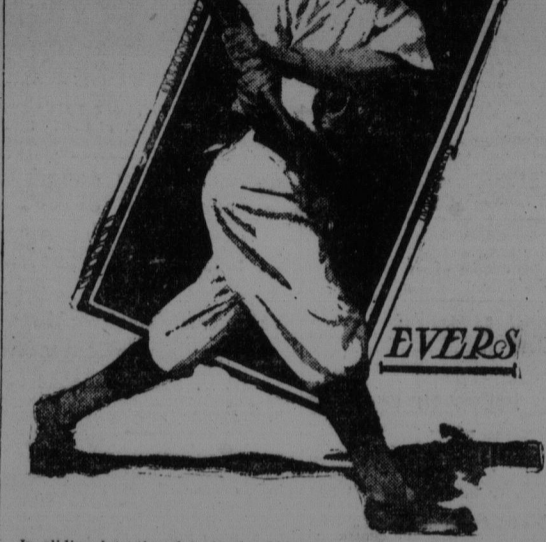
weight of his great shoulders into a short, snappy swing, and as the pitcher can testify, the ball jumps from the bat like a flash of light, and is on its way.

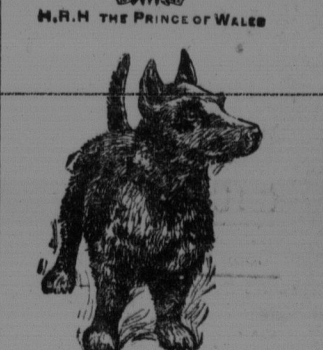
