, \$927.68; drugs and medicines, \$1,636.77; surgical instruments, \$735.13 (provided for by a special fund); dry goods and bedding, \$947.52; printing, stationery, etc., \$390.80; fuel, \$2,431.52; lighting, \$276.98; salaries and wages, \$2,428.27. There has been diminished expenditure in the following items: wines and liquors, \$195.31; insurance, \$157.60; repairs, \$432.33; furniture, \$327.30; law charges, \$145.90.

Subscriptions and ordinary donations show a slight increase. The other chief items of increase are: pay patients, \$1,430.30; interest and rents, \$1,975.08.

There have been received in legacies during the year: Estate Robert Smyth, \$100; Estate John Phelan, \$4,594.27; Estate George C. Hamilton (balance of bequest), \$55,000; Estate Mrs. Charles Phillips, \$10,000; Estate Mrs. Andrew Stuart, \$900; Estate Mrs. Mary Dow, \$18,000; Estate George Armstrong, \$175; Estate John Duncan, \$10,000; Estate George Ross, M.D., \$500.

The total number of in-door patients treated to a conclusion during the year was 2,360—an increase of 31 over the preceding year. Of these, 172 remained over from the preceding year, and 2,360 were admitted during the year 1892-93; 180 patients remained in Hospital at the end of the year.

Of the above deaths, 69 occurred within three days after admission.

The average daily number of patients in the wards during the year was 163. The average number of days in Hospital per patient was 24.75, being greater than last year by 1.41 days. The aggregate number of days in Hospital by all patients was 58,437, an increase of 1,190 days over last year.

The death-rate has been 8.3, or, if the 69 cases in which death occurred within three days after admission be deducted, 5.3.

Of the 197 deaths, 27 were due to phthisis, 5 to heart disease, 6 to appendicitis, 6 to scarlatina, 8 to typhoid fever, 12 to pneumonia, and 11 to diphtheria.

There were 23,603 consultations in the General Out-door Department and 7,882 new cases; in the Eye and Ear Department, 4,807 consultations and 1,835 new cases; in the Gynæcological Department, 1,874 consultations and 399 new cases; in the Nose and Throat Department, 1,887 consultations and 300 new cases; in the Children's Department, 399 consultations, making a total of 32,570 consultations.

The total number of life governors is now therefore 423.

The past year has been signalized by the completion and occupation

of the new Campbell Memorial and Greenshields' Wings—an important event in the history of the Hospital. Three of the four large wards provided for public patients in these wings, together with the private wards and the operating pavilion have been in use since December last for the treatment of surgical cases, and have been found most suitable and satisfactory in every respect. They are commodious, well ventilated and well heated, and provided with the most modern equipment. They fully justify the high expectations which have been entertained concerning them, and have stimulated afresh the desire on the part of the Governors to have the older buildings remodelled and brought into line with modern scientific views of hospital construction. The ways and means of accomplishing this latter object have been earnestly considered and fully discussed by the committee of management and the medical board during the year.

The greatly regretted death of the late Dr. George Ross in November last created a vacancy upon the medical board which was filled by the election of Dr. A. D. Blackader, whose place as Assistant Physician was in turn filled by the election of Dr. H. A. Laffeur. Dr. Ross, who at the time of his death was secretary to the Board of Governors and Senior Physician to the Hospital, had served the institution with zeal and ability for more than a quarter of a century. Entering the Hospital as House Apothecary in 1866 he became House Surgeon soon after, a position which he resigned in 1872 to be elected to the medical board as an attending physician. He was taken away in the prime of life and in the midst of his greatest usefulness.

The Hospital has been fortunate in securing the services of Dr. W. F. Hamilton as Medical Superintendent for another year. Dr. Hamilton has proved himself an efficient and painstaking officer and a good administrator.

For the first time in the history of the Hospital a special resident medical officer has been appointed to take charge of the administration of the anæsthetics. Dr. H. B. W. Carmichael, who was appointed to this position for one year, has filled it most satisfactorily. Dr. E. W. Aylen has been appointed his successor for the incoming year.

The vacancies caused by the termination of the year of office of Drs. H. J. Wasson, James Henderson, C. F. Martin, W. H. Smith and R. T. McKenzie as resident medical officers have been filled by the election of Drs. J. A. Henderson, A. D. McArthur, S. R.

McKenzie, J. W. Lawrence and J. L. Walker. The non-resident clinical assistants to serve alternately for six months in the out-door and gynæcological departments are Drs. J. D. Cameron and S. W. Hewetson.

The Training School for Nurses has continued in satisfactory operation throughout the year, as the following figures will show : 300 applications for information have been received ; 45 probationers have been accepted (36 of whom were continued in training), and 23 nurses have graduated during the year, making now a total of 42 graduates from this school.

Great credit is due to Miss Livingstone, the lady superintendent, for the successful conduct of the school and the efficient nursing of the patients by the nurses in training.

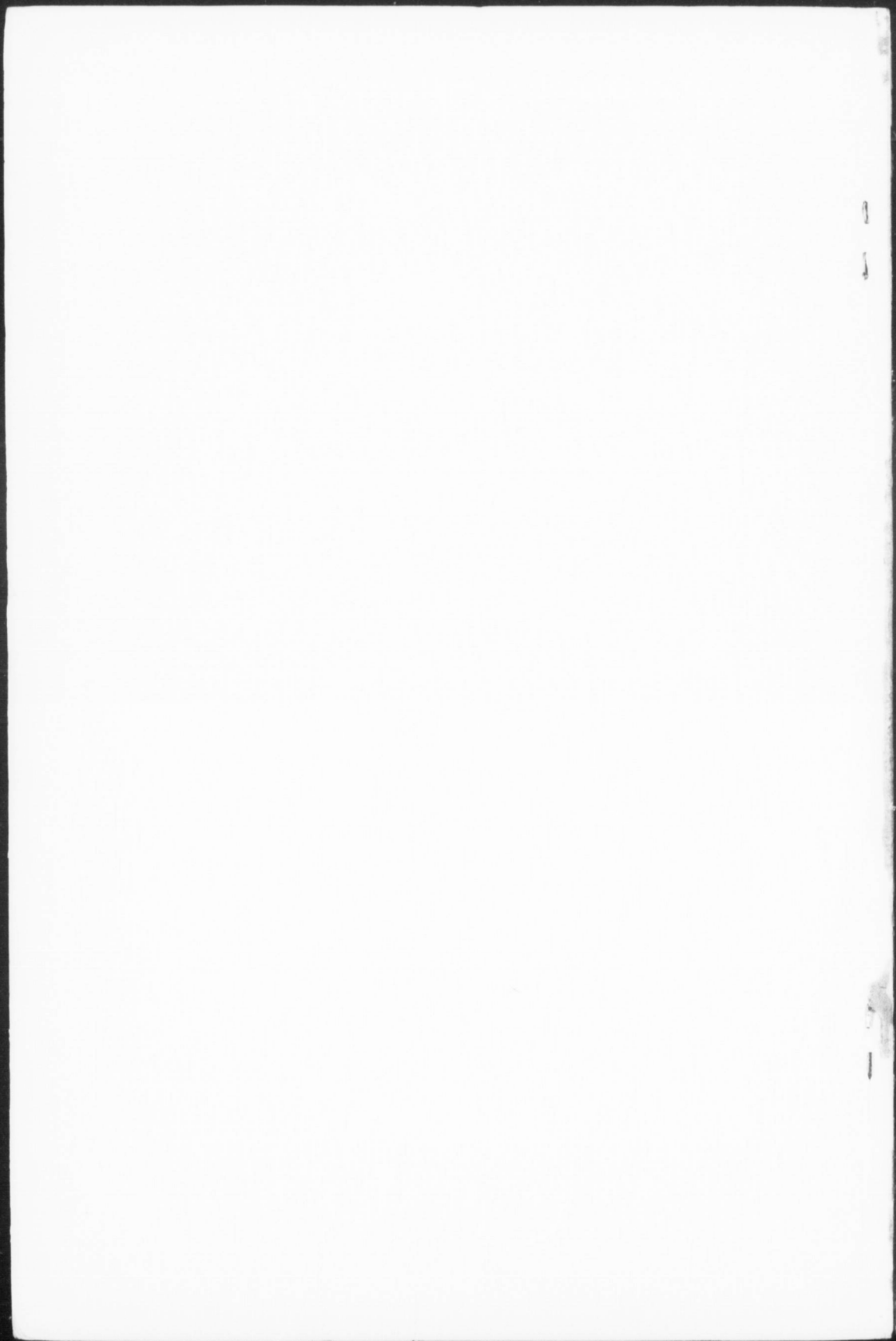

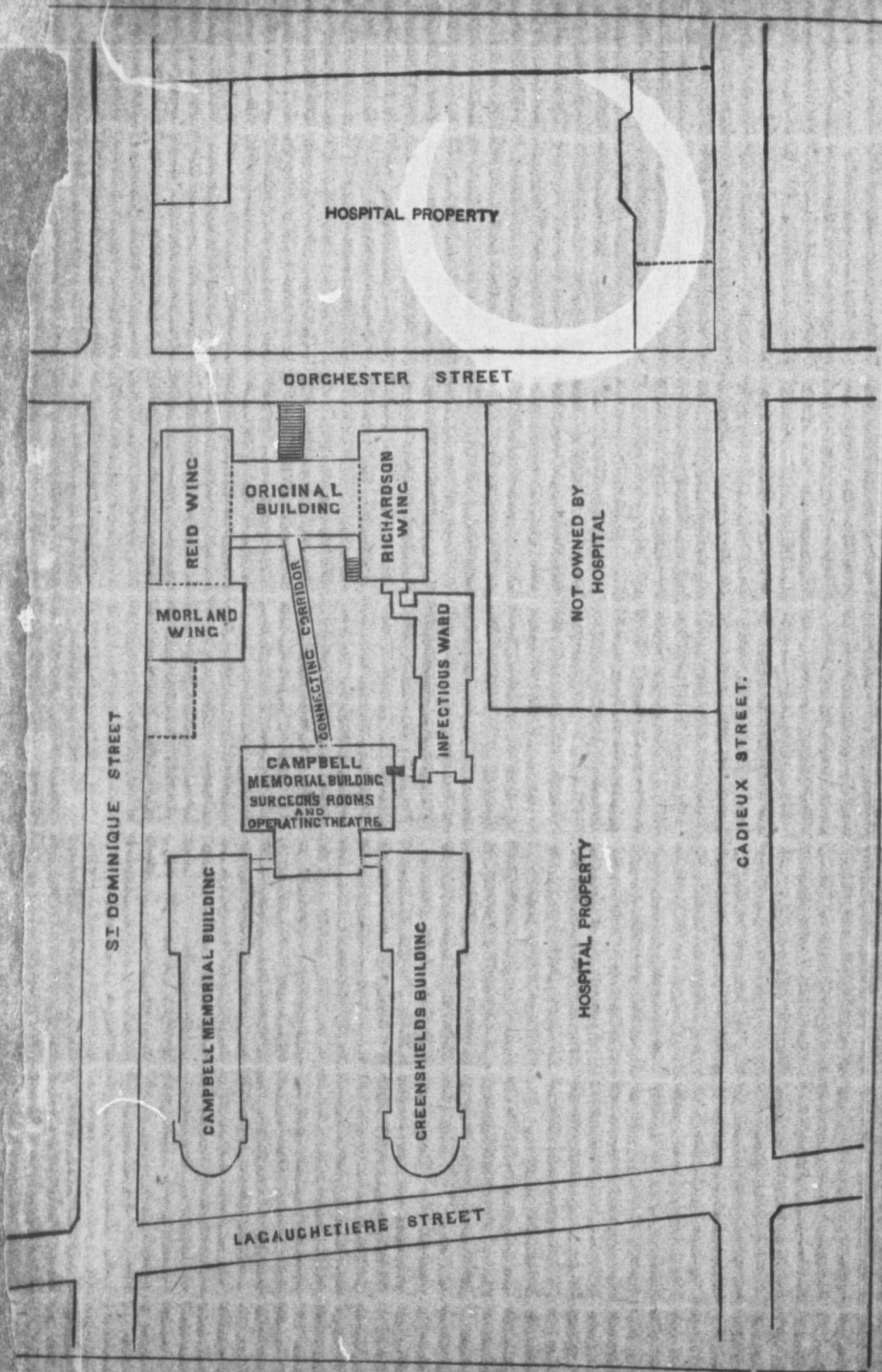
