

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

TWELFTH ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

ODDFELLOWS' RELIEF ASSOCIATION OF CANADA,

Held in the City of Kingston, Ontario, on Wednesday, January 26th, 1887.

The Association assembled in annual meeting on Wednesday, January 26th, 1887, in the Hall of CATARAQUI LODGE, No. 10, I. O. O. F., at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The President, Dr. Fowler, in the chair.

The attendance was unusually large, showing the interest taken in the Association.

There must have been fully one hundred and fifty members present. Among the strangers noticed were the following: Jno. Robinson, Prescott; William Robson, Whitby; J. Lawton, Brockville; R. W. Dowsley, W. Edwards, W. Fuge, E. Flunder, R. Fowler, G. Gardiner, W. H. Grant, D. Halilday, Jas. Kenney, F. Loyd, W. Livingston, G. Lucy, A. Meggs,

Thomas Meggs, S. McCammon, James McKeller, John Ormiston, A. E. Ormiston, W. Phillips, F. W. Patch, C. B. Rogers, A. Shirby, E. J Seale, G. Toner, Thomas Whitney, H. Woods, J. Johnson, J. Doran and H. McLiver, Napanee.

On motion, the reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting was dispensed with, printed copies being in the hands of the members, and were approved

as printed.

To save time and facilitate business, Bro. W. Robson, Whitby; John Robinson, Prescott; and W. M. Drennan, Kingston, were appointed to examine proxies and to act as scrutineers.

The President then called upon the Secretary to read the report of the Directors.

DIRECTORS' REPORT.

At this Twelfth Annual Meeting of the Association your Directors have much pleasure in giving an account of their stewardship, especially as they have still to report a steady increase of membership in both Classes A and B, a continued low rate of mortality, and consequently the small number of assessments during the year, which we consider due, in a large measure, to the great care exercised by our Medical Examiner, in the careful supervision of applications received.

Your directors are convinced that the amendment adopted at last annual meeting, to Article IV. of the Constitution, to the effect: "An applicant for membership must be a member of an Oddfellow's lodge; but once accepted, his membership depends solely on the payment of all calls made upon him, in accordance with the By-laws of the Association; provided, however,

that if he shall be expelled from the Independent Order of Oddfellows his membership immediately ceases in this Association," is in the interest of the Association for many reasons, one of the chief being that this Association not having the authorization of the Grand Lodge, we have no means of knowing when members of our Association are cut off for non-payment of dues, or otherwise, and these brethren may keep on paying our calls, in which case, we are assured, we could not legally refuse to pay the Benefits of such at death.

The retiring Resident Directors are Bros. Robert Gage, W. H. Henderson, M.D., and W. J. Livingston; of Non-Resident Directors, Bro. L. Ferguson, St. Thomas, whose three years have expired; also the following elected for one year: Bros. L. Silverman, Montreal, Que.; John Richards, Fredericton, N. B.; B. Bremner, Charlottetown, P.E. I.; and J. D. Conklin, Winnipeg. Man.

Your Directors having resolved to dispense with the services of a general agent, from the feeling expressed at last Annual Meeting, and otherwise, desire to place on record their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Bro. E. G. Chant, our late general agent. As the increase of the membership of the Association is now solely in the hands of our local agents, it must rely on their energy and enthusiasm to maintain a steady increase in the membership. The Board desires to express its satisfaction at the number of applications received during the present year.

The benefits paid during the year in Class A. amount to \$13,000, \$4,000 of which were for claims accruing last year; there is one delayed claim uncompleted in this class. The number of deaths was 10, the number of assessments, 5.

The benefits paid in Class B. amount to \$2,000. Two claims were paid in this year, issued before the close of last year, and there is one death claim delayed uncompleted. The number of deaths in this class was 3, number of assessments, 2.

A change will be observed in the mode of presenting the financial statement, by which the actual running expenses of the Association can be seen at a glance, while the amounts received for assessment are shown by deducting the commission paid agents from the gross amount received, and the admission fees on application are treated in the same manner.

Your Directors recommend that steps be taken to build up a small reserve fund, and would propose that the sum of \$2,000 be now added to that fund; and that in future the amount received for annual call and net admissions—less amount of annual expenses—be regularly added to that fund.

The annual expenses per member will be seen to decrease as the members increase.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

KINGSTON, 26th January, 1887.

To the President, Directors and Members of the Oddfellows' Relief Association of Canada:

Brethren,—We hereby certify that we have completed the audit of the books and vouchers of your Association for the year ending 31st December, 1886, and find them correct and satisfactory in every respect.

The accompanying statements of Classes A and B, respectively, have been carefully examined and are certified as correct.

The scrutineers appointed asked to be instructed as to a number of proxies that had been forwarded to Bro. King (Secretary), and in his name, this not being in accordance with the By-laws.

It was unanimously resolved that, as these proxies had been sent in good faith and in ignorance of the By-law, they be counted in reference to the proposed amendments in accordance with the desire expressed upon them individually.

The meeting then proceeded to the election of Directors to fill the places of those whose term had expired.

Bro. John Ormiston nominated Bro. W. H. Henderson, Bro. W. Dunn nominated Bro. W. J. Livingston, Bro. A. Macalister nominated Bro. W. H. Godwin. There being no other nomination the President declared Bros. Henderson, Livingston and Godwin elected Resident Directors for three years. Bro.

Simon Oberndorffer nominated Bro. L. Ferguson, of St. Thomas, for re-election. There being no other nomination Bro. Ferguson was declared elected for three years' term.

The following were re-elected Non-resident Directors for one year: L. Silverman, Montreal; John Richards, Fredericton, N.B.; Benj. Bremner, Charlottetown,

P.E.I.; J. D. Conklin, Winnipeg, Man.

Bro. John Ormiston, of Gananoque, moved, seconded by Bro. Geo. Toner, of Gananoque, That Article IV. of the By-laws be amended and restored as it stood previous to amendment made at last annual meeting, and to read as follows:

ARTICLE IV.

CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1.—To continue membership in this Association a member must retain membership in good standing in his Lodge. *Provided*, however, that a member of this Association suspended from his Lodge, who keeps his dues paid during such suspension, and otherwise continues a member, except as hereinafter prescribed, his membership in this Association shall not be affected by such suspension.

Section 2.—Should a member be expelled from his Lodge, his membership immediately ceases in this Association.

Section 3.—Should a member withdraw from his Lodge by withdrawal card or certificate and remove from the Dominion, his membership in this Association is not affected thereby. *Provided* he deposits his card within twelve months, and furnishes a certificate from the Lodge of which he has become a member, within ten days thereafter, certifying he is in good

standing in said Lodge. All members of this Association, whose Lodge becomes extinct, and who apply for and receive a card from the Grand Officers, shall, upon complying with the requirements of the preceding paragraph of this section, be entitled to all the privileges set forth in said paragraph.

Section 4.—Proof of death shall be a certificate setting forth the fact, signed by the officers of the Lodge to which the member belonged, with seal attached, or such other evidence as will be satisfactory to the officers of the Association. Any expenses attending the proof of death must be defrayed by the beneficiary.

Bro. Ormiston discussed his motion fully, and was ably seconded by Bro. Dr. Atkinson, of Gananoque; Donnelly and Robinson, of Kingston; Robson, of Whitby, and others. The action taken at last meeting was defended by Bros. Dunn and Macalister, Kingston; Dr. Parker, Stirling; Lawton, Brockville; McCammon, Gananoque; R. W. Errett, Peterborough, and others, and, after a very full and free discussion, the ballot was taken and declared against Bro. Ormiston's amendment, and in favour of allowing Article IV. to stand as amended at last annual meeting—the vote standing 188 yeas, 343 nays.

Bro. John Ormiston then moved, seconded by Bro. E. Flunder, That the By-laws be amended by adding to Section 1, Article IV., the following:—Provided further that any member having attained the age of sixty years, who has been a member of the Association continuously for the period of twenty (20) years, or since the first year of its organization, in the event of

his becoming indigent, shall, upon application, such application being endorsed by the Lodge of which he may be a member, be relieved from the payment of the assessments or calls made subsequent to such application. Such assessments or calls, however, with interest added thereto, shall form a lien upon and be deducted from the amount of benefit due and payable at the death of such member relieved.

After considerable discussion this amendment was declared rejected, the vote being 205 yeas, 283 nays.

It was then moved by Bro. W. H. Godwin, seconded by Bro. R. W. Errett, That the report of the Directors be adopted. Carried.

Bro. W. McIlroy moved, seconded by Bro. McKellar, That the thanks of the Association be tendered to Cataraqui Lodge, No. 10, I.O.O.F., for the use of room, and that the sum of five dollars be paid said Lodge, and one dollar be paid caretaker for services on this occasion. Carried.

Bros. J. B. McIver and F. Rowlands were re-elected the auditors for the ensuing year.

Three thousand five hundred copies of the Annual Report and Proceedings were ordered to be printed and distributed to members and others.

No other business appearing, the meeting then adjourned.

The Directors met at the office of the Association, and all the officers were re-elected.

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
