LAWS AND REGULATIONS, OF THE NOVA-SCOTIA BIBLE SOCIETY.

I. This Society shall be called The Bible Society of Nova-Scotia and its Dependencies: the object of which shall be the same as that of the British and Foreign Bible Society, viz: To encourage the circulation of the Holy Scriptures, without note or comment, and to furnish copies of the Scriptures gratis to the indigent, and at reduced prices to those requiring them.

II. The business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secre-

tary and Committee.

III. In order to give effect to the design of this Institution, benefactions and subscriptions shall be solicited, and books opened for receiving the names of benefactors and subscribers.

IV. Every person contributing annually One Pound, or at one time a donation of Ten Pounds, shall

be considered a Member of this Society.

V. A general meeting of the Members of this Society shall be held every year, in the first week of March, before which shall be laid the accounts and proceedings of the preceding year.

VI. The whole of the subscriptions and donations after deducting incidental expences, shall be remitted annually, in aid of the funds of the British and Fo-

reign Bible Society.

VII. Every Member of this Society shall be entitled to purchase, under the direction of the Committee, Bibles and Testaments, at the reduced prices of the Society, which are as low as possible.

VIII. The Committee shall be authorised to meet, for the purpose of conducting the business of the So-

ciety, as often as may be necessary.

REPORT.

SINCE the last time that the Committee had the pleasure of addressing the friends and the supporters of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, nothing has occurred materially to affect its interests. Most of its friends have continued to exert themselves in its favour, with unabated zeal; and, notwithstanding the too prevalent distress of the Inhabitants of this Province, their contributions, in aid of the Bible Society, have been to a very respectable amount.

The sums collected, during the last twelve months, including a small balance of last year's Account, amount to 4181. 15s. 9d.; of this sum, 411. 17s. 6d. have been expended for Printing, Stationary, and other incidental charges, leaving 3761. 18s. 3d. to be remitted for the use of the Parent Society, subject, perhaps, to a small deduction for the price of Bills.

The Trustees of the Parent Society, have continued, during the last year, their wonted attention to the wants of this Province, and the same ready compliance as formerly with the wishes of your Committee. There were, on the first of last March, remaining in the hands of the Society's Depositary, 26 Bibles, and 41 New-Testaments. There have since been received from the British and Foreign Bible Society, 396 Bi-

bles, and 350 New-Testaments. Ont of this number there have been furnished to the several Auxiliary Societies throughout the Province, 370 Bibles, and 358 New Testaments, and there now remain in the hands of Mr. Black, the Depositary of this Society, chiefly in the French and German Languages, 52 Bibles, and 33 New Testaments.

It is understood, that the Liverpool Branch Society has opened a direct correspondence with the Parent Institution. To this arrangement the Nova-Scotia Bible Society can have no objection. Their desire is for the diffusion of divine truth, be the agents who they may. They would adopt that maxim of a pious and learned writer, the namesake, perhaps the relative, of our Noble President, the present Governor of this Province, the Chevalier Ramsay, "N'importe par qui le bien se fasse pourvu que le bien soit fait, Provided good be done, it matters not by whom."

The best thanks of the Committee are due to many zealous friends throughout the Province; and although they decline, for the reason stated in their last Report, to name them, there are many, whose exertions in faver of the Society from its commencement, have been so eminent and unwearied, as to call for their most sincere and warmest acknowledgments. Anx liary Societies of Chester, Annapolis and Hants County, have been particularly active and zealous. Of the prosperity of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, the Committee are led to entertain good hopes. To the affairs of the Parent Society, no good man can turn his views without a lively exultation. It appears, by their last report, that their pecuniary concerns are more prosperous than ever. Their labours and researches are indefatigable. Success seems to invigorate their zeal. They are seeking to render the knowledge of the word of truth coextensive with human habitation. Their pious exertion nation ed.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE CHESTER BRANCH SOCIETY, AT THEIR GENERAL ANNUAL MEETING, HELD ON MONDAY, OCT. 6TH, 1817.

1. Substance of the President's Speech. GENTLEMEN,

I CONGRATULATE you on the return of this Anniversary. The peace which now generally prevails, and the growing prosperity of Bible Societies throughout a large portion of the world, fill the mind with noble ideas, and cherish the hope, that the time is fast approaching when the knowledge of the Lord shall cover the earth as the waters do the great deep.

The liberal support which you have hitherto given to the Bible cause, ferbids a doubt of the continuance of your aid : though the pressure of the times, through the failure of the crops of some former years, and the scarcity of circulating medium, may, in the mean time, cramp your exertions, and considerably lessen, for the present year, the number of subscribers. The deficiency of our contributions does not, I am persuaded, arise from any indifference to the cause in which we are engaged. Why should we be indifferent in a cause Every shilling cast into our funds helps so glorious? to swell the streams of that fountain, which is sending forth into exery land the waters of life and salvation. How much should this consideration animate us to be stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in this work of the Lord !

I cannot conclude without congratulating you, that

among other pleasing traits in the character and administration of the Right Hon. the Earl of DALHOUSIE, he has accepted the Presidency of The Nova-Scotia Bible Society, of which we are a Branch. We hope that so illustrious a leader, in so glorious a cause, will animate many to do worthily. You will unite with me in saying, in the language of an ancient mother in Israel, "My heart is toward the Governors that offered themselves willingly among the people. Bless ye the Lord."

Report of the Committee.

Your Committee are once more called upon to report to you their proceedings during the past year. The sum collected is very small if compared with that of last year; and it is still smaller if compared with There has been a great failure of yearly our wishes. subscribers, which with the want of the liberal donations of the preceding year, makes the disparity very great. We hope that more favourable times will remedy the present deficiency.

The Bibles and Testaments which we had received prior to our last yearly Meeting, are all that we have yet received, although we are in daily expectation of another supply. * We have been liberally provided with copies of the Reports of The Nova Scotia Bible Society, and of the Parent Institution. We have conscientiously endeavoured to bestow gratis on those who seemed fit objects of the Society's compassion, and to sell to those who were able to buy; and we hope that our endeavours have not been in vain.

Some who have kept house, with smaller or larger families, for five, ten, or more than twenty years, have not been able till now, to obtain a Bible. One of the latter class, a female, surrounded by a numerous off-spring, says, that skee never had such sweet company before as the Bible which your Committee has put into her hands. In every instance the Scriptures seem to have been thankfully received. That the Lord may grant to this Society many seals of their labours of love, is the prayer of your Committee.
